And, so long as their own forests produce Timber sufficient to enable them to lay down Ashes at New York at \$6 @ \$7 per 100 lbs, there is little chance for Canada. The day will come (but it is far distant) when the Americans will not have sufficient for export to the Continent and for domestic purposes; then, and not till then, they will look to Canada to make up the deficiency; and should Annexation not ere then have taken place ? they will probably reduce the duty to 121, or perhaps 74 per cent.!
