HARRISON'S LAST MESSAGE

The message just transmitted to Congress by President Harrison, is in many respects an extraordinary document.

On the canal question, he delivers himself as follows: "It is not for me to discuss the merits of the proposed canal, but I believe it is a project of great importance."
