Since the outbreak of the present great ar, this Colony, in con with all othe parts of the British Empire, has sent forth slorious traditions of our Flog and Empire glorious th Amongst the fighting Forces of Great Britain and her splendid Allies the men of the Newfoundland Regiment have established a name and record for themselves and their beloved Country, that will live for the lasting glory and honour of this most ancient and loyal Colony
Up to a few months age a steady number of recruits were available to fill up the gaps, in the zanks, that were continuatly
occurring, owing to our Reginent being called upon to participate in all, or most, of the inportant battles in France and Flanders, as well as the earlier days in Gallipoli. But, unfortunately, for the past few months there has not been sufficient men offering to replace those who are no longer able to hold their places in the fighting line, who have to retire through wounds or sickness - in addition to those whe have laid down their lives in the rightequs cause for which
we are fighting. Are we the kinsmen, at
home of these glorious soldiers of Newhelp that they a deak ear to the call for help that they are continually sending
forth? Are we to let go for naught the great and valiant deeds that they have accomplished, by holding back and failing to keep the gaps filled up?
In as much as the lads who have fought and suffered and died so heroically and nobly for us,-our Country and our homes, in the past,-are those who are left behind content to allow their deeds and sacrifices to go for naught, and have the world re alize that the young men of Newfoundland who still remain at home, are not made of the same good stock as those who won distinctions an the British line No. I feel that there are hundreds of young men who only want to be awakened to a realization. of their responsibilities, when they will come forward and take the places of those who are gone, or incapacitated, and relieve for a time at least, those brave boys. (espehave borne the heat and turmoil of the Bat tle, should be given an opportunity to rete, shomd be given an opportunity to re-
turn to their homes for that well earned rest which they naturally desire and long

We are about to start on an active re cruiting campaign, and recruiting parties will be sent to all parts of the Island, so that man who is eligible for service will be given an opportunity to enlist. Every pro-
vision will be made for the comfort and care of those dependents whom they leave be bind. In the ease of married men and others leaving dependents, separation allowances are provided under Regulations just published.
Pensions will be provided for those who are incapacitated through wounds or sickness, as well as the dependents of those who
make the supreme sacrifice. Therefore, I make the supreme sacrifice. Therefore, I Country, who are of Mifitary men of the themselves as recruits for a Rege, to offer every man be he Newfoundlander ar other wise, might well feel proud of Do vorduty now; play the man's part ind ne let it be throwa in your faces or the faces of your children that you failed in your duty to your Country in her hour of greatest trial. Fappeal to the mothers, to the fathers, and to the sisters, to help the boys to realize their duty, and spur them on, to quit themselves like men, so that they giay par-
ticipate in the great wictory that is surely coming, and which cannot be delayed much longer.

If this appeal, and our present recruiting efforts are not fruitful of the necessary number of recruits before the end of the year, we will then have reached the parting of the ways; we must then take one of two courses-either withdraw our Regiment as a separate unit, which would be a most un fortunate and deplorable occurrence, or the Government of the Colony will be reluct antly compelled to consider other means of acquiring men to keep our fighting Forces up to the required strength. Prove, there fore, men of Newfoundland, that this an cient and loyal Colony is able, and is prepared, to keep at least one Battalion in the fighting line, composed entirely of volunteers, to maintain the magnificent mecord of hostilities. (
