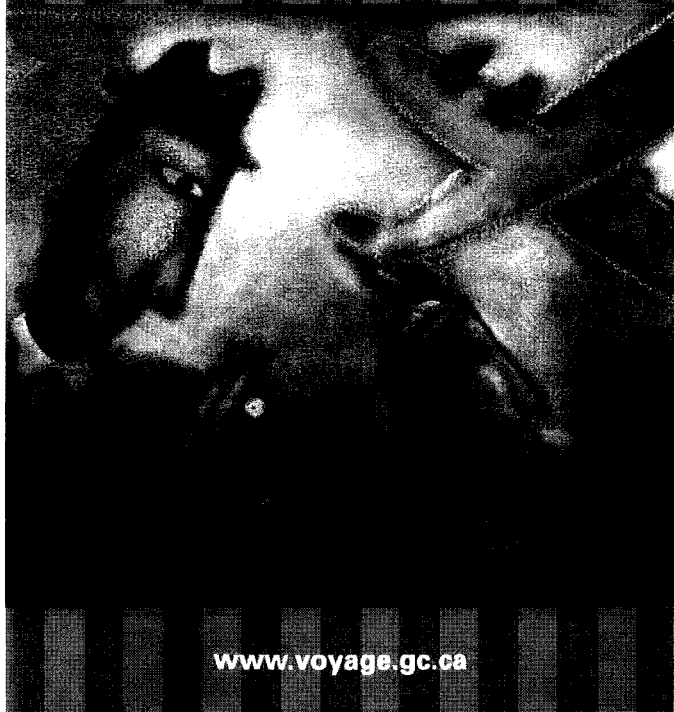

Introduction

Canadians love to travel. Each year we make about 100 million trips abroad for both business and pleasure. The vast majority of these excursions go off without a hitch.

But unfortunately all trips do not come with a hassle-free guarantee. Accidents, illnesses, legal problems and linguistic and cultural difficulties do occur. Most problems are minor and you can usually solve them yourself. But if you run into more serious obstacles, our offices abroad are there to assist you.

Bon Voyage, But... will help you plan ahead. Read it before you book your next trip. And pack it in your luggage – it's a handy reference book of travel advice, important telephone numbers and addresses

of Canadian government offices around the world.

Our mission is to ensure that you have the information you need to bring home a safe and successful trip. We provide proactive and efficient services throughout the world to all Canadians. Our pledge is to provide service characterized by sensitivity, empathy, courtesy, speed, accuracy and fairness.

Our services are available through our headquarters in Ottawa and through our network of offices in other countries. Emergency services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Before You Go...

Preparation is the key to a successful trip. By doing your homework before you leave, you minimize the chances of something going wrong.

Get Informed

Before you board that airplane or train, take time to learn about the political, cultural and economic environment of your destination.

Learn at least a few key phrases in the country's language. Even a modest command of the local language will go a long way.

When you are travelling, the laws of the country you are visiting apply to you too. Never assume that because you are a Canadian citizen you are immune to foreign laws.

Don't forget to pack this booklet. It could help you more than you can imagine.

Some countries experience ongoing wars, insurgencies or sporadic unrest. Find out if your destination is known to be dangerous. Consult the Country Travel Reports, the weekly Travel Bulletin and the Current Issues section on our Web site for up-to-date information on safety and security conditions, health issues, and entry and visa requirements for 225 travel destinations. This information is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

To be prepared in case you get in trouble abroad, find out before you go where the nearest Canadian government office is located. Addresses and telephone numbers are listed at the end of this booklet. The on-line version of this booklet also contains e-mail and Web addresses.

When travelling abroad, you may wish to use *Canada Direct*, an automated long-distance access service that allows you to call home to Canada or to other countries using the Canadian telecommunications network. For *Canada Direct* access numbers, see the list at the end of this booklet.

While you are abroad, tune in to Radio Canada International (RCI) or consult the RCI Web site for the latest news. RCI also broadcasts messages from the Canadian government during emergency situations. Check with RCI to obtain a schedule of the times and frequency of broadcasts to different parts of the world.

Your Passport

Your passport is the best proof of your Canadian citizenship. You and all family members should have a valid passport if you plan to travel outside Canada. Passport applications are available on-line and at passport offices, post office outlets and Canadian government offices abroad.

Important Changes

Following the September 11 terrorist attacks in the United States, enhanced security measures were instituted for passport application and renewal procedures. Here are a few important changes:

April 2002: A new passport document for higher security

Using the latest digital imaging and security tools available, the new Canadian passport will continue to be among the most secure, advanced passport documents in the world. Previously issued passports will remain valid until their expiry date. (Check with the Passport Office Web site for more information.)

A passport for everyone

Effective December 11, 2001, Canadian children must have their own passport. The practice of adding a child's name to a parent's passport is no longer permitted. This new security measure is also intended to help protect children

and combat child slavery and prostitution. (More information on children's issues is available in the Publications section of our Web site.) However, if you hold a valid Canadian passport issued before December 11, 2001, that bears the name of your child, the passport will remain valid for both you and your child until it expires. Before any travel by a child, contact the embassy or consulate of the countries the child will be visiting to inquire about entry requirements.

Extended processing time

Due to thorough screening procedures, the processing period for passport applicants in Canada has been extended to 10 days for in-person applications. The processing period for mail-in applications has been extended to a minimum of 20 days. So plan to apply well before your departure.

Quebec birth certificates

Since November 26, 2001, birth certificates issued on or after January 1, 1994, by Le Directeur de l'état civil of Quebec, or a Canadian citizenship certificate, are the only acceptable identity documents as proof of Canadian citizenship for passport issuance for people born in Quebec. Baptismal certificates and municipal or civil documents are no longer acceptable.

Keep It Safe!

A Canadian passport remains at all times the property of the Government of Canada and may be used only by the person to whom it has been issued. Selling a passport or permitting any other individual or agency to use the passport may lead to criminal prosecution and is cause for revocation of the passport and refusal of future passport services.

If your passport is due to expire within six months of your arrival in another country, check with that country's embassy or consulate in Canada for its rules and restrictions regarding passport validity and expiration. Some countries will not let you enter if your passport is due to expire within six months of entry.

Before you leave on your trip, be sure to complete the "In case of accident or death notify" section in your passport. This will help us quickly notify your family or friends if an emergency arises.

Make a photocopy of your passport's identification page and keep it separate from the original when you travel. For added security, leave a photocopy with a friend or relative at home. These simple steps may speed the replacement process if you lose your passport.

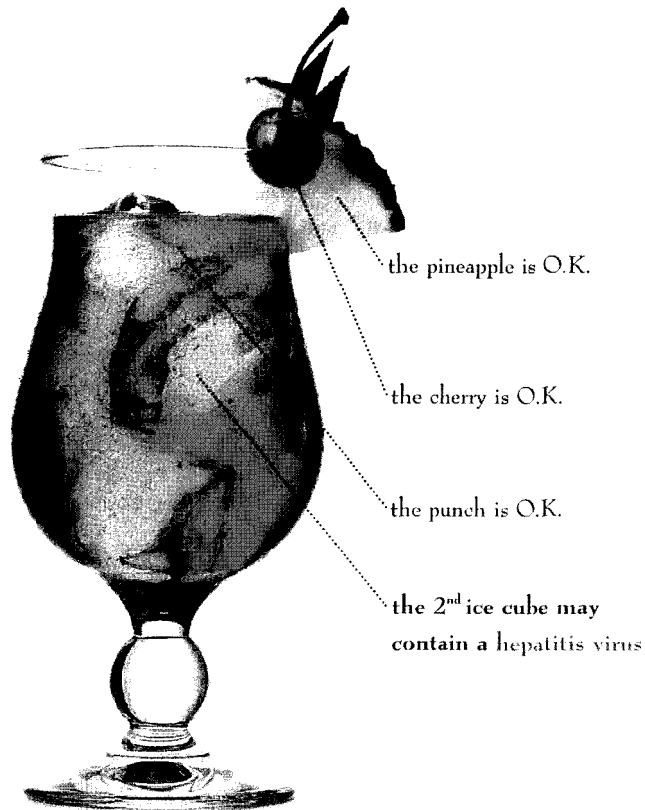
If your passport is lost or stolen while you are travelling, contact the nearest Canadian office immediately for a replacement *after* reporting the loss or theft to the local police. Make sure you get a copy of the police report or the report number. Before a new passport can be issued, you must complete an application form, produce documentary evidence of your Canadian citizenship (e.g., a birth or citizenship certificate), provide a copy of the police report or report number, present new photographs and pay the required fee.

We recommend that you carry a birth or citizenship certificate (see above) confirming your identity in addition to your Canadian passport.

Travel in the United States and Mexico: Always carry your valid Canadian passport, or carry a valid identification card that includes a photo, plus proof of citizenship (your birth certificate or your citizenship certificate if you weren't born in Canada).

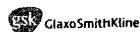

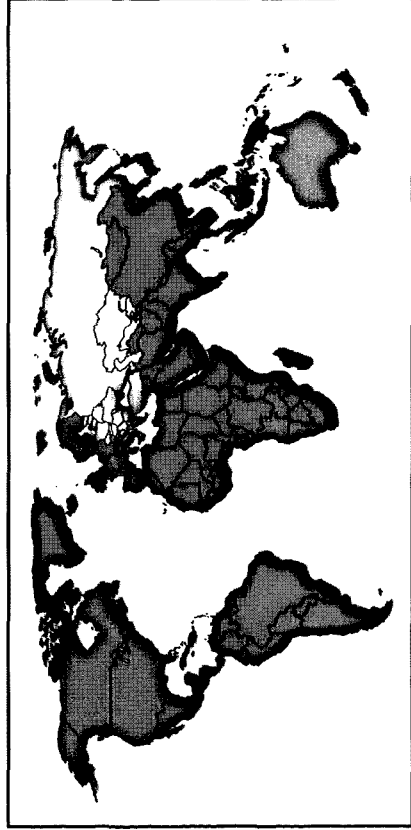

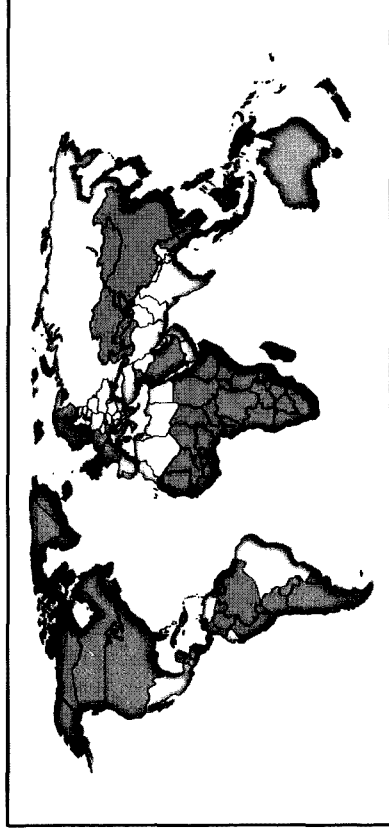
HEPATITIS A RISK

Do You Need a Visa?

You need a visa to travel to certain countries. Your travel agent or the country's embassy or consulate in Canada can advise you of the requirements. You can also check our Travel Reports for the countries you intend to visit. **Apply for visas well in advance of your trip.**

When you arrive at your destination, be prepared to prove that you have enough money to support yourself during your stay.

Be aware of the rules and restrictions governing visas and your length of stay. This knowledge can save you both time and money.

Some countries will allow you to enter only if you can prove you will be leaving. Be prepared to show

Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain and Sweden participate in the Schengen Convention, which has abolished internal border controls between these countries (except in special cases). However, customs and immigration controls remain in force when you are travelling to one of the above countries from Canada or any other country that does not participate in the Schengen Convention.

near other countries in every country visited when travelling from one Schengen country to another, always carry your passport with you. When travelling within a Schengen country, always carry a photocopy of your passport with you. Visitors should also make sure they do not extend their stay beyond the period of time allowed by each country.

You should ensure that authorities stamp your passport when you enter the Schengen area and that you fulfil all

If you have questions about your status or if you would like information about the entry and registration requirements of Schengen countries, contact their embassies or consulates in Canada before your departure.

your return or onward ticket or any visas that demonstrate that you plan to visit another country.

Charter Flights

Before you book a charter flight, check the credentials of both the travel agency and the charter company with either the Better Business Bureau or a local consumer advisory organization.

Dual Citizenship

To avoid unpleasant surprises, find out whether you, your spouse or any other family member is a citizen of another country. If you have a second citizenship, you should always travel using your Canadian passport and always present yourself as a Canadian citizen to local authorities.

If you are considered a national of another country, you may be compelled to do military service or pay special taxes.

If you do run into problems because of your dual citizenship, contact the nearest Canadian government office immediately. For detailed information on this subject, refer to our booklet *Dual Citizenship*.

People with Special Needs

Many countries do not provide access for people in wheelchairs

or make allowances for those with special hearing, sight or other physical requirements. Contact an accessibility organization or talk to others who have travelled to your destination in the past. There are also several guides published about international travel for people with special needs. Check your local library, bookstore or the Canadian Transportation Agency Web site.

Canadians with disabilities who hold a valid parking permit in Canada may take their permit with them for use in any of the 40 member countries of the European Council of Ministers of Transport (ECMT). Be sure to check with local authorities there to determine entitlement. For more information, consult the Transport Canada Web site.

Getting Medical Advice

Your risk of acquiring a disease while travelling depends on several factors. These include your age and gender, your current state of health and immunization status, your itinerary, the duration and style of your trip, and anticipated activities (including contact with animals, exposure to fresh water, sexual contact), as well as the local disease situation.

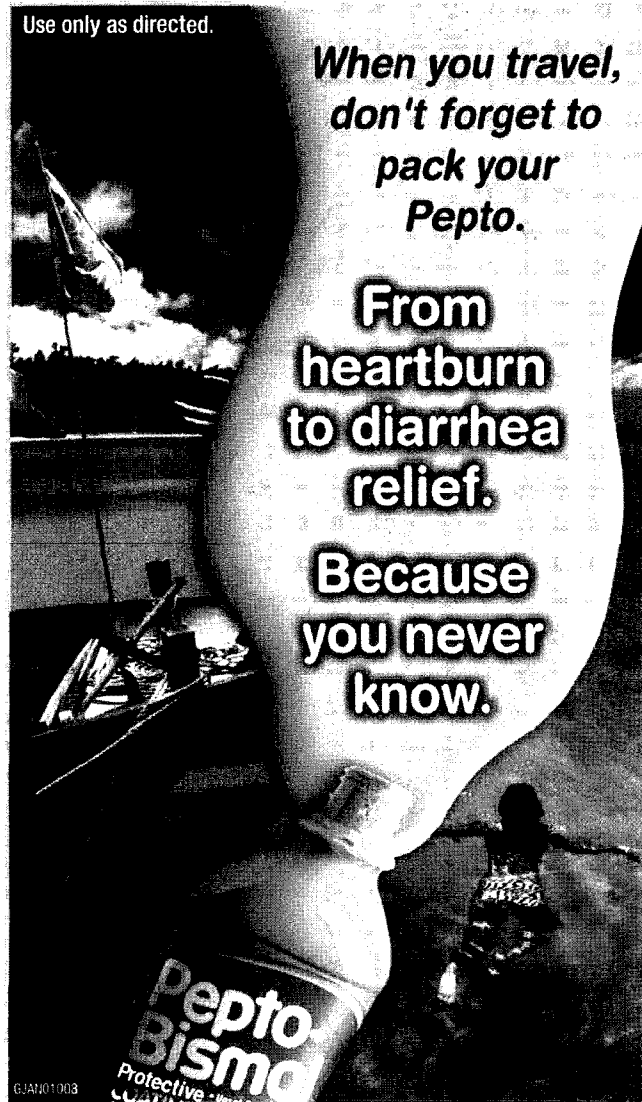

recommends that your travel plans include contacting a travel medicine clinic or your physician six to eight weeks before departure. Based on an **individual risk assessment**, a health care professional can determine your need for immunizations and preventive medication and can advise you on what precautions to take to avoid disease while travelling. Consult the Travel Medicine Program Web site to find a travel medicine clinic close to your home.

Vaccinations

Based on your current health status, immunization history and anticipated itinerary, a health care provider can assess your vaccination requirements for illnesses such as yellow fever, typhoid, meningitis, Japanese encephalitis, hepatitis and malaria. Seek a risk assessment **well in advance** of your departure, as you may need to start receiving shots or taking preventive medication a month or two beforehand. For instance, a meningococcal vaccination is required for pilgrims travelling to Mecca, Saudi Arabia, for the annual hajj; and an International Certificate of Vaccination for yellow fever is a legal requirement to enter certain countries.

International travel can expose you to infectious diseases, such as polio, that aren't frequently seen in Canada.

Our high standards of sanitation and childhood immunization programs may have made you complacent about these diseases. Ensure that your routine immunizations – diphtheria, whooping cough (pertussis), tetanus, polio, measles, mumps and rubella – are up-to-date.

If you are travelling with infants or small children, you may need to arrange an alternative or accelerated childhood immunization schedule for them. Talk to your pediatrician, family doctor or travel medicine clinic.

AIDS

AIDS/HIV is a global disease. Some countries require proof of AIDS testing. Have the test conducted and obtain the results **before** your trip. When travelling, take the same precautions you do at home. Do not assume that condoms will be readily available everywhere. Even if you can find them, they may not meet the safety standards set by the World Health Organization.

Remember: Using intravenous drugs is not only illegal but also extremely risky – especially if you share needles.

Medication

If you take medication, be sure to pack an extra supply in case you are away for longer than expected.

Carrying a duplicate of your original prescription is recommended, especially when travelling to a country that is particularly sensitive about drugs. Carry an extra prescription that lists both the generic and trade names of the drug, in case your medication is lost or stolen. This is also a good idea if you wear glasses or contact lenses; having the prescription makes it easier to replace them.

Do not try to save luggage space by combining medications into a single container. Keep all medications in the original, labelled container to avoid customs problems.

Some medications that are sold over the counter in Canada are illegal or require a prescription in other countries. Find out whether your medication is legally available in the country you plan to visit. For travel to some countries, obtaining a note from your doctor that states the medical reasons for your prescription and the recommended dosage is also encouraged. Note that doctors recommend carrying an effective antidiarrheal agent (such as Imodium[®]) because such treatments may not be available at your destination.

If you need syringes for a medical condition such as diabetes, it is

very important that you take along an appropriate supply. As well, you should carry a medical certificate that shows they are for medical use.

If you have a pre-existing medical condition that could present a problem while you are travelling, it is wise to wear a MedicAlert[®] bracelet. Through the MedicAlert[®] Foundation, your vital medical facts are stored in a database that can be accessed 24 hours a day from anywhere in the world.

Pregnancy

If you are pregnant and plan to travel abroad, talk to your doctor. Some vaccinations may not be recommended. Also, check your travel and health insurance plans carefully to ensure they cover health complications arising from pregnancy.

On Your Return

If you become sick or feel unwell when you return to Canada, see your doctor. Inform the doctor, without being asked, that you have been travelling or living outside Canada, and where you have been. If you were ill while travelling, see your doctor on your return and explain your travel history and any treatment you received.

Malaria

If you have been in an area where malaria occurs and you develop a fever during the first year after your return (especially in the first three months), seek medical attention immediately. Inform the doctor about your travel history and remind him or her that antimalarial pills do not guarantee protection against malaria. To rule out malaria, a blood test must be performed.

Supplemental Health Insurance

Do not rely on your provincial health plan to cover costs if you get sick or are injured while you are abroad. At best, your health plan will cover only a portion of the bill. It is your responsibility to obtain and understand the terms of your supplementary insurance policies. Some credit cards offer their holders health and travel insurance. Do not assume the card alone provides adequate coverage.

Be sure to ask whether your policy:

- Has an in-house worldwide emergency hotline you can call if you are in trouble. Find out whether it is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week; whether the operators are multilingual; and whether nurses or physicians are on staff.

- Pays foreign hospital and related medical costs and, if so, whether it pays up front or expects you to pay and be reimbursed later.
- Provides for your medical evacuation to the nearest place with proper medical care or to Canada.
- Pays for any required medical escort (doctor/nurse) to accompany you during evacuation.
- Excludes pre-existing medical conditions. If such conditions exist, notify your insurance company and get an agreement in writing that you are covered for these conditions. Otherwise, you could find your claim "null and void" under a pre-existing condition clause.
- Covers premature births and related neonatal care.
- Allows for cash advances if a hospital accepts only such payment.
- Pays for the preparation and return to Canada of your remains should you die while travelling.

Carry details of your insurance with you. Also tell your travel agent, a friend or a relative at home, and your travelling companion how to contact your insurer.

Get a detailed invoice from the doctor or hospital before you leave the country. There is nothing more

frustrating than trying to get the proper paperwork from thousands of kilometres away. Remember always to **submit original receipts** for any medical services or prescriptions you received while travelling abroad. Most insurance companies will not accept copies or faxes.

Other Insurance

Your provincial government health insurance plan cannot be maintained after you have lived outside the province for a period of time. This period varies depending on your province of residence. Individual personal medical insurance for those working outside Canada, with both occupational and non-occupational coverage, is available. These plans consist of full accident and sickness coverage, including emergency medical evacuation and war risk. Coverage is available for both the contracted person and dependants (you may wish to see the Telfer International ad for more information).

Lost luggage, theft of your purse or wallet, or flight cancellations can happen to you. These annoyances may cause major disruptions when they take place in a foreign country. Consider purchasing a travel insurance package that will compensate you for such inconveniences.

Travelling by Car?

Keep in mind that each country has its own driving regulations. You may be required to obtain an international driver's licence or additional insurance. Be sure to learn the local rules of the road before you get behind the wheel. In some countries, the driver may be detained and questioned by police even though only a minor accident has occurred.


Country-specific insurance must be purchased for travel by car to Mexico and Central America. This is usually available at border crossings. For specific information on driving in the United States and Mexico, consult our booklets *Crossing the 49th* and *México: ¿Qué pasa?*

Money Matters

Canadian currency and traveller's cheques in Canadian dollars are not always accepted. Before you leave Canada, consult a bank or foreign currency agent to find out the most appropriate currency to carry. It's always a good idea to have a small amount of the local currency on hand when you first arrive, unless the importation of local currency is a crime. Check with the foreign embassy or consulate in Canada or with your travel agent about currency regulations in the country you plan to visit. Traveller's cheques,

such as those issued by American Express, in the appropriate currency or in U.S. dollars are often the safest and most convenient option. To ensure that traveller's cheques are accepted in the country you plan to visit, call American Express at 1-800-221-7282.

Do not rely exclusively on bank machine cards or credit cards. They are not necessarily honoured internationally.

Canadian Taxation Status

If you are living or travelling abroad but maintain residential ties in Canada, you are usually considered a factual resident of Canada for

taxation purposes. However, there may be other factors involved, so review your situation with the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency before you leave in order to avoid surprises. The CCRA publication *Canadian Residents Abroad* provides excellent information.

The CCRA's International Tax Services Office processes income tax returns for factual residents, non-residents and deemed residents of Canada, including Canadians posted overseas. It also provides general assistance by telephone, correspondence and counter service, and looks after all non-resident tax withholding accounts.

Bon Voyage, But ..**Avoiding Customs Difficulties**

Before travelling abroad with valuable items, you can take advantage of a free identification procedure at any Canadian Customs office. This service is available for items that have serial numbers or other unique markings. Alternatively, if you request it, Customs can apply a sticker to any item to give it a serial number.

Jewellery often has significant value and can be difficult to identify. To make it easier to re-enter the country with jewellery, contact your nearest Customs office to find out the steps to take before your departure.

Transport of Dangerous Goods

Passengers are not permitted to transport dangerous goods on board an aircraft in carry-on or checked baggage or on their person. Dangerous goods are articles or substances that are capable of posing a risk to health, life, property or the environment when transported. Before travelling to any destination, consult the airline or Transport Canada's Web site to find out what you can and cannot transport.

Travel with or by Children

Remember that since December 11, 2001, Canadian children need their own passport (see "Important Changes" above). However, if you hold a valid Canadian passport issued before December 11, 2001, that bears the name of your child, the passport will remain valid for both you and your child until it expires. Before any travel by a child, contact the embassy or consulate of the countries the child will be visiting to inquire about entry requirements.

If you or your partner are travelling to another country with your child and there is a possibility that a custody dispute might develop, you should talk to a lawyer before the child leaves home. Our special publication, *International Child Abductions: A Manual for Parents*, contains further information.

Your child custody arrangements in Canada may not be recognized in another country. In extreme cases, you or your child may not be allowed to leave that country. Check your status with the country's embassy or consulate in Canada before you travel. If you have custody questions, contact the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade's Consular Case Management division at 1-800-387-3124 (in Canada) or (613) 943-1055.

If a person younger than 18 is travelling alone or with only one parent or another adult, certified documentation proving that the trip is permitted by both parents should be carried. For an example of a certified consent letter, visit the Frequently Asked Questions section of our Web site.

Remember that customs officials are looking for missing children and may ask questions about the children travelling with you. Make sure you carry the proper identification for yourself and any children travelling with you, including any documents required by the country you intend to visit. Proper identification includes birth certificates, baptismal certificates, passports, citizenship cards, records of landing and certificates of Indian status. These will help prove your citizenship and residency when you return to Canada.

Seeking Assistance**Registering at a Canadian Government Office Abroad**

It is recommended that you register at the nearest Canadian government office abroad. This will help us contact you in case of an emergency. Registration is voluntary, and the information you provide is protected and used in accordance with the

International Adoptions

Provincial and territorial authorities in Canada are responsible for authorizing international adoptions. If you are thinking of adopting a child from another country, you must first obtain information about the adoption regulations of the province or territory in which the child will reside. While adoption is a provincial/territorial responsibility, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) is responsible for allowing an adopted child entry into Canada. Entry can be refused if the child does not hold the appropriate immigrant visa. A visa may be denied even if the adoption has already been completed.

provisions of the Privacy Act. Canadians can also register on-line at our Web site (www.voyage.gc.ca/Consular-e/SOS/roccpage-e.htm).

In countries where Canada has no direct representation, there may be arrangements in place for you to register with another country's embassy or consulate.

For example, Canada has such an arrangement with Australia. Consult the Country Travel Reports on our Web site for country-specific information.

Consular Assistance

Canada has over 270 "points of service" worldwide where consular officials are ready to help you if needed. In some instances, there may be a fee for services.

What we can do for you:

- We can contact, at your request, your relatives or friends and ask them to send you emergency funds.
- We can help you during emergencies such as natural disasters or civil and military uprisings.
- We can direct you to sources of information about local laws, regulations, cultural customs, and visas.
- We can assist with medical emergencies.
- We can replace passports (fees apply).
- If you are arrested, we can try to ensure equitable treatment under local laws. At your request, we can inform relatives and friends about your arrest and try to ensure that legal rights and processes are extended to you consistent with the standards of the host country.

- If you wish, we can notify your next of kin regarding an accident or death and let them know whether, and how, they can help.

Although Canadian offices provide a wide variety of services to travelling Canadians, demand is such that we restrict some services, especially those for which there are adequate alternatives available locally. Such services include making travel arrangements, transferring funds or paying local bills, storing or safekeeping personal effects or searching for lost items, doing translations, assisting with job hunts, obtaining visas for other countries and acquiring local permits or licences.

Check the "Canadian Government Offices Abroad" section for information on how to contact the Canadian office(s) in the country you plan to visit.

Emergency Consular Services

Canadian government offices abroad offer 24-hour assistance. Outside of office hours, your telephone call will automatically be transferred to a consular officer in Ottawa or you will be asked to leave a message for a return call. In either case, there will be a prompt response. If you leave

a recorded message, make sure that it is clear and that you leave a complete telephone number or contact address.

From some countries, you can use a toll-free number to speak to a consular officer in Ottawa. See page 69 for the number to call. In addition, you can make a collect call to the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade

On the Road

Foreign Laws and Customs

When you are travelling in a foreign country, familiarize yourself with the way of life there. Respect that country's laws, religions, culture, class structure and economic conditions. Although you may not agree with some of the country's beliefs, remember that you are a visitor.

In many countries, appropriate attire for both sexes is very important. In some countries, laws govern what men and women can and cannot wear in public. Penalties for disobeying local laws can be quite severe.

Be especially respectful of temples, mosques, churches, synagogues and other religious sites. Many

of these areas are off limits to foreigners or people who are not members of that faith. Ask permission before taking photographs of religious artifacts or buildings.

Not everyone likes to have their picture taken. Local people may resent you for taking their photograph, or they may demand money for the picture after it has been taken. Always ask first.

Never take photographs of military facilities, a harbour where naval vessels are docked or industrial installations such as oil refineries. You may lose your film and your camera, and you could even come under suspicion of espionage.

Prescription drugs and even some over-the-counter medications can be closely scrutinized by customs officials.

When travelling outside Canada, take along a copy of your prescription and ensure you carry all medicines in their original containers. If you use syringes, bring along a doctor's certificate proving they're for medical use.

Taking Precautions

The same rules apply abroad as at home, only more so. Foreigners are usually at greater risk than locals. In many countries, foreigners are specifically targeted. Don't wander into unknown areas — find out how safe they are first. Don't pick up hitchhikers or cross borders with people you have just met. Watch your luggage and make sure it's locked. **Never take anything, even an envelope, across a border for someone else.**

Don't display large amounts of money or expensive jewellery in public. Use a money belt or a case with concealed sections for valuables. Dress appropriately.

Leave a copy of your itinerary with someone at home so they can contact you in case of an emergency. Don't forget to telephone home, particularly if you have promised family members or friends that you would do so. We receive thousands of calls every year from worried family members or friends who have not received a promised call.

Keep a separate record of your traveller's cheques and credit cards. **Never carry your passport, travel tickets, identification documents, cash, credit cards**

and insurance papers together. If you do so, you risk being left with no identification or funds.

Use the safety deposit box at your hotel. Never leave valuables in your room.

Illegal Drugs

Drug use and trafficking are prohibited in all countries, even though drugs are readily available and openly used in some places. Most countries impose heavy fines and long prison sentences for possession and trafficking. For details, check the Drugs and Travel section of our Web site.

In some countries, possession of even small amounts of drugs carries the death penalty.

Never take any parcel that is not yours across a border.

Choose your travelling companions wisely. Never cross a border with a hitchhiker or as a hitchhiker. Although you may not be carrying anything illegal, your companions may be.

Crime and Punishment

More than 2,000 Canadians are currently imprisoned outside Canada for various offences.

The laws and customs of countries around the world can be very different from those in Canada. Ignorance of those laws is no defence.

While in a foreign country, you are subject to its laws and regulations. Your Canadian citizenship offers no immunity.

Canadian consular staff abroad must also follow the rules of the host country. If you do find yourself in trouble, they can help you locate

Sexual Exploitation of Children

The Government of Canada has enacted legislation that permits the arrest and prosecution of Canadians in Canada for the sexual exploitation of children in other countries. Most countries are now enacting legislation, or more vigorously enforcing existing laws, concerning the sexual exploitation of children. Those convicted face a penalty of up to 14 years' imprisonment. For more information, see the Publications section of our Web site.

a lawyer, contact your family and friends, and ensure that you receive fair treatment **according to the standards of that country**. However, they cannot wield any influence to reduce your sentence or fine.

Judicial Process

Never assume that the legal system of the country you are visiting is the same as at home. "Innocent until proven guilty" is not a universally recognized concept. In some countries, you may not even have the right to legal representation or a trial in your own language.

Some countries do not recognize or respect religious freedom; freedom of association, speech or the press; or equality of the sexes. For instance, guilt by association is presumed in some countries. This means that you may be charged simply for being in the company of a person suspected or found guilty of a crime.

Even if you are an innocent bystander at a demonstration or riot, you may be considered a participant and be rounded up with those involved. Your Canadian citizenship does not grant you immunity.

If you do find yourself in legal trouble, contact the nearest Canadian government office immediately.

If you cannot do so yourself, have someone else do it for you.

If you are travelling for an extended period of time, you can arrange to have your mail sent to a post office

When You Return

Departure Tax

Some countries impose a departure tax or service fee at the airport or point of departure. Before leaving, make sure you set aside enough money, in local funds, to pay this tax.

Canadian Food Inspection Agency: Be Aware and Declare

Every year, thousands of travellers fail to declare things like meat, cheese, animal hides, live birds, plants, fruits and their products. These items may carry pests or diseases that pose a risk to human, plant or animal health. Foreign pests or diseases could destroy Canada's crops and forests and endanger our livestock, threatening our ability to produce safe food.

Canadian law says you must declare all the plants and animals you bring back, as well as their products. It restricts and prohibits the entry of products that could harm Canada's agriculture and

box or, where possible, to the nearest Canadian government office. In the latter case, the office will hold on to letter-size mail (not parcels) for you to pick up in person. This mail cannot be forwarded to another address.

forestry or that pose a danger to human health and safety.

Before you leave Canada, contact the Canadian Food Inspection Agency or visit their Web site.

Pet Imports

Before bringing a live animal back to Canada, check the import requirements with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency. For more information, consult the "Pet Imports" chapter under "Travellers" in the Consumer Centre section of the Agency's Web site or call one of their Import Service Centres.

Canadian Customs and Import Controls

You must declare everything you have purchased and acquired abroad, whether the items are for yourself or intended as gifts, as well as goods bought at a Canadian or foreign duty-free store. Keep your original receipts for possible inspection.

If you have been away from Canada for 24 hours or more, you may bring back goods worth up to C\$50 without paying duties or taxes. This does not include alcohol and tobacco.

If you have been away from Canada for 48 hours or more, you may bring back goods worth up to C\$200 without paying duties or taxes. These goods can include alcoholic beverages and tobacco products, as follows: up to 1.14 litres of liquor or 1.5 litres of wine, or a case of 24 bottles or cans of beer or ale, each containing 355 ml. As for tobacco, you may bring back up to 200 cigarettes, 50 cigars or cigarillos, 200 tobacco sticks and 200 grams of manufactured tobacco. Provincial age restrictions apply to liquor and tobacco products.

If you have been away from Canada for seven days or more, you may bring back goods worth up to C\$750 without paying duties or taxes. These goods can include tobacco products and alcoholic beverages as described above. When calculating the number of days you are absent, do not include the date you leave Canada, but do include the date you return.

Note: As of October 1, 2001, if you include cigarettes, tobacco sticks or loose tobacco in your personal

exemption allowance, only a partial exemption will apply. You will have to pay a minimum duty on these products unless they are marked "Canada - Duty Paid." Canadian-made products sold at a duty-free shop will be marked in this way. You can speed up your clearance by having your tobacco products available for inspection when you arrive.

Certain goods are restricted from entering Canada. If you are considering importing meat or dairy products, plants, weapons, vehicles, exotic animals or products made from their skins or feathers, contact the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency or the Canadian Firearms Centre beforehand for guidance.

Obscene materials, hate propaganda, most weapons, and goods harmful to the environment are prohibited from entering Canada.

If you have any questions about what you can bring home, contact the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency or call your local Customs Border Services office. The CCRA booklet *Declare* describes what you can and cannot bring back to Canada if you have been away for less than a year.

Importation of Firearms
Specific regulations and procedures apply to the importation of firearms. For more information, contact the Canadian Firearms Centre.

Illegal Souvenirs
Before you purchase an animal or plant, or a product made from animals or plants, be sure you know what rules and regulations apply. Many attractive items sold in foreign countries are made from endangered plants or animals. Live cactus and orchid plants, ivory bracelets and carvings, marine turtle shells and turtle-shell products, whalebone carvings, and cat skins, teeth and claws are some of the more common items illegally brought back to Canada. These items are included in the more than 30,000 species of wild animals and plants regulated under

the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES). A violation of CITES could lead to seizure of your purchase, as well as a fine and/or prison term. Contact Environment Canada for details.

Since many other countries also have strict laws protecting wildlife, it is often wise to leave any items you already own at home.

When in doubt, don't buy it!

After Residing Abroad
After a stay abroad of more than a year, there are special import provisions for household items and personal belongings when you move back to Canada. Information is contained in the brochure *Moving Back to Canada*, published by the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency.

Canadian Government Offices Abroad

The following list identifies where to seek consular assistance in each country. Hours and days of operation of Canadian government offices abroad vary from country to country. Call the office concerned to check its hours. If you are overseas and unable to contact a Canadian office in an emergency, make a collect call to the Department's Consular Affairs Bureau at (613) 996-8885 (via *Canada Direct* where possible). From some countries, you can also use a toll-free number to speak to a consular officer in Ottawa (see the table on page 69).

The telephone and fax numbers in the following list include country and city/area codes. **The city/area codes provided (in parentheses) are those you use when calling from within the country where the office is located.** If you are calling from another country, you may have to use a different city/area code.

Also, when calling from one country to another, you must use the local code for international calls before the country and city/area codes of the number you wish to reach. For example, if you are calling overseas

from Canada, you must press 011 before the country code. (Calls to Bermuda, the Caribbean and the United States do not require a country code, but you must press 1 before the area code.) If you are unable to contact an office overseas, please verify the codes with your telephone operator.

Canada Direct service is offered by Canada's major telecommunications companies in association with Teleglobe Inc. On its international network, Teleglobe carries calls from more than 130 countries where *Canada Direct* service is available. In addition, you may use the *Canada Direct* country-to-country calling feature if it is available in the country you are calling from. The ☉ symbol indicates that *Canada Direct* service is available from that country.

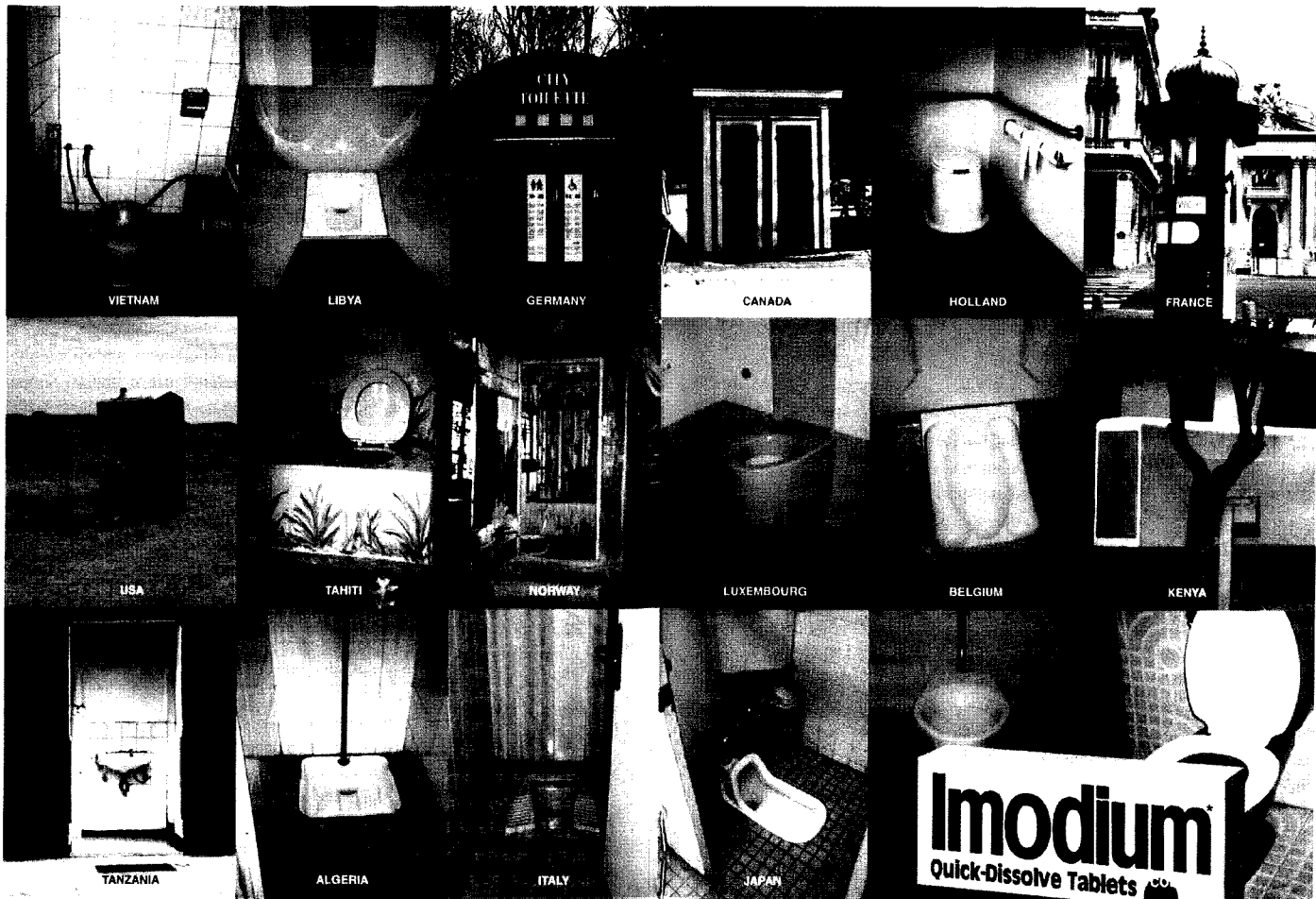

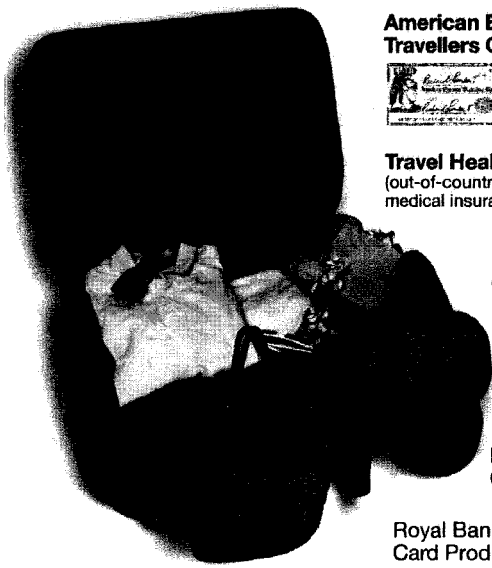
