FRIDAY MORNING RUMORS REYKING'S HEALTH

Insurance Companies Have Trebled Premiums on King Edward's Life.

CORONATION MAY BE POSTPONED Surgeon of Royal Household Has Been Sent to Berlin to Consult With Late Emperor's Physician.

Philadelphia, Oct. 17.—The London correspondent of The North American says: The insurance companies on King Edward's life have been trebled, and the anxiety of the people with regard to the sovereign's health is greatly intensified.

Another incident that confirms the belief that the coronation ceremonies are to be postponed is the fact that the Lord Mayor's inauguration on Nov. 9, this day, was also the anniversary of the King's birth, and the citizens planned a sort of double celebration.

The action of the insurance companies is the strongest proof yet given that the King is really in a most dangerous condition. It is a strong indication that the coronation is a favorite form of business protection among Englishmen.

It is reported that the King's health is feared. Numerous policies on the King's life are held by his creditors.

In addition to this, it is reported that a surgeon of the royal household has been despatched to Berlin for the purpose of attending to the Emperor Frederick during his illness.

SHOULD BE RELEASED FIRST. If Hanson in Paid Miss Stone's Lips May Be Sealed.

New York, Oct. 17.—Rev. R. Wardlaw Thompson, director of the Collegiate and Theological Institute at Sofia, cables the following from Samorov, Bulgaria, to The Journal and Advertiser concerning Miss Stone, the kidnapping missionary:

"The headquarters of Miss Stone's captors is a thickly wooded mountain top near the boundary line of Turkey and Bulgaria. Miss Stone has only light summer clothes and a cotton dress. The brigand chief allows her to keep her Bible, but she is forbidden to read it.
