BIBLE CHRISTIAN MISSIONARY SOCIETY.

The Sermons in connection with the Eighteenth Anniversary were preached on Sunday, June 8th, 1873, in the Bible Christian Church, Lindsay, by the Brethren J. J. Rice, J. Kenner and G. Webber.

The Annual Meeting was held on the Monday following, presided over by S. C. Wood, Esq, M. P. P., and the Report presented by the Secretary.

Moved by Bro. A. Clarke, and seconded by Bro. G. Webber:

That the Report, extracts from which have been read, be adopted, printed and circulated, under the direction of the Missionary Committee, and that the cordial thanks of this Meeting be tendered to those friends whose liberality has placed the receipts in advance of any previous year, and to the Collectors, for their valuable service so freely rendered.

Moved by Bro. P. Robins, and seconded by Bro. C. Barker:

That we unite to thank Almighty God for the material and spiritual prosperity vouchsafed to us generally, during the past year; and especially for the encouragement afforded us in prosecuting our work in connection with the recently opened Lindsay, Belleville, St. Thomas, and City Missions; and feeling no less, our dependence on Him for success in the future than in the past, we covenant to pray that both the ministers and members of our Church may be favored with a rich baptism of the Holy Spirit, that by inflamed zeal, sanctified intelligence, Christ-like benevolence, felt personal responsibility, reigning sympathy with God, and united and prayerful effort, we may enter the doors of usefulness opening before us, and perform the great work which the Master hath assigned to us to do.

REPORT.

Lord Shaftesbury, the Infidel, is reported to have said, "The Missionary enterprise is an heroic passion for saving souls, and when the passion shall die away, then Missionary effort will cease." We thank his Lordship for this admirable definition of the enterprise, and think it worthy of holier lips. No doubt he thought the passion would soon subside, and consequently the effort of which it was the origin and support, would soon terminate; but while his Lordship has passed away, the passion for saving souls is as active and ardent as ever.

When man had destroyed himself by transgression, and was fast rushing upon his ruin, Christ, moved with bowels of infinite compassion, cried from celestial heights, "Deliver him from going down to the pit, I have found out a ransom: Lo I come, behold in the volume of the book it is written of me, I delight to do thy will O my God;" and when "the fullness of time was come," he, robed in human flesh, appeared among men; was despised, rejected, scorned, scourged and crucified; he submitted meekly to a life of suffering and a death of agony for the Redemption of the race. What was it sustained him but an "heroic passion for saving souls?" His language was "The zeal of thy house hath eaten me up." He selected a few men from a remote corner of Judea, and filling them with His own Spirit, delegated them to the important mission of subjugating the world to the empire of truth. Without worldly wealth or influence, or aim or eloquence, or patrons or learning, they went forth. They were despised and persecuted, assaulted and abused, afflicted and oppressed, imprisoned and beaten; but they were joyful amid difficulties, fearless amid danger, patient in endurance, meek amid malice, confident amid opposition, and triumphant in death. What was it sustained them in all this? "It was an heroic passion for saving souls."

Drs. Judson, Cary and Buchanan, Martyn, Williams, and Moffatt, and a host besides, of whom they are representatives, left their homes, their country and their friends, and with their lives in their hands, braved the storms of ocean and the dangers of inhospitable climes, that they might make known the unsearchable riches of Christ; and they all were sustained in their self-abnegation by an "heroic passion to save souls." a sinner from the error of his way, shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins." If men were laboring to clothe the body, feed the physical frame, or save it from a fiery baptism or a watery grave, theirs would then be a noble enterprise; but what is that work when compared with the work of saving souls?

"Knowest thou the importance of a soul immortal?
Behold this midnight glory—worlds on worlds!
Amazing pomp! redouble this amaze;
Ten thousand add, and twice ten thousand more,
Then weigh the whole—*ONE Soul* outweighs them all,
And calls the astonishing magnificence
Of *unintelligent* creation poor."

The philosophy of Hume, the craftiness of Gibbon, the wit of Bolingbroke, the learning of Volney, the eloquence of Voltaire, the rhetorical thunder of Mirabeau, and the vulgarities of Tom Payne, have all been employed to quench this heroic passion and thwart this beneficent design. The fire, the dungeon, the knife, the altar, and the rack, the leagued powers of empires, and the combined malice of earth and hell, have confederated to stop them in their course and crush them in their efforts. But sustained by this heroic passion, they have marched forward, taking joyfully the spoiling of their goods, making prisons ring with their songs of praise, and counting not their lives dear unto them. They have defended the right, fought battles, won victories, conquered devils, removed darkness, opposed moral corruption, raised the down-trodden, made the miserable happy, and elevated and dignified not a few. As the results of their labors, statesmen have become more just, merchants more honest, masters more humane, servants more faithful, husbands more affectionate, wives more tender and chaste, and children more filial; the libertine has become pure; the drunkard, sober; the close-fisted, liberal; the suspicious, confiding; the stoical, social; the sad, joyous; the desponding, hopeful; the haughty, humble; the passionate, patient; the knave, honest; the agitated, tranquil; and the wretched, happy. Families have been blessed where prayer was never offered, praise was never sung, peace found no home, love was a stranger, and God was forgotten; now prayer is offered, praise is sung, peace is enthroned on the domestic hearth, love cements the different members of the family circle together, a type of Heaven is established, and the once cursed dwelling place is irradiated with God's favor and filled with God's presence. Nations have felt the

power, barbarism hath given place to civilization, anarchy to peaceful order, despotism to freedom, slavery to liberty, mistaken legislation to constitutionalism, selfishness to benevolence, recklessness and pauperism, to prudence and plenty, cruelty to humanity, ignorance to education, and the prince of darkness and his legion of imps, to the reign of Christ and his grand escort.

Through the agency of men in whose bosom heaves and swells and glows this "heroic passion," God designs to evangelize the world. In the days of his flesh, Christ was ever wont to associate others with him in his works of mercy. Peter shall lend his boat and put out a little from the shore, that Christ in it may break the bread of life to thousands. The disciples shall receive from his hands the bread that bears evidence of miraculous power, that they may break and distribute it to the people. When he stood at the grave of Lazarus, a look, a word, a nod would have been equal to flinging back the stone at the mouth of the sepulchre, and rending the grave clothes in which Lazarus was bound, but being desirous to give to by-standers an opportunity of aiding him in his deed of love, he said first, "Take ye away the stone," and secondly, "Loose him and let him go."

In the resurrection from the grave of spiritual death, Christ appeals to all to work for him. Over the grave of man their lie the stones of ignorance and prejudice, &c. He hath put into the hands of his church the lever that can lift the mighty incubus that rests upon the souls of men, and let into the darkened sepulchre the light of heaven, and that lever is "the glorious gospel of the blessed God." Hence to us, Christ renews the command, "Take ye away the stone."

The divine Father, yearning with bowels of infinite compassion for his afflicted family, commands, "Take ye away the stone." The Incarnate God, with nail pierced hands, still red with the blood of his passion, points and cries, "Take ye away the stone." The Holy Ghost, speaking to the conscience in repeated strivings and strong convictions, urges, "Take ye away the stone." The church of the first-born that dwells amid the encircling glory of Jehovah's throne, big with the memory of a like imprisonment and deliverance, repeats, "Take ye away the stone." The awakened church on earth, impelled with a sense of tremendous responsibility, and with the love of Christ constraining her, re-echoes, "Take ye away the stone." And so from the grave itself, there comes

up the sepulchral groan, wrung from the million hearts, oppressed with a sense of a thousand wrongs, and struggling to be free, and that groan translated into speech cries, "Take ye away the stone."

It is not in splendid edifices, enchanting music, so called talented ministers, wealthy membership, crowded audiences, that the power lies to evangelise, convert, and roll away the stone; we might as well think of averting the steam engine with a feather, blowing up the rocks of Gibraltar with squibs, or binding a careering lion with a texture of gossip. We may have Ciceros in the pulpit and on the platform, Rothschild's and Peabody's in the pews, Jenny Lind's in the choir, and yet be powerless to meet the wants of the world. But in the gospel—the gospel that caused the learning of Athens, the pride of Rome, and the wealth of Corinth, to bow before it—preached by men who are inflamed and swayed by "an heroic passion for saving souls," you have a power, the progress of which no climate can arrest, and no form of society exclude,—a power that shall dethrone error from the judgment, guilt from the conscience, and the love of sin from the heart,—a power that shall under the cross everywhere triumph, the name of Jesus everywhere adored, and make truth, freedom, and love, to spread their genial reign over all nations, and smile with united beams throughout one cloudless day of universal blessing.

How far the agents of this Society have combined this heroic passion with the preaching of a pure gospel, the following extracts and figures are designed in some measure to indicate.

ASHBURNHAM—The report says: "Many of our members give evidence of their discipleship, adorning the doctrines which they profess by consistency in life, and increasing in the graces of the new birth. Our Class Meetings are generally well attended, and prove seasons rich in divine blessings. The Prayer Meetings are well attended by persons from the church and the world. Congregations steadily increasing; many deeply affected by the truth, but halt between two opinions. The church, which, when the last report was written was in course of erection, has since been opened under very favorable circumstances. A Sabbath School has been started with six teachers and fifty scholars, and something over \$50 subscribed to the Mission Fund. "With care and attention, ho'y living and christian effort," the Missionary expects it to "become a fruitful field."

BELLEVILLE—This station was only taken up last Conference, when Bro. A. Gordon was appointed to open it. The wisdom of taking up the station and appointing the present pastor are strikingly manifest in the results realized. For some time considerable inconvenience was felt for the want of a suitable place in which to worship. But nothing daunted, the indefatigable missionary visited from house to house, held cottage prayer meetings, and set his heart on getting a Sanctuary in which to worship God. The Lord has blessed the undertaking, friends have been raised up, a spirit of liberality has prevailed. Thirty-one persons have been gathered into church fellowship, and on the 9th of March, the neat brick structure, (the foundation stone of which had been laid on 31st of October previous) was dedicated to the service of prayer and praise. The missionary is encouraged by the success of the past to hope much for the future.

CAMPBELLFORD has been blessed with a gracious revival, the congregations are said to be good. A noble effort has been made during the year to sweep off the debt on Campbellford church. To extend the Mission, an evening appointment has been taken up in an important village. Two members have died in full triumph of faith and hope of a joyful resurrection, their loss, together with 14 removals, has been considerably felt by the Mission. The sanguine hopes expressed in last year's report of declaring their independence this year, have not been realized; in earnest purpose, faithful service, uniform attendance on the means of grace, and liberality in supporting the Redeemer's cause, there is room for some of the members still to improve.

CLINTON—Our societies are living in peace, and our prospect in view of a second preacher are encouraging. We return more approved members than last year, the total is somewhat less, but this is owing principally to removals. Our purpose by Divine assistance is, to do what we can to promote God's glory, both in the world, and in our midst.

COLCHESTER—In reviewing the labors of the past year, we have reason to record with gratitude, the loving kindness of the Lord who hath crowned our lives with tender mercies. It is no other than might be reasonably expected, that our faith, hope, love and obedience, should answer to the obligations under which those favors have placed us; but in this respect we doubt not there is much room for im-

provement, both as it respects individual Christian experience and general religious interest. The ministerial labor expended on this mission during the year, has been somewhat broken by a disastrous fire which consumed the Missionary's residence, and then by the change which was consequent thereon. These changes have a tendency to keep the public mind unsettled, and measurably to check consolidation and extension. We are not without some evidence of progress: a Church has been raised and dedicated, the membership increased, the Sabbath School is growing in interest, and considering the means of our friends, considerable liberality evinced.

COLBORNE.—It is with mingled feelings, that we review the past year: sorrow and deep humiliation before God, that we have not realized greater outpourings of the Holy Spirit, and that throughout the Station there is not a deeper-toned piety and entire devotedness to God; joy and thankfulness to God that many seasons of quickening influences have been realized amongst us. The Class Meeting has been held regularly at each of our appointments; a good degree of harmony and brotherly love exists among us, and a strong denominational attachment; and our hearts have been cheered as we have witnessed sinners coming to Christ. Our net increase of membership has been sadly affected by deaths, removals, and the unfaithfulness of many who once professed attachment towards our Zion. Painful as this reflection is to us, we are pleased to notice that while some old friends have removed from us, they have gone to another of our fields of labor; and our sincere prayer is that they may be as useful there as they have been with us for so many years past. Both of those departed to the world of Spirits were cut off in the midst of their days. One a valuable assistant in the Sabbath School, who for many years, adorned his christian profession; the other a loved classmate, wife and mother, but each left a bright testimony behind that for them the valley of death was illumined with rays of Divine Glory. For them to live was Christ, and to die was gain. Our Sabbath Schools are prosperous, and financially, we are in reality self-sustaining, and hope by the blessing of God to remain so. "Let thy work appear unto thy servants, and thy glory unto their children, and establish thou the work of our hands upon us, yea, the work of our hands, establish thou it."

FENELON.—In reviewing the past year we feel that we have reason to be very thankful to our Heavenly Father for the many mercies that have been in our lot; with an exception or two, peace and unity have prevailed among us, and in all our business meetings no discordant note has been uttered. A year ago we had but one Sabbath School, now we have three. The one at the Falls, organized last July, has succeeded far beyond our most sanguine expectations; the Ebenezer School, commenced last May, and closed during the winter, has just been resuscitated with very cheering prospects, while the old one, at Zion, has, we understand, somewhat improved during the year. Our congregations at the Falls, and one or two other places, have upon the whole, greatly improved, and, generally speaking, the very best attention has been paid to the word spoken, and the respect shown the servant, has been far greater than could have been reasonably expected. Would God that they paid the same respect to the Master. The great work of the year, causing us many an anxious thought, has been the building of the new mission house, which is now nearly completed. It is, if not the most splendid, one of the most comfortable parsonages owned by the denomination; and thanks to the liberality of a few of our friends and the lumber merchants, the debt remaining on it is comparatively small. Meantime there has been a decided improvement in the regular finances of the mission. This has been very apparent in at least three places; and the whole machinery of the mission may be reported as in good working order, never better. With all our material prosperity, very few have been brought to a saving knowledge of the truth, and in summing up we find a small decrease in our numbers (7); this may be accounted for partly from removals, the exercise of discipline, and the want of regular pastoral visitation, (occasioned by long and very severe family affliction), and from the pastor's being compelled to take altogether too active a part in the secularity of the church.

GREY has been favored with tokens of Divine approval, an increase of members and of money; still it deploras defects. Purposes amendment, and hopes for better things to come.

HUNTINGDON—Several souls have professed the possession of conscious salvation, and with one exception the societies are living in peace. Considerable success has been won in efforts to promote Temperance. Death has made his call

and removed Mrs. A. Harvey and Mrs. C. Martyn to their rest in heaven. The Sabbath School department is well conducted and correspondingly prosperous. The liberality of the friends has produced a surplus at the Quarter Board,—reduced the liabilities on the parsonage, placed a favorable amount in the hands of the Treasurer, towards the erection of a new church at Ebenezer; paid \$240, the cost of rebuilding Bethel Church, and encouraged the building of a frame church at Calvert's.

HUNGERFORD—We desire to express our gratitude to Almighty God for His goodness to us during another year. In reviewing the past year, we are deeply humbled in not seeing more visible good accomplished. During the winter we held special meetings in various places of the Mission. At first our hopes were bright; but for the want of greater interest among some of our friends, and the inclemency of the winter, our efforts somewhat failed, yet we hope good has been done. We have to mourn over some who professed religion last year, having turned aside from the paths of holiness; notwithstanding, our congregations have been good, and the public and private means of grace have been seasons of refreshing coming from the Lord. Three of our members have died, to be, we doubt not, forever with the Lord. After allowing for deaths, removals, and unfaithfulness, we number, with those on trial, just the same as last year. We need, more than anything else, a rich baptism from Heaven, that we may have much peace and joy in our own souls, and be made a greater blessing to others. The friends at Zion have raised \$54, which has paid off the debt on their church, during the year. The Trustees and friends have greatly lessened the debt on Tweed Church, and it is now in somewhat easy circumstances. The financial prospects of the Mission are somewhat encouraging; our Missionary receipts exceed those of last year, and we trust the time will soon come when we shall not require to draw so heavily from the Missionary Society; but unless some of our friends feel to give more liberally towards the support of the ministry among us, as some have removed, and others are expecting to leave, we are not in a position to support two ministers without a grant from the Conference; yet our prayer is that we may

“To His glory live, and in His cause expire.”

HAMILTON—The condition of our Mission will not warrant our giving, by any means, a glowing Report. We com-

menced the year under circumstances of discouragement: Out of a membership of 22, two left for the States, three resigned through unpleasantness in the Church, and a retarding of future progress is threatened by a lack of unanimity. Added to this, the Pastor, through affliction, for months was laid aside, either wholly or partially, from ministerial and pastoral duty. We feel our need of a deeper piety, that as the lights of the world, we may shine with greater lustre, and as the salt of the earth, exert a mightier influence in saving humanity from moral putrefaction. Our congregation is steadily increasing, and our Sabbath School has more than doubled its Scholars. Financially, under the circumstances, our friends have done well—We have paid \$47.35 of the debt on the Parsonage, and have \$32.65 towards the interest of borrowed money; \$85.00 have been raised towards the purchase of an Organ; \$20.00 for School books, while the Church receipts are so far in advance of disbursements, as to enable the Trustees, after voting \$25.00 to Quarter Board, to pay off \$50.00 of the debt. What we want to make the Church more fruitful, is, every good work and a richer baptism from above. May it speedily come down. Amen.

INGERSOLL has not much to report of a cheering character. Deaths, removals, unfaithfulness, and the enforcement of discipline, has so weeded the Society as to leave it over 20 less than last year. Though numerically less, yet it is thought it is by no means diminished in moral power, since those removed by discipline, were rather a source of weakness and annoyance, than of strength and help.

LAMBETH AND ST. THOMAS—In the beginning of the year the mission was in an unsettled state, and numerous difficulties stood in the way of progress; but the Lord has favored us and given us greater success than we anticipated. The finances show improvement; some conversions have been realised, the Church has been better established, and the pulpit testifies "That the blood of Jesus Christ cleanseth from all sin." The Society at Lambeth is gradually increasing in numbers and influence; and the result of a year's labor at St. Thomas, has fully justified the steps taken in opening a Mission in that centre of population. Land has been purchased, and a Church erected at a cost of \$2,880.00, about one half of which has been raised; a Society of 29 persons has been gathered, and a School organised of about

70 Scholars. It is our settled conviction that Lambeth and St. Thomas cannot be worked satisfactorily together.

LITTLE PRAIRIE suffers considerably from lack of Church accommodation. It has some things over which to mourn, and others of which to rejoice. The year has been a chapter with which the readers of the Missionary Reports have become familiar; but after supplying deficiencies occasioned by deaths, removals, etc, it has a small numerical increase.

LINDSAY—In presenting our Report for the past year, we would not fail first to record our grateful acknowledgement to our Heavenly Father for the health, peace and prosperity which we have enjoyed as a Mission. We cannot express what our hearts feel, when we look at the work which the Lord has wrought among us. Three years ago we had neither Members, Churches, nor Sunday Schools, but God, by the instrumentality employed, has raised up a people to himself, and kindled up a flame of love that will burn to his honor when time shall be no more. We report now two Churches, one other place, two Sabbath Schools, and a good prospect for a third at Cambray, with about 120 families who attend our places of worship, the membership is about the same as last year. The congregation has greatly increased in Lindsay, since the dedication of our new Church. The congregations are excellent at Cambray and Bryson's. Bro. Collins held two series of protracted meetings with but little apparent success; he has labored hard and faithfully, and is greatly beloved by the friends. The past year has been one of hard toil and anxiety of mind. A church is greatly needed at Bryson's, and must be built if we intend to establish the cause there. Financially, the people have done nobly, when they have paid their subscriptions. We are deeply sorry however, that we cannot report greater spiritual progress; the members as a whole, do not attend to the private means of grace as we could desire. What we want is more of the presence of the Holy Ghost, and greater personal agency in the service of the Lord Jesus Christ; coldness of service and deadening unbelief, alas, is too prevalent among us.

OSHAWA—During the year the entire debt on the Church has been paid off, and between \$1300 and \$1400 raised by subscription and otherwise, towards enlargement. After allowing for one fifth of the society's removing, the membership has increased about 25 per cent, and their liberality evinced by raising about \$18.50 per member, on the average,

for religious purposes. Our Sabbath School is in a prosperous condition, the Scholars being in excess of last year, and several of them have professed conversion during the year.

PERRYTOWN—The past year, has been an harmonious one. Our congregations have been good, and our meetings, seasons of refreshing. Several souls have been converted during the year; but owing to a large number of removals, we have to report a decrease in membership. Our finances are in a healthy state. The Chapel department is improving: Eden Church has been opened, and its entire cost provided for; and part of the materials are already on the ground for the erection of an elegant Brick Church at Perrytown. Our three Sabbath Schools are doing a good work among the young. Our motto is "Onward."

PORT HOPE—With a degree of pleasure we review the labors of the past year, and gratefully acknowledge that "Hitherto the Lord hath helped us." Only one of our number has been called away, during the past year, and for her we sorrow not as those without hope. The enlargement and general improvement of the Church, at a cost of about \$1200, has added much to the interest of our cause. The greater part of the above mentioned cost has been met, and we hope the remainder will soon be forthcoming, and the now commodious sanctuary be free from all incumbrances. Some have been gathered in from the world, so that after allowing for a number of removals, we have still a small increase in membership. The social means of grace have been generally well attended, and have proved to be refreshing seasons. Of Missionary and Quarterly receipts we cannot complain, when we remember the outlay in Church improvement, still we hope and pray for greater prosperity.

PICKERING—We rejoice in God that we have spent a year in harmony and peace, laboring together for God, and can say God is with us. We found on our list 97 members. During the year we had 20 removals; added to our membership 27, making an increase of 7. We have felt much of God's power in our midst; souls have been converted to God. During the year an acre of land has been purchased at Duffins Creek, of which the deed is in our possession; the church and shed former'y standing on the ground, not our own, have been moved; and a new church is in contemplation to be built this summer. The friends think of converting the church in which we worship now, into a parsonage, much

needed on this Mission. They are also contemplating of moving the Providence church to the village of Brougham. A shed has been erected at Ebenezer. We need a united effort, a spirit of perseverance, faith in God, every brother and sister to do their duty, and we shall prosper.

PRINCE ALBERT—We regret to report that the work of God on this Mission is not very progressive. There is a decrease in the membership when compared with the report of last year. There has been some removals during the year. Instead of finding 135, we could report on the first quarter only 116, and now 109. We cannot say that spirituality in the membership is very high, and yet perhaps, not any lower than on other Missions and Circuits. We think that Prince Albert and Salem congregations should unite and build a church at Port Perry: this seems to us essentially necessary to the success and future management of this Mission. With proper care and wise management our cause may live and prosper; and the power to kill or make alive, is chiefly in the hands of the officials.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND—Our Mission work in Prince Edward Island is favorably progressing. The West Cape Mission has projected the erection of a good church on the O'Leary Road, at an estimated cost of over \$1,000, which they expect to complete during the summer. Our new mission at Summerside presents a most encouraging appearance. The Missionary property of the value of \$1,100 is wholly paid for, and a new mission house at a cost of near \$12,00, is in course of erection. The receipts are encouraging, the congregation collected fills the Lecture Hall, so that in a short time, a large church will become necessary to accommodate the congregation, and several hopeful conversions have occurred. In another part of this Mission a new place has been opened, and a large congregation collected, and good done. On the whole the success of your missionary in that field has been most gratifying, and we hope in a very few years to see the second town of the Island placed on our list of Circuits.

SUTTON—On the arrival of the missionary on this Station at the last Conference, he found himself without house or home; nor any house could he get for six months, nearer than Manilla, a distance of 23 miles, this made much against the Mission. On the first Sabbath of the present year, a somewhat spacious church was opened in Sutton, costing

about \$1,000, about one-third of which has been raised, and \$75 more promised. The congregation is flourishing, and the membership of the station more than doubled; we have also an increase of 16 Sunday School Teachers and 80 scholars. We have a comfortable parsonage in Sutton. The great want of the Station, and for which we devoutly pray, is a large outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

UXBRIDGE—We are happy to be able to report that the Master has granted us a measure of success. Thirty-seven have been admitted on trial for membership during the year. In Uxbridge we have a Sabbath School numbering over 100 scholars, furnished with a good library, periodicals, and free from debt. The congregations at each place have improved. We are thankful for past success, and praying for more abundant in the future.

TORONTO—Membership advanced from 34 to 48,—notwithstanding 15 removals and several cases of unfaithfulness; 21 admitted during the year—Sunday School scholars from 25 to 155. The West End congregation, good at first, owing to want of attention and other unavoidable drawbacks, went down, and is only now advancing—the congregations at the Tabernacle good, the members regular at the means of grace, and sanguine as to the future. The spacious church in course of erection is already influencing the community in our favor. The finances are satisfactory. Between six and seven hundred dollars having been raised on the Mission during the year—while the first effort in behalf of the Missionary Society resulted in a very generous response, giving us a nett sum of \$224. The return of both preachers is asked for.

WIARTON—The year now drawing to a close with us has not been marked with any extraordinary spiritual movement, either progressive or retrograde, if we are to judge by conversions or backslidings, but if good meetings, powerful convictions, happy feelings and good congregations are evidences of God's presence amongst us, then these evidences we have been favored with. Two small societies have been organized, where we had none a year ago, some of whose members came from other churches, while others have been gathered in from the world. Of our Sabbath Schools we cannot report favorably; several have been tried in the country places (in some instances) several times since the ground was taken up, but have broken down for want of proper officers; many persons who might be useful are

prejudice against denominational, and will work only in Union Schools, which seemed to work best in this mixed community. Wiarton however presents a pleasing exception to the above rule, and succeeds admirably as a B. C. School. The congregation in the village has likewise largely improved of late, and a good spirit of hearing obtains. We suffer much all over the Station for want of Class Leaders and Stewards; there are no Class Meetings but those led by the Missionaries, and when they lead classes they must do it in addition to three preaching services in the day. During the winter the regular services were frequently interrupted by storms and impassable roads, and sometimes when the preachers did struggle through, the people not expecting them, did not come out. Nineteen persons have joined us since last Conference, but by removals and unfaithfulness, vacancies have occurred, which leave us about the same in number as then. The temperance question has not been lost sight of. The Missionary receipts are nearly doubled, but the quarterage shows but little improvement.

The following Statistical Table shows that the Society employs 39 Missionaries, who are assisted by 70 Local Preachers, who preach in 71 Churches, together with 48 other preaching places; that during the year 20 have died, and 207 removed. That there exists at the close of the year, 154 on trial for membership, 1768 approved members, 374 Sabbath School Teachers, and 2693 Scholars. Showing an apparent decrease in some of the returns, but after allowing for Lakefield and London, which last year past from the list of Missions to self-sustaining Circuits, really an increase of 4 Local Preachers, 10 Churches, 34 on trial, 18 approved members 52 Total, with 35 Scholars.

In conclusion, your Committee join to thank God for so many displays of his mercy vouchsafed in the past, and to bespeak the heartfelt sympathy and liberal support, and earnest prayer, of all lovers of Zion, that our future achievements may be more signal, extensive and complete.
