Annual Meeting.

St. Andrew's Hall, Kingston, Jan. 23rd, 1895.

The Annual Meeting of the congregation was held at 8 o'clock, P.M. The Rev. Mr. Mackie was appointed Chairman, and opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. R. R. Creighton was appointed Secretary.

The minutes of the last congregational meeting were read and confirmed.

The following Reports were read :

The Kirk-Session Report, by Rev. Mr. Mackie; the Managers' Report, by Mr. John McIntyre; the Women's Home Association Report, by Miss A. Davidson; the Supplementary Revenue Report, by Mr. John McIntyre; the Sabbath School Secretary's Report, by Mr. John Pollie; the Sabbath School Treasurer's Report, by Mr. W. T. Minnes; the Women's Foreign Mission Report, by Mr. John McIntyre; the Young Women's Guild Report, by Rev. Mr. Mackie; the Juvenile Guild Report, by Rev. Mr. Mackie. All of which were received and adopted.

It was moved by Rev. Principal Grant, seconded by Captain T. Donnelly, and resolved :

That in accepting the resignation of Mr. R. S. Dobbs the congregation would thank him heartily for the labour and diligence which he has given to the Supplementary Fund, and to which its success is due. It was also moved that the ladies associated with him be requested to undertake the work for the current year, with power to add to their number, Miss A. Davidson to act as convenor.

It was moved by Rev. Principal Grant, seconded by Mr. John McIntyre, and resolved :

That in adopting the Report of the Women's Home Association the congregation would place on record its high sense of the services of the ladies who have worked continuously for two years in connection with "The Talent Fund," and have thereby materially lessened the burden of debt on the congregation.

It was resolved :

That the retiring managers, Messrs. James Lesslie, J. W. Clark, John Hazlett and T. Donnelly be re-appointed.

The names of the following gentlemen were added to the Reception Committee, viz. :—Messrs. G. Patterson, J. Fisher, G. Lowe, and J. Mackerras.

On motion of Rev. Principal Grant, seconded by Mr. John McIntyre, it was resolved :

That Messrs. John Kinghorn and W. Gill be appointed Church Auditors for the year.

The Benediction was pronounced by Mr. Mackie, and the meeting closed.

Kirk-Session Report.

The Kirk-Session respectfully report as follows to the congregation :

The Sabbath services have been regularly conducted and well attended during the year.

The Wednesday evening service has also been maintained, and the attendance has been encouraging. The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was celebrated four times during the year.

The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to 18 children, the service in not a few cases being conducted in the afternoon in church.

In the church records 8 marriages have been registered and 10 deaths.

During the year 31 persons have been added to the Communion Roll, 17 on profession of faith, and 14 on presentation of certificate. On the other hand, 4 have been removed by death—Mr. George S. Hobart, Mrs. Mary Craik, Mr. Joseph Fisher, and Mrs. Joseph Milk—and 12 have left the city. The Communion Roll now stands at 479.

The report of the Poor Fund, administered by the Women's Home Association, has been examined, and the session is satisfied that the interests of the poor are well looked after, and the collections wisely and faithfully expended.

During the year a small property has, by will of the late Mrs. Craik, come into the hands of St. Andrew's Church. It is, however, mortgaged to almost its full value (\$500 or thereabout) to the General Hospital.

The session gratefully recognizes the volunteer services of the members of the choir, which have added greatly to the attractions of the worship of the church.

Gratefully recognizing God's goodness and hopefully looking to Him for His blessing on all the labours and offerings of His people for the promotion of His cause both at home and in distant lands, we would do with our might what of His great work has been committed to us.

Report of the Board of Managers

ST. ANDREW'S HALL, JAN. 23rd, 1895.

In meeting the congregation on the recurrence of another annual gathering, the Managers are obliged to note a falling off in some departments of revenue as indicated in the subjoined comparative statement. This may be attributed partially to the prevailing monetary stringency, partially to the gratifying financial results in other departments of church work.

The Managers again record their profound obligations to the women of St. Andrew's Church for their renewed zealous and abundant efforts in again reducing our consolidated debt. The raising of upwards of \$2000 during the past year, points eloquently to the noble work in which our women have been engaged.

The Managers regret that the Treasurer of the Interest Debt Fund, Mr. R. S. Dobbs, has seen fit to send in his resignation. The entire congregation has been deeply indebted to Mr. Dobbs for several years for his energetic and careful supervision of this interesting branch of our finances. It is sincerely to be hoped that Mr. Dobbs may be induced, amidst the cordial gratitude of our people, to continue his praiseworthy labours for another year.

The Managers would again impress on the congregation the importance of having the pew rents paid in advance, so as to avoid the necessary outlay in discounting notes, and also that as large an increase as possible be made in the addition to the Envelope and Plate Collections.

The thanks of our congregation are due to Messrs. J. Gibson, R. Sinclair, J. D. Craig, J. Mackerras, C. Love, W. Gill, J. A. Minnes, C. M. Strange, W. Thompson, J. Cochrane, J. C. Strange, F. Taylor, G. A. Patterson, F. Raney, who have so capably acted as ushers, and in attending on the collections.

The retiring Managers are Messrs. J. W. Clark, Capt. Donnelly, James Lesslie and John Hazlett.

With devout thankfulness to the Giver of all Good, the Managers present their report for the year 1894.

We acknowledge with gratitude a visit from Dr. McKay of Formosa, accompanied by a native helper, both of whom were heard in February last, with much acceptance. The same thanks are due Dr. Marion Oliver, who gave an address at a union meeting in the Lecture Room of Chalmer's Church during April; also Miss Baker in September, gave an account of her work among Indian women and children in Prince Albert, at a union meeting in our own Hall; again, in November, Mr. Goforth described his work in Honan, China, at a union meeting in St. Andrew's Church.

We have also had an interesting account from Mrs. Cochrane of our Mission Stations in British Columbia, while a synopsis of the Presbyterial and Annual Meetings was given by our delegates.

The mode of raising funds for the Society is mainly by an optional membership fee, although most of our members contribute one dollar annually. Mite boxes are distributed, and a collection taken at monthly meetings.

The chief topic discussed at our meetings lately has been how to awaken greater interest in Foreign Missions—how to increase our membership—how are we to make our meetings more successful and more interesting.

Eleven meetings have been held during the year, average attendance 12. A bale valued at \$54.35 was sent to Prince Albert.

The annual Thankoffering Meeting was held, as usual, in November; the offerings, added to the contents of the mite boxes sent in at the end of the year, amounted to \$49.77.

Owing to severe family bereavement and subsequent ill-health, the Secretary has not been able to act for some time, but her place has been taken by the Treasurer.

This Association respectfully reports that during the year the monthly meetings have been stately held, and that the attendance on the whole has been satisfactory.

The care of the poor, entrusted to this Association by the Kirk-Session, has been faithfully attended to by Mrs. Mackie, along with Miss Gray. The accounts, with vouchers, have been audited, found correct, and submitted with details to the Kirk-Session for inspection. It will be seen that the Communion collections have been sufficient for all requirements, and regular personal visitation has prevented any want existing unknown.

District visitors, to the number of 24, have called on the families of the church every month, giving accurate information of congregational work and increasing an interest in it. They have also distributed over 200 copies of the Record, and received contributions in ways most convenient to the givers for the Home and Foreign Missions of the church.

In accordance with the desire of last congregational meeting to have a complete report of subscriptions to this latter and very important work, the visitors have put forth every endeavour to secure this, but have not been entirely successful. There are still promises to be fulfilled, but sure. At the present date, after including these promises, there is collected nearly \$90 less than last year. This deficiency, it is to be noted with surprise, arises not as might have been expected, from poorer families, by reason of the pressure of hard times, reducing or withholding their subscriptions.

The strength of the Association has for a second year been principally put forth in what is now widely known as The Talent. Two

hundred women were engaged in the work during the year, and the total result of their labours, including a few subscriptions from some who did not work the Talent, has been a net gain of \$2,150. The object sought to be accomplished was the further lessening of the Church Building account by at least \$2,000, and the payment of a new furnace placed in the manse last winter, which cost \$359. The sum realized, however, does not do both these things, so \$118 belonging to the Association, but derived from other sources than the Talent, has been advanced in the confident expectation that subscriptions will still come in to that amount, and that the Association may have the gratification of making a second payment of \$2,000 towards the reduction of the Church Building account.

In grateful recognition of God's goodness and continued reliance upon Him, the Women's Home Association will labour on for the prosperity of St. Andrew's.

The Hospital Section, with Miss Hudgeons as convener, has paid weekly visits to the General Hospital and Rockwood Asylum. At the latter institution quite a little congregation meets for prayer and the study of the Scriptures every Wednesday, and the patients look forward to these meetings with great pleasure. It is only right to acknowledge the valuable services rendered in this work to the Section by Mrs. Marshall, of Elmhurst, though not a member of St. Andrew's. She has conducted with much success, and with great appreciation, the meetings at Rockwood, and the loving interest she manifests to the afflicted there have made her visits a season of gladness to the darkened and despairing. The cottages and hospitals in connection with the main buildings are also regularly visited, and the Bible is read at the bedside and sweet hymns are sung for the cheering of the suffering and sorrowful. The members of the Section engaged in the work at Rockwood are, through timidity, not many; but those who do work there are so interested in the work that they would not willingly quit it for any other sphere.

For the General Hospital the Section has been the means of providing 70 copies of the Holy Scriptures, strongly bound, and of large clear type, at a cost of \$28.15. The kind friends who have helped in this good work have had their subscriptions acknowledged in St. Andrew's Church Notes. We simply thank them anew, and feel sure that they will be glad to know that now the Word of God, the only source of effectual consolation and spiritual health, lies in every private room in the whole building, and by almost every bed in all the common wards. It is in the hope that the silent, sacred page may be the Divine voice to many a sufferer that the Section has been moved to make this provision.

Meetings have also been held by this Section from time to time in the House of Industry, and the Protestants in the Hotel Dieu, and the House of Providence have also been ministered to. In the latter place permission has now been granted to read the Scriptures and pray with the poor.

The Social Section, of which Miss Knox is convener, has attended to all the pleasant gatherings that have been held in the hall during the year. With the cordial co-operation of the corresponding Section of the Young Men's Guild they have had successful "At Homes" for the young people of the church, for students and strangers joining the congregation, things necessary and desirable for the promotion of mutual acquaintance and friendly interest in one another.

The work of the Guild throughout the past year has been confined to the General Hospital, and principally to St. Andrew's Children's Ward.

In the early part of the year the President, Miss Edith Macpherson, had regretfully to withdraw from the position, and Miss Broun, one of the Vice-Presidents, kept the Guild together, and the work was carried on without interruption and successfully till a new President was appointed. Three months ago Miss Etta Macpherson was offered and willingly accepted the office, and has proved indefatigable and

zealous in the discharge of its duties, and under her leadership much may be expected for the current year.

We are glad to report an increase of membership, the total at present being 37, which is 15 more than last year. There is no reason manifest why there should not be a larger representation of the young people of the congregation.

The attendance at the weekly sewing meetings has been good, and during the last months of the year very good.

The St. Andrew's children's ward has been visited weekly by the younger members of the Guild under the care of one of the ladies or members of the committee, thus awakening and increasing their interest in the hospital, while bringing sunshine to the little sufferers.

The income of the Guild for the past year was \$72.35, made up principally of a balance of \$23.70 from the former year, \$30 from a concert held in the hall, and from the following donations: Lady Broun, \$5; Mrs. Paul, \$1; Mr. McIntyre, \$1; Mrs. McIntyre, \$1; Miss Etta Macpherson, \$1; and from the Guild collection book, \$6.87.

The expenditure, amounting to \$52.83, has been entirely on the hospital. Among the articles provided have been—a tea set, a toilet set, glass jars for nurses' baskets, knives, forks and spoons, white oil cloth, rubber sheeting, three draught screens, 8 pairs twilled sheets, slippers, creton cushions, netted hammock.

There remains a balance of \$19.52, which work on hand will not be long in consuming.

With grateful thanks to all friends, and with confident hope of the increased support of the congregation, the Guild respectfully submits this report.
