

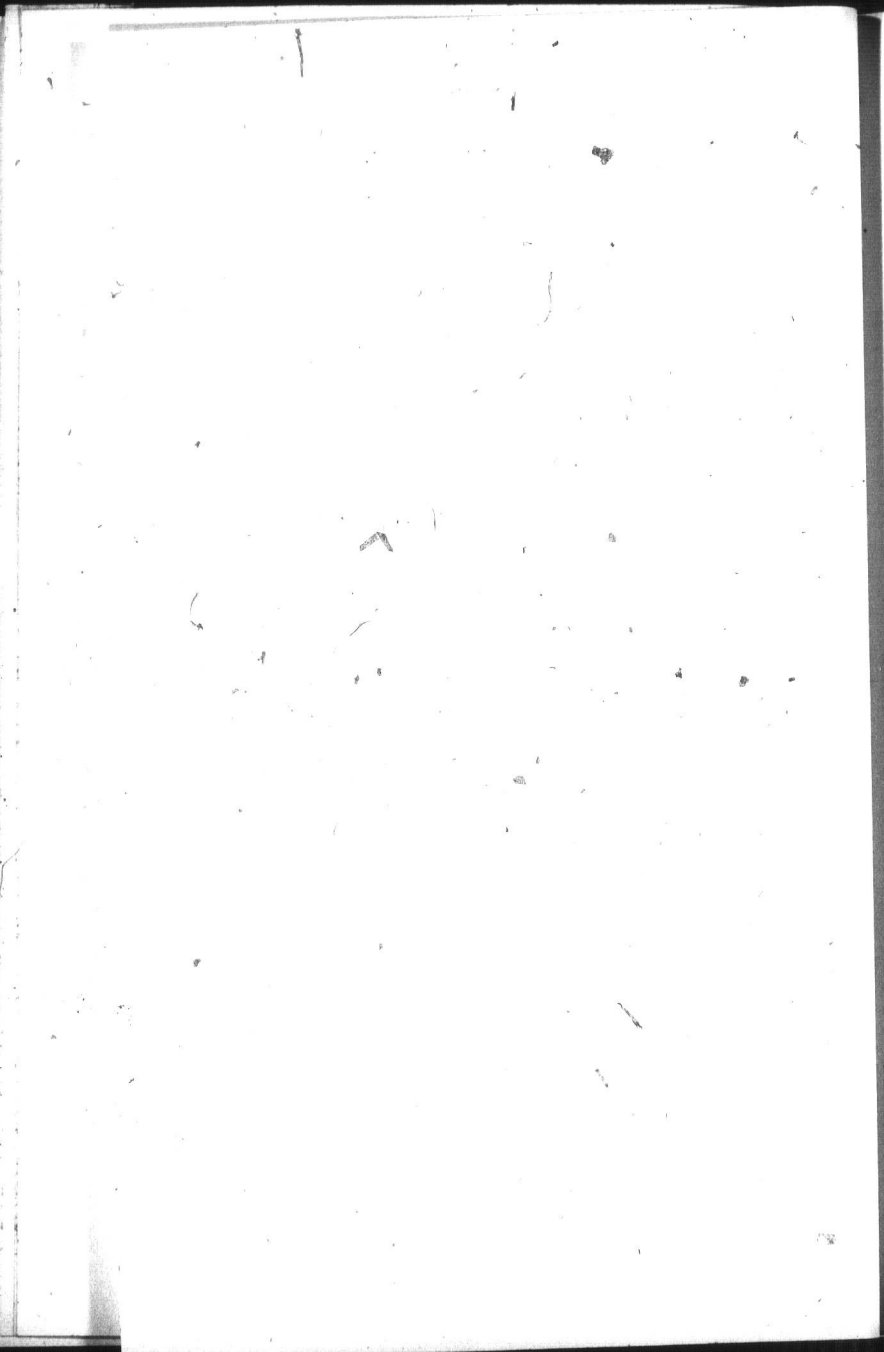

The Board of Managers would earnestly impress on every member and adherent of this congregation the great importance of all using our weekly (white) envelope system regularly this year. It is our only source of revenue. It is of the utmost importance that our revenue this year be large and if all join, it can be so. Those not yet using this envelope should join in this effort. It is the duty of every one to do so and thus become helpers.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ALL SEATS BEING FREE, the maintenance of the Church depends entirely upon the voluntary contributions of the members and adherents. It is therefore the duty of every member and adherent to undertake to give a certain sum of money EACH SABBATH.

“Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God has prospered him.”—1st Cor. xvi. 2.

As envelopes will be issued to anyone contributing five cents and upwards weekly, the system is within the reach of all.

It is to be hoped that every member and adherent of the Church, whether old or young, who has an income, will ask for envelopes and give according to his or her means.

Statements will be rendered quarterly showing with what regularity contributions have been made.

A committee of the managers is in attendance at the close of the weekly prayer meeting to allocate sittings.

Envelopes can be obtained in the vestibule before or after any of the Sabbath services, from Mr. C. G. Smith who is in attendance there.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation.

Toronto, January 19th, 1898.

Pursuant to notice read from the pulpit on the two preceding Sabbaths, the annual meeting was held this evening in the lecture hall.

The meeting was opened by prayer. The chair was occupied by the Rev. Alex. Gilray.

On the motion of Mr. T. Henderson seconded by Mr. A. Findlay, Mr. D. W. Clark was appointed Secretary of the meeting.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting as printed in the year book were accepted as read.

The report of the Board of Managers was read by Mr. C. R. Peterkin who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The nominations for the seven vacancies on the Board of Managers were then made, which resulted in the election of the following gentlemen for three years, Dr. A. R. Gordon, Messrs. Wm. Bennett, W. J. McCullough, W. E. Raney, P. Whytck and A. Findlay, and for one year Mr. Alex. Bell.

The Scrutineers being Messrs. E. H. Harcourt, D. S. Graham, R. Wilson, C. G. Smith and J. W. Lowes.

The Treasurer's report was received as printed by motion of Mr. C. R. Peterkin, treasurer. Carried.

The Session report read by the Session Clerk, Mr. Geo. E. Dalby, was accepted as read.

The Sabbath School report read by Mr. W. H. Acheson, Associate Superintendent, was accepted as read.

The Women's Foreign Missionary Society report was read by its president, Mrs. Gray.

The Y. P. S. C. E. report was read by Mr. Mitchell.

Women's Association report was read by Miss Elsie Clark.

Bible Class report was read by Mr. G. R. W. Thomas.

Junior Society of Christian Endeavor report was read by Mr. Robt. Wilson.

The Speedwell Mission Band report was read by Mrs. Gray.

On motion of Mr. John Imrie, seconded by Mr. A. Findlay, the above reports were adopted. Carried.

The Board of Managers report was accepted as read.

On motion Mr. A. E. Bastedo, seconded by Mr. C. R. Peterkin, a vote of thanks was tendered to the Auditors for their services during the year. Carried.

On motion of Mr. W. E. Raney, seconded by Mr. J. Bennett, a vote of thanks was tendered to Messrs. C. R. Peterkin, J. Samuelson, W. H. Acheson and all the other executive officers of the different societies. Carried

On motion of Mr. A. Bell, seconded by Mr. A. E. Bastedo, a vote of thanks was tendered to the choir, its leader and the organist.

It was moved by Mr. A. E. Bastedo, seconded by Mr. W. E. Raney, that Messrs. Frank Nicholson and W. G. Merson be the auditors for the year 1898. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. G. E. Dalby and duly seconded that Messrs. Jas. Turnbull, A. E. Bastedo and E. H. Harcourt be the trustees for 1898.

It was moved by Mr. D. Urquhart, seconded by Dr. A. R. Gordon, that the Board of Managers be instructed to print the Annual Report as usual. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. R. Wilson, seconded by Mr. A. Bell, that the Annual Report shall not contain anything in the report outside of the matter printed last year. Carried.

It was moved in amendment by Dr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. A. Findlay, that the Board be empowered to print the number of envelope and amount contributed by each contributor. Lost.

It was moved by Mr. D. Urquhart, seconded by Mr. C. R. Peterkin, that in view of the fact that the mortgage on the church property is overdue, the managers be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to make all necessary arrange-

ments for a renewal of the said mortgage, or for the obtaining of a new loan on the church property for a sum sufficient to discharge the old mortgage and consolidate the floating indebtedness of the church.

This concluded the business of the meeting, which was dismissed by the singing of the Doxology, and prayer by the pastor, Rev. Alex. Gilray.

NOTE. No summary is made of any of the reports referred to in the Minutes, each of them being printed in full in the following pages.

SESSION REPORT FOR YEAR 1897.

During the year 77 members have been added by certificate and 33 by profession of faith—110 in all.

Ninety-five have been disjoined and removed by death leaving a net increase of 15 members.

The number now on the roll is 861.

Twenty-two children and two adults have been baptized.

The session now comprises our pastor as moderator and twenty-five elders.

We sustained the loss of our esteemed brother Mr. Thomas Woolley last August. He proved faithful in all the duties of his office as an elder, and though of a retiring disposition he carried on important work in visiting the sick in his district, occasionally holding prayer meetings for the benefit of those who could not attend the public services of the church.

Death has also removed from our midst Mr. Chas. Wilmott, Mrs. Fenwick, Mrs. J. Grant, Mrs. W. Kennedy, Mrs. Leslie, Mrs. D. Black, Miss Mary Mitchell and Mr. Cuthbertson, Sr.

The several organizations of the congregation will present full reports which shew faithful and energetic efforts in the accomplishment of very encouraging results.

We do not wish to anticipate these reports, but we desire to record our gratitude to God for all His goodness and for all the prosperity He has been pleased to continue to us.

BOARD OF MANAGERS ANNUAL REPORT.

The Managers in submitting their Annual Report have much reason to acknowledge gratefully the goodness of God.

They are able again to report a reduction in the debt by the sum of \$310.11.

The amount received from open collections was \$969.74, and from the weekly envelope \$3,738.57. Total \$4,708.31.

There was a decrease of \$39.76 in the open collection and an increase of \$113.79 in the envelopes, or a net increase of \$73.03 over the total amount received for 1896.

The average for the year per Sabbath was \$90.54 as against \$89.12 for 1896, or an increase of \$1.42 per Sabbath.

If we estimate the number of envelopes used regularly at 330 it would require an average of 40 cents per envelope each Sabbath to meet the current expenses.

There has been a falling off in the contributions to the Debt Fund, the amount received being \$406.21, as against \$558.25 for 1896, being a decrease of \$152.04.

The Managers take pleasure in noting that the congregation have, to some extent, adopted the suggestion made to them by the Managers at the last annual meeting of a more general and regular use of the weekly offering envelope and hope that its use will be still greatly increased as it is the recognized method for the support of ordinances with us, there being no pew rents.

The Managers sincerely thank the congregation and the several societies connected therewith for the hearty support extended to them enabling them to meet the current expenses and end the year so well financially, but they cannot allow the opportunity to pass without making special mention of the effort and zeal put forth by the Women's Association.

The Managers while reporting their inability thus far to arrange the mortgage as satisfactorily, or at as low a rate of interest as they think they should, would suggest the advisability of continuing the power given to them by resolution at the last annual meeting to arrange and consolidate the same.

The retiring members of the Board are Dr. Gordon, P. Whytock, A. Findlay (Elder), W. J. McCullough, W. R. Miller (Elder), Wm. Bennett, E. H. Harcourt (resigned).

Six members are to be elected for three years and one for one year.

Their prayer is that God may bless this congregation more abundantly in the year upon which they have just entered than in the past, and that all may serve Him more faithfully and diligently in the future.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

We desire to express our gratitude to God for His goodness in permitting us with some degree of success to continue in the work of teaching the Way of Life to the young people of our congregation.

Misses McDonald and Bennett, two of our teachers, have left us for enlarged service in the China Inland Mission.

The number of scholars on the roll is 670, an increase of 13. Owing to the large and increasing number of our people who spend a good part of the summer out of the city, the average attendance instead of increasing is rather diminishing.

The average this year is 454. Last year it was 474.

Fourteen united with the church by profession of faith.

Fifteen were successful at the examinations in higher religious instruction in January 1897.

At the first quarterly Review three received full marks; at the second, two; at the third, four; and at the fourth, two.

The Temperance Society has now a membership of 90 as against 70 last year.

160 volumes have been added to the library which now contains 950 volumes.

We are grateful for the late additions to the staff of teachers but we have still room for more. Who will volunteer?

We wish to thank the Sabbath School Committee of the Christian Endeavor for valuable assistance rendered.

Will the parents kindly co-operate with the teachers in seeing that their children come to school at the right time bringing their bibles with them, and in helping them to remember that reverence is very essential while in the House of God.

We go forward hopefully in the year upon which we have entered looking for a blessing to the Master who has said, "Suffer the little children to come unto Me and forbid them not for of such is the Kingdom of God."

In presenting our 9th Annual Report we would acknowledge with thankfulness and praise the guidance and blessing of our Lord and Master in permitting us, although with very unworthy efforts on our part to accomplish what we have in His service.

Our meetings have been well attended, and we have been spiritually strengthened.

The increase in membership for the past year has been 23. There are at present on the roll 130 members, active and associate. It has been encouraging to the Officers of the Society to note the number from the Sabbath School who have joined us during the past six months. The total collections, regular and special, amounted to \$120.68 of which \$44.48 has been set apart for missions, and \$46.24 paid over to the church treasurer. The monthly topics suggested by the Presbytery bearing principally upon the foundations, doctrines and schemes of the Presbyterian Church have been taken up and found to be very profitable. The Missionary and Temperance meetings have been interesting and instructive.

Misses M. McDonald and L. Bennett, lately appointed missionaries in China, have been most active members of our missionary committee. Their lives in our midst have been an influence for the highest good and the prayers and good wishes of the individual members of the Society accompany them to their new fields of labor.

During the past year eleven sewing and eight business meetings were held. The attendance was good and much interest was shown in the work.

Last January 250 "cent-a-day boxes" were purchased. Over 200 were distributed among the congregation and the sum of \$316.48 was realized therefrom.

A very enjoyable congregational social was held in connection with the opening of the boxes.

A delightful parlor concert was held in the home of Mrs. Wood on January 12th, the proceeds were \$8.48.
