

RID CANADA OF

Government to Deport Revolutionists and Agitators of All Nationalities.

A despatch from Ottawa says: A blow at Bolshevism was struck in A blow at Bolshevism in Canada was struck in Parliamen to-day when a bill was passed giving the Government power to deport red-eyed revolutionists, anarchists, agitators, rioters and all persons who by word or act advocate the overthrow by force or violence of the Governments of Great Britain or Canada, or who without lawful authority assume any power of government in Canada, or who without lawful authority assume any power of government in Canada. A record for lightning legislation was established when the measure was given all three readings in both Houses of Parliament, and received the Royal assent all on the same day —indeed, the whole thing was done in less than an hour. Support in both Houses was unanimons.




