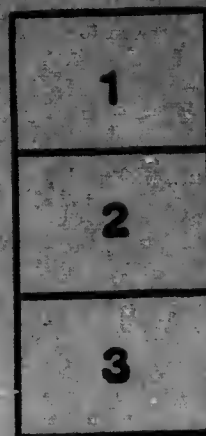
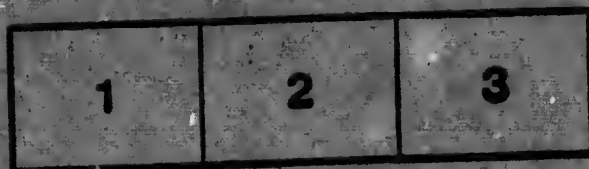

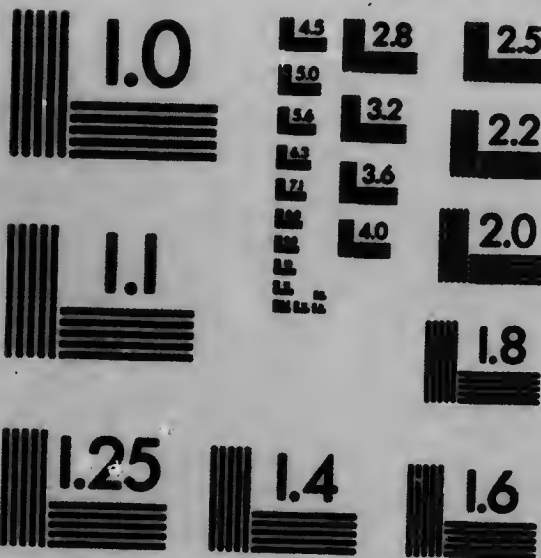

Amen.
