Explanations and Principal Articles of the Calendar FOR 1876.

EXPLANATIONS.

All the calculations are reduced to local mean time for Charlottetown, with the exception of the Sun's right ascension and declination, and the equation of time, which are given for the instant of apparent noon.

The various phenomena of the Moon's motions and the Tides, are given to the nearest minute. The bearings of the Moon, at the time of its changes, are given for the purpose of assisting or testing the truth of weather forecasts.

The days of expected atmospheric disturbance are those on which the Moon, in its orbit, crosses the equinoctial line, or attains its greatest north or south declination. When these days fall close upon—within two days—the time of the Moon's change, or perigee, the disturbing influence on the atmospheric tides is proportionally increased. These cases are marked ** or *** according as two or three of these influences are combined, and the more closely these times agree, the stronger and more certain is the disturbance to be expected.

In addition to the general local disturbance on these days, it sometimes happens that the effects of a storm generated within the tropics, may be propagated so as to arrive within two or three days, it having been ascertained that the average rate at which the centre of such storms travel, is about sixteen miles an hour.



ECLIPSES.

During the year, there will be four Eclipses, viz: two solar and two lunar.

1. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, March 9-10, visible at Charlottetown. Greenwich mean time of opposition, March 9, 17h 30m 9.8s



1st contact with penumbra 11h 44.3m p. m. March 9. 1st contact with shadow 1h 8.7 a. m. March 10. Middle of Eclipse 2h 8.7 a. m. Last contact with shadow 3h 8.7.1 a. m. Last contact with penumbra 4h 33.1. a. m. The dotted circle shews the extent of the penumbra.

II. An annular Eclipse of the Sun. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, March 25, 8h 42m 6.2s. Line of centrality passes from Hawaii through Vancouver Island, north of Hudson Bay, to Holsteinberg, on the west coast of Greenland; visible as a partial Eclipse at Charlottetown. The Moon enters on the western limb of the Sun at 42m past 4 in the afternoon; the middle of the Eclipse, or phase of greatest obscuration, at 33m past 5; portion of disc covered 5.2 digits of the sun's diameter.

IV. A total Eclipse of the Sun September 17. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 10h 19m 10.9s; the line of centrality passes from near New Guinea across the South Pacific towards Cape Horn; only seen as a partial Eclipse on the eastern side of Australia.

PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Apparent motion alternately retrograde and direct between the following dates, when he is stationary, to the east or west of the Sun—Feb. 3, E; Feb. 25, W.: June 3, E.; June 27, W.; Sept. 30, E.; October 21, W.; Dec. 31, E.—being a morning star while to the west, and an evening star when to the east of the sun: he will be in inferior conjunction with the sun on Feb. 12; June 15; Oct. 12; in superior conjunction April 22; August 4; Dec. 3; he will be occulted by the Moon Sept. 19.

VENUS.—Apparent motion direct till June 21, then retrograde till Aug. 4, and afterwards direct to the end of the year; in inferior conjunction with the Sun July 13; occulted by the Moon Jan. 28, and Oct. 13.

MARJ.—Motion direct throughout the year; in conjunction with the Sun Aug. 12, after which he reappears as an evening star; occulted by the Moon on Jan. 2 and 31.


JUPITER will be direct till March 17; retrograde to July 19, afterward direct to the end of the year; in opposition to the Sun May 17, and a morning star to his conjunction with the Sun December 4.

SATURN.—Motion retrograde between June 19 and Nov. 29; direct during the rest of the year; in conjunction with the Sun Feb. 17; in opposition Aug. 27; range of motion 14½ degrees in the constellation Aquarius; he will be occulted by the Moon ten times, viz: April 19, May 16, June 13, July 10, Aug. 6, Sept. 3, Sept. 29. Oct. 27, Nov. 23, Dec. 21.

URANUS.—Motion direct between April 22 and Nov. 29; retrograde during the rest of the year; in opposition to the Sun Feb. 6; in conjunction, Oct, 26; occulted by the Moon Dec. 6; range of motion 8\(^3\) degrees in the commencement of the constellation Leo, approaching on the 29th Nov. 3 deg. 23 sec. of the bright star Regulas

NEPTUNE.—Motion direct between Jan. 11 and Aug. 8; retrograde during the rest of the year; in conjunction with the Sun April 22; in opposition Oct. 26; range of motion 43 deg. in the commencement of Aries.

Of the sixteen occultations above enumerated, only two will be observable at Charlottetown; namely, those of Saturn, on Aug. 6, and 7, and Sept. 3, from 3h 40m to 4h 34m a.m.; and from 13h 3m to 12h 38m.



Stewed Carrots.—Cut the green tops off short-horn carrots immediately they are drawn from the bed; scrape them slightly, cut off the filaments and throw them into cold water; brown, in butter, a very small quantity of chopped onion and flour: if onion be objected to, some other browning, as caramel, or burnt sugar,

may be substituted: but so little will suffice that it will hardly be suspected. Then stir in as much good stock as will cover the carrots; when it boils throw them in; season, very slightly, with pepper and salt. As stock reduces, keep stirring them, to prevent sticking and burning. By the time they are done, the gravy should be reduced almost to a glaze. Transfer them to a hot vegetable dish, and pour the gravy over them.

All liquids are taken in imperial gallons, and one-fifth added to tariff rates, per gallon, on all Spirits, \$1.20; Wines, 72 cents; Coal Oil, 18 cents.

The two following provisions are found in the Customs Act of 1871:—The Governor in Council may, from time to time transfer to the list of Goods which may be imported into Canada free of duty, any or all articles (whether natural articles or products of manufactures), used as materials in Canadian manufactures; and any such materials mentioned in any Order in Council in that behalf, shall be free of duties of Customs from the time therein appointed for that purpose.

The Governor in Council may authorise the admission, free of duty, of any Machinery to be used in any Canadian manufactory, on satisfactory evidence that like machinery is not then manu-

factured in Canada.

TABLE OF PROHIBITIONS:

The following articles shall be prohibited to be imported under a penalty of two hundred dollars, together with a forfeiture of the parcel or package of goods in which the same may be found, viz:

Books, Drawings, Paintings, Prints and Photographs of an immoral or indecent character.

Coin, base and Counterfeit.

THE FOLLOWING

Under Regulations and Restrictions to be prescribed by the Minister of Customs:—Carriages of travellers, and Carriages laden with Merchandize, and not to include Circus Troops and Hawkers. Locomotive and Railway passenger Baggage and freight cars running upon any line of road crossing the frontier, so long as Canadian Locomotives and Cars are admitted free under similar circumstances in the United States. Menageries, horses, cattle, carriages, and harness of. Travellers' baggage.

THE FOLLOWING GOODS,

When the product and growth of any of the B. N. A. Provinces, may be imported free of duty, subject to alteration or regulation, by proclamation, of the Governor in Council, viz.:—

Animals of all kinds; Fresh, Smoked and Salted Meats; Green and Dried Fruits; Fish of all kinds; Products of Fish, and of all other creatures living in the water; Poultry, Butter, Cheese, Lard, Tallow; Timber and lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, but not otherwise manufactured in whole or in part; Fish Oil; Gypsnm, ground or unground; Hay, Straw, Seeds of all kinds. Vegetables (including potatoes and other roots); Plants, Trees and Shrubs.



Statistics, &c., relating to P. E. Island.

Prince Edward Island contains an area of about 1,250,000 acres, nearly all of which is fit for cultivation. It is divided into three Counties, 67 Townships, and 15 Electoral Districts. The population, by the census of 1871, is 94,021, of whom about 42,651 are in Queen's County. The population of Prince County is 28,022; and of King's County, 23,068. Charlottetown, the Capital of the Island, is in Queen's County, and contains about 8807 inhabitants; Georgetown and Royalty, 1056; and Summerside and Township No. 17, 3,562. The House of Assembly is composed of 30 members, and the Legislative Council of 13, all of whom are elected by the people. The Executive Council is limited to nine members. Responsible Government was granted in 1851. The number of Schools now in operation is 397 attended by about 19,000 children. In 1852, when the present Free Education Act was passed, the number was 160. There are besides the Prince of Wales College (public.) St. Dunstan s College, Christian Brothers and other schools, (Roman Catholic,) the Wesleyan Academy (Denominational), a County Grammar School in Georgetown and Summerside, and eighteen similiar Schools throughout other parts of the Island. The whole cost of public instruction, which is under the control of a Board of Education; consisting of nine Members and two Examiners, is defrayed out of the Provincial Treasury. There is a School Visitor for each County, who reports to the Board, and the latter to the Government. In 1871 an Act passed the Legislature, authorizing the Government to construct a line of Railway from Alberton to Georgetown, with branch lines to Souris and Tignish. This Road—measuring 197 miles—was completed and handed over to the General Government of Canada, in December 1874. On the first day of July, 1873, the Island entered the Union, and became part of the Dominion of Canada.






