By the Ship Pacific, 14th April from Liverpool. English papers have been received at New York to that date.

The Imperial Parliament re-assembled on the 11th March. Lord John Russell had proposed the consideration of his Tide Bill for the present; upon whom ground it is not stated.

We will pleasure refer our readers to an extract which will be found below, relative to an exact value of land in the colonies.

Hawkins, the parties in charge of the establish-

ment.

With the exception of Mr. and Mrs. Ormsby, the latter of whom stood his troubles with a becoming fortitude, we were more or less frost-bitten, and had suffered from leading-
astic wounds having mortified. The former, with one exception, are now pretty well.

The ship will be a total wreck.

If my intention to proceed to Camp nearly

as possible, to procure a schooner, to convey the passengers, crew and stores to Quebec.

At present I will stay until I get up,

when I will be ready in the morning.
