There was scarcely a nationality of Lutinorigin but obeyed the rule of this greedy and prolife family. France, of course, was theirs. Spain fell into their hands by the testament of the timid idiot, Charles the Bewitched. The marriage of Philip V, the first Spanish Bourbon, with Elizabeth Farnece, filled the secondary thrones of Italy with the rickety seions of the decaying race. But not one has kept his crown. In many different ways they managed to destroy their thrones. One by one they made their feeble and tyraunical rule so odious that the people rose against them and drove them out of their plages, Ava general thing, they fell without dignity, it required three revolutions to clear them out of France. One perished on the seaffold. Another attempted to muzzle the freedom of the Press and produced the Three Days of July, 1830. The last, after eighteen years of a quasi constitutional reign, fell in the effort to prevent an extension of the suffrage and to suppress the right of public meeting. In Italy, their misfortunes are to numerous and too commonplace to recount. There was a little spurt of something like herosam on the part of King Bomba's German wife at Gaeto, which made the Empress Eugenie, at a time when that lovely pary venue was on pleasant terms with imperial society, call her "a married Jean of Are." A SITCH IN THE PROCEEDINGS ! Rumored Withdrawal of Chief Justica Cockburn.

Lendon, Feb. 2.—The discussion of the Malbana chains continues and grows more veherical as the opening of Parliament approaches. The English case haid before the General Board of Arbitration, has not been published, and no opportunity has been given of forming an estimate of British demands; but the case of the United States has now been before the public two or three week, and all the newspapers and other organs of public opinion teem with hostile comment and false reports in regard to it.


