God, we are told, showed a preference for Abel's offering above that of his brother, which excited the jeal-ousy of Cain to such a degree that he murdered his brother Abel. God was the witness, God was the judge.

AAT. Abel. God was the judge. What did God do? Did He order the death of Cain as the satisfaction and the equivalent for the crime that Can had committed? No such things. He permitted? No such things. He permitted Cain to live after stamping him with the brand of murderer. The truth to be demined in the crime of murder is this, God did not annex the penalty of death to the crime. If there is any validity to God's authority in dealing with the crime of murder the case of Cain should guide mankind for all subsequent time. But in these days of wonderful human legislators. McKinleys and William Smallwoods, the ways and methods of God are of little weight and authority. They indicate an opinion of God worse than unbelief, because it is contumely of His wisdom and authority. Already, however, a formal protest has been made against the ruffian hangman by a religious body. In Buckle's history of civilization it is shown that the crime of murder, the most arbitrary and irregular of all forms of crime, follows given states or conditions of society with mathematical accuracy. There is a steady oscillation between the extremes of minimum and maximum of the crime of murder against which the death penalty is futile. Why continue a punishment which, while it is a failure, it also debases and degrades the living to the level of ruffian? Nothing can exceed the ignominy involved in the term hangman. Against such

Birchall is not without loving and loveable instincts. His gaol surroundings are in love with him; what wonder then that his wife should be so devoted? Deprived of father when the guidence was most needed he seems to his ruin. The manner of his writing shows that he fully apprehends his situation and that he is determined to make his experience an example subservient of good. His love for science in a state of confinement might enable him to evolve something of incalculable benefit to mankind. But even aside from such considerations why should society cling to the brutalizing business of capital punishment and regard it as efficacious in limiting the crime of murder? We know there are some, notably amongst professing Christians, who regard death as the most awful of punishments, that physical death is the direct punishment which God originally inflicted as the consequence of sin.




