

It is hereby enacted, by the authority of the London Township Council, that the lerk shall attend all sittings of the Council, and record, and keep, all the pro-

ceedings of the said Council, and duly file, and keep, all petitions, letters, bonds, and other documents belonging to the Township wife the decign and only

And be it further enacted, that the Clerk shall notify, by letter, through the Post Office, each, and every officer appointed by the Council, within ten days after such appointment having been made, instructing them of the time and place to meet said clerk, and enter into the necessary bonds, or to take the requisite ouths of office.

And be it further enacted, that the said Township Clerk shall prepare for each Road Master in the Township, a list of the different parties liable to perform Statute Labor in his division, giving the number of days for which each party is liable, which list shall be furnished, in all cases, on or before the first Tuesday in May, of each and every year; And be it further enacted, that upon receiving back from each of the Road Masters, a proper return, duly attested, of all Statute Labor performed, and of all commutation money paid, it shall be his duty to ascertain who, and what party, has either refused, or neglected, to perform the necessary quantity of Statute Labor, or to have paid the commutation money in lieu thereof, at the rate of two and sixpence for each day's labor, and to make a complaint of each and every party before the Township. Reeve, or some magistrate resident in the Township, giving the name of the pathmaster upon whose roll the parties have appeared as defaulters.

And be it further enacted, that in all cases where the Township Clerk shall fuil to prosecute the parties complained of to conviction, or where, from extreme poverty, the necessary costs cannot be collected, it shall and may be lawful for said clerk to draw upon the Township Treasurer for such costs appending to the draft, a bill of said costs, signed by the magistrate who tried the cause; and the Treasurer is hereby duly authorised to pay such drafts from any road appropriations then in his hands.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to establish, designate and describe the height and description of Fences in the Township of London, so that such fences shall be deemed sufficient, and lawful.

conduct whereoever to be practical, in it also Be it therefore enacted, by and with the authority of the Municipal Council, of the Township of London, that from and after the passing of this By-Law, fences of the height and description following, shall be deemed and considered lawful fences:

Board Fences, supported by posts at every eight feet, or less, are to be four feet six inches in height, having no greater space than four inches, within two feet of the ground.

Post and Rail Fences to be the same height as above mentioned, with no greater space than four inches, until they exceed two feet in height.

Worm Fences to be laid with at least two feet six inches worm, with good, substantial rails, and carried spenroperly to the height of four feet six inches, with no greater space for the first two feet than above described. Abutou car, to more sait assumpting quitative .

Be it therefore enacted, by authority of the London Township Council, that each Pound Reper shall provide a good and commodious Pound, properly fenced, and supplied with water, wherein he shall safely keep all such horses, cattle, sheep, swine and other animals, as may be committed to his charge.

And be it further enacted, that in the event of any parties claiming damages for trespasses committed by any horses, cattle, sheep, swine, or other animals (not pohibited from running at large, by By-Law No. 14), so impounded, it shall be the duty of the Pound keeper, within forty-eight hours after having impounded any such animal, to notify three disinterested freeholders, to appraise the damages complained of; and also to judge of the efficiency of the fence enclosing the grounds

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to protect the Bridges in the Township of London, from wanton or unnecessary injury.

Be it therefore enacted, by authority of the Municipal Council of the Township of London, that, from and after the passing of this By-Law, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, to drive, ride, or lead any horse, horses, or other animal, over any Bridge, within the said Township, at any pace faster than a walk, or to drag, or cause to be dragged, any timber, logs, ploughs, harrows, or anything whatsoever over any such bridge, whereby such bridge may be injured, unless such timber, logs, ploughs, harrows, don, don, shall be properly supported on wheels or runners:

And it is further enacted, that any violation of this By-Law shall be punishable by fine, or imprisonment, upon complaint, on oath, of one competent witness, before any of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace resident in said township.

Be it therefore enacted, by the authority of the Municipal Council of the Township of London, that from and after the passing of this By-Law, it shall be the duty of each and every Pathmaster, appointed in said Township, to attend at the time and places directed by the Township Clerk, and to take before such clerk the necessary. oaths of office, and also to receive the Statute Labor Lists, belonging to his respective division, which list shall entitle each Pathmaster to call out, and compel the parties whose names are thereon written, to perform the number of days' labor for

And it is hereby further enacted, that any person who shall neglect, or refuse, after having received four days notice from the Pathmaster, to perform, or cause to be performed, the Statute Labor for which he or she may be liable, to the full satisfaction of the pathmaster (working faithfully for eight hours each day,) shall forfeit and pay, for each day's laber, so refused, or neglected, the sum of five shillings currency (exclusive of costs) to be collected in a summary manner before any of the Magistrates in the Township of London.

And be it further enacted, that every person liable for the performance of Statute Labor, in the Township of London, shall furnish all such carts, waggons, ploughs, picks, axes, spades, teams, &c., &c., as may be required for the proper performance of the labor, as directed by the Pathmaster; and in no case shall the party charge, or be allowed, for use of any tool or implement used by him, when doing his Statute Labor; but nothing in this clause shall prevent parties being showed for the use of horses, oxen, or other teams, at the rate of one day for each double team.

And it is hereby further enacted, that should any bridge, culvert, water course, causeway, embankment, or any other part of any road give way, and become defective, at any time, so as to endanger the future stability of the road, bridge, or other work mentioned, or to endanger the travelling public, it shall and may be lawful for the Pathmaster, in whose division each defect may take place, to notify the nearest resident householders, and repair such defect, as soon as possible; and any neglect or refusal on the part of any individual to attend to such calls from any Pathmaster, shall be punished as a default in Statute Labor, and one day's notice only shall be required from such Pathmaster, in such cases of emergency.

And it is hereby further enacted, that the Pathmasters shall, if required, give parties so repairing any road, bridge or other work, a certificate of the number of day's labor so expended, which certificate shall entitle the parties to be credited on the next year's Statute Labor List, in any part of the Township where they may reside, or have removed.

And it is hereby further enacted, that where any road shall be bounded by woods or forest trees, it shall be the duty of the Pathmaster of such division, to give the owner, or occupier, of such wood-land, or forest trees, notice in writing, requiring such owner, or occupier, to cut down all such timber or trees, for the distance of twenty-five feet, from the outside of the road, within sixty days after having received such notice. And should each owner, or occupier, neglect or refuse to cut such trees and timber, as required, it shall be the duty of the Pathmaster to cut and remove, or cause to be cut or removed, such timber and trees, either by Statute Labor, or to sell the timber for defraying the necessary expenses.

And it is hereby further enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for any Path-master to enter into any enclosed fields, adjoining any roads under his inspection, and to cut, dig, or open any drain or ditch, the more effectually to drain any road over which his jurisdiction extends; Provided always that no drain or ditch shall be open through any lawn, avenue, garden, or pleasure grounds, without the consent of the owner.

And be it further enacted, that in case of death, absence, or inability from sickness, or unavoidable cause, any vacancy may occur in the office of Pathmaster, it shall and may be lawful for the Councillor representing the ward in which such vacancy may take place, to appoint a proper person to the vacant office, whose power shall be the same as if appointed in open council.

And be it further enacted, that any contravention of this By-Law, by any party, or parties, shall be punishable by fine, or imprisonment, before any resident Magistrate of the Township, provided no fine be levied higher than five pounds, or less than five shillings currency.

Be it therefore enacted, by authority of the Municipal Council of the Township of London, that the Road and Bridge appropriations, for each and every year, shall be divided into five equal portions, and a portion granted for each ward in the township, to be expended under the direction of the Councillor representing each ward respectively-

And be it further enacted, that each Councillor shall keep a correct account of the different sums granted or expended by him in the ward which he represents, giving the names of the different parties to whom such money was paid, and also the locality where such sum was expended, which account shall be furnished to the Township Clerk, on or before the fifteenth day of October, in each and every year.

BY - LAW No. 23.

To levy Taxes on the Inhabitants of the Township of London, for the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty.

[PASSED APRIL 17, 1850.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to raise the sum of eight hundred pounds, from a tax on the rateable and assessed property of the inhabitants of the Township of London, for the improvement of Roads and Bridges, and other purposes, hereinafter specified.

Be it therefore enacted, by the authority of the Municipal Council of the Township of London, that the sum of Five Hundred Pounds shall be levied and raised, for the improvement of Roads and Bridges; and the sum of Two Hundred Pounds for the support of Common Schools, and a further sum of One Hundred Pounds for the payment of Salaries, and other incidental expenses of the current year, which sums shall be levied, raised, and collected (exclusive of the collector's per centage); and the county clerk is hereby authorised to apportion the sums of money above enumerated, on the rateable property of the inhabitants of the township aforesaid, according to the Assessment laws now in force in this Province, and to place such sums on the Collector's roll, for 1850, in the manner prescribed by law.
