



Short period stars are white or yellow. The "Algol" type give spectra of the Sirian type—prominence of the dark hydrogen lines and absence of metallic lines. Mr. F. McLean finds a striking similarity between the bright spectrum of a star named Eta in the constellation Argus, and the dark line spectrum of the Nova that blazed out in the constellation Pereus about a year ago, and the Nova that similarly appeared some years ago in Auriga. The size of orbit, class of spectrum and density of Algol system apparently indicate a comparatively early stage of development. Great interest, therefore, attaches to the study of "binary" or double systems, when considered in connection with the subject of the development of the stellar system.
