ST. PETERSBURG, June 29.—(Special.)—THE EMPEROR HAS ISSUED THE FOLLOWING URGENT ADDRESS TO THE RULING SENATE: "IN ORDER TO GUARANTEE PUBLIC SAFETY AND TO TERMINATE THE DISORDERS AT ODESSA AND NEIGHBORING LOCALITIES WE HAVE FOUND IT NECESSARY TO DECLARE A STATE OF WAR IN ODESSA AND DISTRICT, AND TO INVEST THE COMMANDER OF THE TROOPS IN THE MILITARY DISTRICT OF ODESSA WITH THE RIGHTS OF MILITARY AUTHORITY AND SPECIAL RIGHTS OF CIVIL ADMINISTRATION FOR THE DEFENSE OF ORDER AND PUBLIC TRANQUILITY."

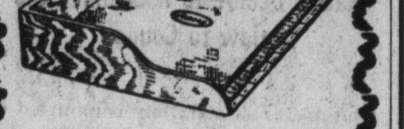
