

## MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING.

The Twenty-Eighth Annual Meeting of the Protestant Infants' Home was held in the Home, 508 Guy Street, on Wednesday, April 13th, 1898, at 3.30 p.m.

Among those present were His Lordship Bishop Bond, Rev. E. Bushell, Rev. E. M. Hill, Rev. F. M. Dewey, Rabbi Veld, Dr. A. W. Haldimand and J. H. Isaacson, Esq.

Letters of regret were received from the following:—Rev. Dean Carmichael, Rev. W. S. Barnes, Rev. Donald Grant, Rev. Dr. Evans, Rev. T. W. Winfield and Rev. Dr. Manly Benson.

His Lordship presided. The opening devotional exercises were conducted by Revs. E. McManus and J. Patterson.

The Chairman read the Secretary's report, Rev. E. Bushell presented the Treasurer's report, and Dr. A. W. Haldimand presented the Medical report. Rev. E. M. Hill moved the adoption of the several reports, and that they be printed and circulated, which was seconded by Rabbi Veld, and carried unanimously. It was moved by the Rev. F. M. Dewey, seconded by J. H. Isaacson, Esq., and carried, that the officers for the ensuing year be accepted. (List of names will be found on another page.)

The gentlemen present spoke very highly of the work as carried on by the Committee of Management, and expressed themselves as being heartily in accord with the projected addition of an Isolation Ward, which would tend to make the working of the Home easier and much more efficient. The Chairman extended an invitation to those present to remain after the Benediction was pronounced by the Rev. F. M. Dewey, and partake of light refreshments, which would be served in the dining-room.

The Lady Managers of the Protestant Infants' Home, in presenting their Twenty-Eighth Annual Report, do so in the hope that their many kind friends who have so generously contributed to the support of the Home will feel that the funds entrusted to the'r care have been disbursed in such manner as to ensure the most good being attained.

There has been very little to mark this from preceding years. We have had our successes and our discouragements, such as are sure to be encountered in carrying on a work like ours, but we struggle bravely on, hoping with the Divine blessing to overcome all difficulties. At the beginning of the year just closed there were 52 children in the Home; 109 have since been admitted, making a total of 161. Of this number 69 have been removed by parents or friends, 1 transferred to the Orphan Asylum (he having attained the age of 5 years), 30 have died, and 61 remain in the Home. Of the total number of children received into the Home during the year, 5 were the children of widowers, 7 of widows, 17 with mothers sick in hospital, 4 with mothers in the asylum for insane, 21 were the children of deserted wives, 2 the children of parents unable to provide for them, 9 with one or both parents drunkards, 3 foundlings, and 41 were illegitimate; 28 women have been received in the Home during the year, and there they are busily employed in attending and caring for the little ones placed in their charge. When they are able to leave the Home, the ladies endeavor to secure situations for them or enable them to reach their friends.

We have been obliged to close the Home at different times during the year when chicken pox, and then whooping cough, prevailed, consequently the number of children is not as large as it might otherwise be.

It is at such times that we feel the need of an addition or Isolation Ward, for we are so overcrowded that isolation in our present quarters is utterly impossible, and in spite of every precaution the contagion spreads, affecting at least half the children in the Home, if not the whole number. During these times the Home is closed to visitors and no applications received; then, too, many of the Lady Managers fear to visit the institution, lest they carry the infection home to their own little ones.

It is much to be regretted that in a city so well equipped with hospitals and public institutions of all kinds, that there is no place where we can send such minor diseases as whooping cough, measles and chicken pox. Such a building would not only benefit public institutions, but would be of great benefit to mothers of large families where complete isolation in their own homes is impossible. Last spring we felt that we must add such an extension to our present building, it would be most invaluable to us in more ways than one, for the new comers could then be isolated for the space of two weeks before joining the others in the main building, thus preventing in many cases the introduction of infection into the Home; but the lack of funds deterred us, and the more we considered the ways and means of raising the necessary amount, the fainter grew our hearts, until at last we laid the idea aside for one year. In the meantime we have appealed to the churches to assist us in getting up a large Fair to be held in October, from which we expect to realize quite a nice little sum, as we hope all our friends will help us in this undertaking. Then, Prof. Norman has kindly offered us part of the proceeds of an entertainment, "A Carnival of Nations," to be given by him in our behalf towards the end of April. We are certainly determined to have that addition erected this summer, borrowing the money for this purpose from our permanent fund, depending largely upon a generous public to assist us in paying it back. We are indebted to Mr. Maxwell, Architect, for our plans of the proposed addition, which he kindly prepared for us.

In October a "Klondike Tea" and sale of home-made cake and candy was held in the parlors of Emmanuel Church, at which we succeeded in raising the sum of sixty-one dollars. We now take the opportunity of again thanking the many kind friends who assisted us in any way at that entertainment. Through the summer we received the sums of \$4.61 and \$3.16, the results of two bazaars given by Miss Gladys MacLean and her little friends; the sum of \$4.07 was also received from Miss Elsie Clarke, of Smiths Falls, the proceeds of a bazaar held by her and her little friends.

Such evidences of the thoughtfulness of our little friends for their less fortunate brothers and sisters is a great source of pleasure to us in the carrying on of our work. We have also to record the

receipt of a most munificent gift of \$4,000.00 towards our permanent fund from Mrs. J. H. R. Molson, and that of \$1,000.00, less the Government tax of ten per cent., from the estate of late Robt. Anderson, Esq.; \$100.00 from Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, towards our proposed extension; and \$200.00 from estate Mrs. Davidson. Such gifts are indeed welcome, and always mark a bright era in our existence.

We regret that there are no adoptions to report this year; 129 have been adopted since the Home was first established.

The little ones were treated to an outing on all fine days during the past summer, picnicking in one of the fields on Cote des Neiges, kindly placed at our disposal by Mr. McCord. They also enjoyed two street car drives through the kindness of Miss Dow, who always contributes ten dollars for picnic money. Last summer we thought the car drives would be a greater source of pleasure, and so they proved to be, and many of the little ones were too excited to sleep the night preceding the drive, and the two hours and a-half they spent going through the principal thoroughfares of the city formed the chief topic of conversation for many days. Very happy they looked, both mothers and children, and I am sure if the walls could have spoken, they would have expressed wonder at the unusual silence, for every soul in the building was out and stowed away somewhere on the cars.

One motherless little one we sent to an aunt in England on the first trip of the "Parisian" last spring. She was entrusted to the care of a passenger, who delivered her safely to her aunt in Liverpool. She writes us that "little Lillie is a great source of pleasure to them, now that they are beginning to understand her," for at first they mistook her baby prattle for French which she was supposed to have learned during her stay in the Home.

We are sorry to report a decrease in our collections this year. Many of the ladies felt it impossible to go around soliciting help as formerly, so a lady collector was engaged, who has worked faithfully, but owing to business depression and other causes, our friends, who are always generous, found it impossible to subscribe as formerly, but we are still able to report a balance on hand sufficient to keep us until the fall, when the collector again starts forth to solicit the necessary funds to carry on the work.

We are indebted to several clergymen of different denominations for their attendance at the Home to hold services on Thursday evenings throughout the year, which have been a source of very great pleasure to the inmates. Our thanks are also tendered Mr. Peter Wood for Bible reading on Saturday evenings. The daily Family Prayer is conducted by the Matron.

The Committee regret very much that, owing to ill-health and

inability to attend, some of the members have resigned from the Board of Management.

During the year Mrs. Gec. Browne was elected to the Board of Managers. The Managers' Annual Meeting was held on April 6th, 1898. The following officers were elected for the ensuing year:—

Mrs. Van Allen, the Matron, and the Head Nurses are still fulfilling the duties pertaining to their respective positions with ability, gaining the approval of the Managers. The special thanks of the Managers are due and hereby tendered "The Ministering League" of St. James the Apostle, "The Good Samaritan Society" of the Church of the Messiah, "Willing Workers" of Stanley Street Presbyterian Church, "Ladies' Aid" of Erskine Church, "Ladies' Aid" of St. Paul's Church, "Dorcas Society" of the American Presbyterian Church, the "I. H. N. Society" and "Ladies' Aid" of St. Andrew's Church, for valuable donations of clothing, etc., received for the use of inmates; to the Medical Staff for their valuable services and advice so cheerfully given to promote the health and comfort of the inmates; to several of the clergy who have attended at the Home to administer the rites of baptism and conduct the burial service; to J. H. Isaacson, Esq., for a large amount of notarial work done gratuitously; to Messrs. Robertson, Fleet & Falconer for legal advice; to the Quebec Government for its annual grant; to the President and Directors of the City and District Savings Bank for their annual donation; to Messrs. R. A. Beckett & Co. for ice during the season; to the proprietors of the "Daily Witness" and "Gazette" for gratuitous advertising; to J. R. Dougall, Esq., for one copy of the "Daily Witness" throughout the year; to all who have sent donations during the year or have in any way contributed to the welfare and comfort of the inmates.

We cordially invite all interested in the work to visit the Home; it is open for inspection at all times.

The Board regrets that the death rate has been so high. This is partly due to a severe epidemic of measles which attacked the Inmates, cutting off many at the time, and weakening permanently many others, who subsequently succumbed to slighter ailments.

The Medical Board are glad to think that in the near future they will have at their command the inestimable advantages of an Isolation Ward, where children upon their entrance may be kept under observation for a few days, till it is positively assured that they have no disease lurking in the system. It is quite possible to admit a child apparently healthy, yet already in the incubation stage of some infectious disease. This ward will also be used for the isolation of any suspicious case of infectious disease in the Home until a definite diagnosis can be made. In an institution of this kind such a ward is an absolute necessity, and we trust a generous public may assist the ladies in this undertaking.

The Protestant Infants' Home has now been for many years one of the well-known institutions of our city. A glance at the names of the ladies who have been upon the directorate of the Home shews us that from its inception until the present day its affairs have been managed by those who, Dorcas-like, are best known amongst us for true charity and Christian work.

The Medical Board desire to thank the ladies for their hearty co-operation and kindness in carrying out any of their suggestions.

The Board would also take this opportunity of expressing their appreciation of the services of Mrs. Van Allan and her assistants, Mrs. Campbell. Miss Shaw and Miss Elliott.

### CONSTITUTION.

STATUTES OF QUEBEC: 34 VICTORIA, CAP. 56, 1870.

An Act to Incorporate the Protestant Infants' Home of Montreal.

[Assented to 24th of December, 1870.]

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter mentioned have by pettion, represented that they and others, for some years past, have maintained by voluntary contributions, a certain institution in the city of Montreal, known as "The Protestant Infants' Home," for the purpose of furnishing a home for children who may be deprived of their natural protectors, either by death, abandonment, or otherwise, and for the purpose of protecting such children from the effects of want and exposure to crime, and have prayed that for the better attainment of the objects of the said institution, the same may be vested with corporate powers: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:—

- 1. Mesdames Anna E. Workman, Maria Louisa Henshaw, Elizabeth Scott, Louisa B. Ferrier, Mary A. Godfrey, Annie Muir, A. L. Shaw, and L. M. Baylis and such other persons as may bereafter be associated with them in conformity with this act, and their successors, are hereby constituted and created a body corporate and politic, with all the rights incident to corporations, by the name of "The Protestant Infants' Home of Montreal."
- 2. The said Corporation shall have perpetual succession, and may have a common seal, with the power to change, alter, break or renew the same, when and as often as they may think proper, and may, under the said name, contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, prosecute and be prosecuted, in all courts and places whatsoever in this province, and by the same name they and their successors, from time to time, and at all times hereafter, shall be capable to have, take, receive, purchase, and acquire, hold, possess, enjoy and maintain to and for the use of the said Corporation, all lands, and property moveable and immoveable, which may hereafter be sold, ceded, exchanged, given, bequeathed or granted to the said Corporation, or to sell, hypothecate, alienate, convey, let or lease the same, if need be; provided always that such 'eal estate shall not exceed the annual value of five thousand dollars beyond that actually required for the use of the said Corporation, provided also, that if the said Corporation shall become possessed of real estate exceeding the annual value of five thousand dollars, apart from that actually used by the said Corporation, it shall be bound to sell such surplus proserty within five years from the acquisition of the same and invest the proceeds thereof in public securities of the Dominion stocks of chartered

banks, mortgages and other approved securities, for the use of the said Corporation.

3. The officers of the said Corporation shall consist of a President, Secretary, Treasurer, and a Committee of Management of not less than ten members, and such other officers as shall, from time to time, seem necessary to the Corporation. The foregoing officers shall be chosen from among the riembers of the Institution, and the President, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be ex-officio members of the said Committee.

4. The said Corporation shall have power to form a code of by-laws, not inconsistent with the laws of this Province or of the Dominion, for fixing the terms of admission of its members, for the government of the same, for the election, changing and altering the officers above named, and for the general regulation and management of its officers, which code when formed and adopted at a regular meeting shall, until modified or rescinded, be equally binding as this act upon the Institution, its officers and its members.

5. The by-laws of the said Institution, not being contrary to law, shall be the by-laws of the Corporation hereby constituted, until they shall be repealed or altered as aforesaid.

6. Until others shall be elected according to the by-laws of the Corporation the present officers of the Institution are those of the Corporation.

7. The said Corporation may send out to service or bind or apprentice thereto, or to any healthy trade or business, until the age of sixteen, all children, and may send out to be nursed, supported, educated or adopted, all children having the protection of the said Corporation to, by, or with such person or persons and upon such terms as to the officers may seem fit and proper, and for such purposes and on behalf of and for such children and themselves, may enter into and make with any person or persons with whom such children may be placed, articles of apprenticeship or agreement, and such articles may be enforced by action of law.

8. The said Corporation shall be bound to make annual reports to the Legislature, containing a general statement of the affairs of the Corporation, which said reports shall be presented within the first twenty days of every session of the Legislature.

## BY-LAWS OF THE CORPORATION.

Preamble:—The aim and object of the "Protestant Infants' Home of Montreal" are to receive the children of Protestant parentage who, in consequence of sickness, poverty or intemperance, are unable to provide suitable nourishment and care for their offspring in their own homes, homeless, motherless, fatherless, destitute infants, and foundlings under four

years of age and by giving them proper food, good care and attention, endeavour to save, if possible their lives.

Also to receive Protestant mothers with their new-born infants, and by providing a refuge and place of safety, the mothers may, by nursing and caring for their innocent babes (disowned and abandoned by their inhuman fathers), give their offspring a "good chance for life."

#### ARTICLE I.

The Board of Management shall consist of not less than twenty ladies, who shall annually contribute three or more dollars to the funds of this Institution. The officers shall be a President, 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall discharge the duties usually pertaining to their respective offices and shall be annually elected.

#### ARTICLE II

The Managers' Business Meeting shall be held on Wednesday of each week.

The Managers' Annual Meeting shall be held on the first Wednesday in April.

The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the second Wednesday in April.

Special meetings may be called at the request of two officers or any five Managers.

ARTICLE III.

All meetings shall be opened with prayer.

ARTICLE IV

The financial year shall close on the 31st March.

ARTICLE V.

Seven members, including one officer, shall constitute a quorum.

#### ARTICLE VI.

The Managers shall appoint a Medical Board, which shall consist of two consulting and four attending physicians, and one oculist and aurist. The Medical Staff shall make rules for themselves and department not inconsistent with the rules of the Board of Management.

#### ARTICLE VII.

Legal Counsel and a Notary shall also be elected at the Annual Meeting.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

These By-laws may be altered or amended by a vote of two thirds of the members present at a meeting, provided two weeks' notice be given of any contemplated amendment.

The By-laws were amended and altered and the foregoing adopted at a meeting held on March 7th, 1894.

By-law Article I. was altered at a meeting held March 13th, 1895.

## RULES RELATING TO THE ADMISSION OF CHILDREN TO THE PROTESTANT INFANTS' HOME.

ist. No child admitted under ten days old or over four years old.

2nd. No child admitted with contagious, incurable or other diseases.

3rd. Each child must bring a medical contificate from one of the attending physicians, and in the case of a new-born infant, the mother must also bring one.

4th. Clothing will be provided by the Institution.

5th. The charge for children's board shall be in proportion to the parents' wages; when entirely dependent on charity, and not visited by parents or friends, shall be held for adoption.

6th. Persons wishing to place children in the Home must bring written testimonials, from a clergyman or some responsible person, that the parents are Protestants.

7th. Infants will not be admitted without their mothers, except in special cases, to be decided by the committee, and the nursing mother must remain as long as the committee deem necessary.

8th. No woman will be admitted, when it is known, who is a mother for the second time of an illegitimate child.
