# SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

### FIRST DAY.

The Twentieth Annual Synod of the Diocese of Montreal met on Tuesday, the 17th of June, 1879.

Divine Service was held in the Cathedral at nine o'clock; Holy Communion at half-past ten. The sermon was preached by Rev. Canon Ellegood.

The Session was opened with prayer by the Bishop.

The Rolls were called by the secretaries.

It was moved by Rev. J. C. Davidson, seconded by Rev. Canon Baldwin:

That Rev. J. Empson be re-elected Clerical Secretary.—Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Geo. Macrae, Q.C., seconded by the Chancellor:

That Dr. Nelson be re-elected Lay Secretary.—Carried.

It was moved by Canon Norman, seconded by Dr. Scott: That Mr. C. J. Brydges be re-elected Treasurer.—Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. GAULT, That Messrs. T. Simpson, and M. H. Sanborn be re-elected auditors.—Carried.

His LORDSHIP named Mr. E. CARTER, Q. C., Church Advocate.

The minutes of last Annual Synod as printed in the Journal of that session, were considered as read, and adopted.

The Bishop named the several Standing Committees, as printed on pp. 8-10.

His Lordship then read the following address:

DEAR BRETHERN OF THE CLERGY AND LAITY:—

I am conscious that the first words I speak from this position to the assembly now before me, ought to have personal allusion to my honored predecessors as well as to myself. Bear with me for a few moments while I try to acquit myself of my duty in this respect. The task is a difficult one, and I approach it with diffidence. I am called, in the providence of God and by your voice, to build on other men's foundation, and a consideration of the work already done must naturally precede the plan and promise of my own Episcopate. The wise administration of the Right Rev. Francis Fulford, Lord Bishop of Montreal, afterwards Metropolitan of Canada, laid the first stones of the structure with precision and forethought. By him and by the Church under his guidance, our synodical action and missionary organization were inaugurated. When you review the work accomplished in the first ten years of the existence of our Synod, which were also the last ten years of the life of that revered Bishop, you must be struck with the clearness and simplicity of the outline, the forethought evinced by the laws and regulations laid down for the government of its members, and the elasticity and expansiveness of their structure. I desire at the outset of my work to take advantage of these last characteristics, and aim at progress, rather than change. It seems to me that we have nearly all we need for careful and exact administration in things pertaining to the temporalities of our Church; it chiefly remains for us to ascertain the true spirit of those early canons and by-laws, and expand, and advance, as occasion may require and experience dictate. In so doing I shall but carry on one step further the action of our late Bishop, the most Rev. Ashton Oxenden, Metropolitan of Canada, whose piety and learning, and devotion to the interests of the Church, are fresh in the memories of all here present. Under his watchful and experienced administration we made great advance in method and order. His long service in the mother Church, both in parish work and as member of Convocation, enabled him to speak and act with authority, even while a stranger to our local peculiarities and circumstances. We learned from him the habit of carrying on our deliberations with Christian dignity and forbearance, and under his fostering care our missions specially, and our charitable institutions generally, grew luxuriantly, to proportions beyond the most sanguine expectation of those who had seen the initiation of Synodical existence. Our beloved Bishop came to us in the year 1869, about the time when a wave of prosperity, such as periodically visits our city and country, began to rise, affecting favorably the business and fortunes of our citizens, and consequently the resources of our Church. The Bishop took advantage

of this providential circumstance, and by his personal exertion (aided by some here present) added materially to a fund which bids fair to be the mainstay of our mission work—"the Diocesan Sustentation Fund He also stimulated by his personal labor and liberality, the growth and progress of our city congregations, as well as the institution and maintenance of a variety of beneficial projects calculated to strengthen and adorn the Church at large. But the fluctuating character of our prosperity has brought us, in the present, to comparatively evil days. The tide has receded, leaving bare and unsightly some places which so lately were smiling and fair to look upon. Has time, therefore, been lost, or has the labor of sowing on the waters been bestowed in vain? Surely not, even where the receding waters have left little or no visible life. There surely is hidden seed waiting only favorable conditions to germinate and grow. wisdom and Christian philosophy is to do what we can to-day, according to the will of God, and looking for His blessing.

Still, such hasty survey as I have been able to make since my Consecration has disclosed a state of affairs in the Diocese which calls for immediate attention. My desire is, on the one hand, to lose none of the ground already occupied, and on the other, to keep within our income. These objects are continually pressing on my thoughts and are somewhat complicated by the knowledge that the stipends of several of our clergy are sadly below the standard we have adopted. I shall offer such suggestions as have occurred to me, trusting that you will either assist me to carry them into effect, or, after discussion, to modify and amend them. I will state, as briefly as possible, what I think may be done to alleviate the present uncertainty and instability of our mission work, considered in its financial aspect. It seems to me, first, that our missions should be classified, say, into new or tentative missions, progressive missions, and permanent missions. Tentative missions would be those planted on new ground and would require assurance of help for a term of years, that is three or four years; at the end of the term they should be inspected, and continued or closed as results might warrant. Progressive missions would be those going steadily forward towards self-sustentation; and permanent missions would be those which, from local circumstances, must always be dependent upon the general fund. There are districts in the country less fertile and, of necessity, poorer than others. These are occupied by our lay brethren, doing good and useful work, but never becoming rich. They have as much need of church services as the more wealthy, and are at least as likely to profit by them. And then I would recommend a classification of funds at our disposal, and they might be divided into fluctuating and permanent. In the "fluctuating" I would include the grant from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel and the annual subscriptions

to the Mission fund; in the "permanent" the Diocesan Sustentation fund and the Clergy Trust fund. The permanent and pioneer missions would naturally depend on the permanent fund, and the progressive and exceptional missions on our uncertain resources. It is a trial to me at the outset of my Episcopate to find attention so entirely engrossed by finance, but since that seems to be the pressing need of the moment, I give it attention, and hope from it to proceed in due time to the more congenial duties of my office. I know that our clergy must be properly provided for or they cannot retain their cures. It is not uncommon to instance Henry Martyn, Patterson and others whose names are found among the noble army of martyrs, and to argue that, as they endured hardships as good soldiers of Christ amongst the heathen, we may not unreasonably expect our missionaries to fulfil their calling and bear the lesser evils of poverty in a civilized and Christian country. Our clergy do not complain of poverty. Their difficulty is a moral one. They cannot live free from debt. In a large number of cases their stipends are insufficent to secure them the necessaries of life. Debt is, therefore, inevitable if they remain at their posts. The good men whom I have just named were not obliged to move from place to place in the hope of raising in new quarters, the money which failed them in the old. They were free from such sordid cares. Had it been otherwise, they could not have devoted themselves to the preaching of the Gospel. The human mind cannot bear so much of pressure, and our clergy, if the ways and means for procuring food and clothing is made to occupy them continually, must find that it is to the detriment of their work. Already some of our older and experienced clergy have thought of leaving the Diocese from sheer inability to live honestly on the scanty income provided. We must make an effort to retain our most efficient clergy, and to do so, we must place them in a position of respectability and peace of mind. In certain of our mission fields a redistribution of work may be necessary. In the Ottawa Valley depression in the lumber business has caused a considerable emigration, and in all the country parts of the Diocese low prices for commodities produced, have brought about a scarcity of money, for a while at least. The clergy, working in such districts, will need liberal support from the Mission fund, and, perhaps, a temporary enlargement of the district watched over; but, I think, there is an inconvenience in our present habit of attaching a grant to a mission, and leaving it so attached during vacancy. In the report of the Executive Committee (20th Journal of Synod), for example, there are six vacant missions named as receiving grants from the Mission fund. These missions get an idea from this (which is not easy to displace), that they have a right to these grants, and thereby any local change is rendered very difficult, however necessary it may be for the general good of the Church. my judgment, when a mission is vacant, its grant should lapse, and the question of its status be reconsidered; and on the appointment of an Incumbent, the grant should be renewed or remodelled as circumstances may require; because, if the whole sum estimated by the Treasurer as available for missionary purposes be irrevocably appropriated by a vote of Synod at the beginning of the financial year, an investigation into the needs of the missions becomes almost futile; the question is already settled. A portion of the original grant should be available for the maintenance of public worship within the mission during the vaa cancy, and the remainder be at the disposal of the Executive Committee. It has occurred to me, when attending meetings held in the country for missionary purposes, that much good might ensue if practical and local questions touching self-support were discussed at such times somewhat more freely, and that if the missionary in charge thought outside aid beneficial, he might avail himself to that end, of the presence of the Bishop, which, I hope, may be once in each year. What we need most to assist us in doing our best in all this matter, is more ex act reports from the clergy and church wardens than are now rendered. Just where accurate statistics are greatly wanted, there we fail to receive them. It may be that our printed forms require to be revised. What we want to know, especially, is the number of families really adhering to the Church, and the whole sum raised in each mission for church purposes. The returns made at the Easter vestries should coincide with the report furnished to the officers of the Synod. At present the returns are almost useless, and the great expense of printing them wasted.

We must not lose sight of the important distinction between missions and rectories. In the report of the Committee on this subject, adopted at the fourth meeting of Synod (p. 25), I find the following :- "That the ministrations of a mission should extend, as much as possible, over an extent of country. That, as each station prospers and is able to increase its help, an assistant should be added, and then it should be gradually formed into a parish and a mission. All missionaries should feel it their duty to distribute their services as much as possible, subservient to the best interests of the Church in their respective localities." Our missionaries have certainly not lost sight of this duty. During the past year they have worked with extraordinary zeal, patience and self-denial, covering an immense extent of ground by their labours; but the occasional service is never graciously received by a neighbourhood which has at any former time enjoyed the privileges of a resident pastor. The withdrawal of extraneous aid is resented, and the clergyman naturally suffers. In such cases his services are but poorly (if at all) remunerated, and the people among whom he resides necessarily regard his frequent absence as so much time of which they are deprived, and contract any former liberality they may have shown.

Thus it happens that the more work a missionary undertakes, under present regulations, the greater straits he is likely to fall into. Our rectories require the gravest attention, both in country and in city. The power of the Bishop is here very limited, and such powers as he actually posesses have fallen practically into disuse from, I think, misapprehension of our canons and other causes about to be mentioned. Some of the rectories, for example, have attached only nominal stipends, dependent in a great measure on the popularity of the incumbent. When a rectory is vacant and pending the election of a Rector, it often happens that a passing clergyman takes charge of the parish; he serves at first perhaps without any definite position, but (invited by the people to work up the Church) a license is sought from the Bishop. In due time his name comes in formally as elected to the cure; he has some show of claim, and is, moreover, willing to accept the indefinite terms offered to him. But a stranger to the place and its ultimate capabilities, the hoped-for monetary improvement never comes, and after two or three years at most, he leaves, only to make room for another to repeat the experiment. This competition on the ground of stipend with our regular clergy seems to me to work badly. The rectories should be amongst our most desirable cures, the rewards of evident merit and long service, and not places where the clerical office is cheapened and the Bishop embarrassed. In the canons (A. D. 1603) of the Church of England it stands: "That every person admitted to be either a Deacon or Priest, must first have some certain place where he might use his functions;" and further, "if any Bishop shall admit any person into the ministry that hath none of these titles as is aforesaid then he shall keep and maintain him with all things necessary till he do prefer him to some ecclesiastical living." I am aware that we are not bound by the canons of the Mother Church, but the spirit of so just a provision commends itself to the judgment of all, and confirms me in my determination to admit none to the ministry who have not a reasonable expectation of respectable maintenance, and to receive none (so far as depends upon me), who are likely to burden the already crippled resources of the Church, or to interfere with the promotion and well-being of the clergy now serving in the Diocese. The Church Temp. Act 19 requires that the Bishop shall be satisfied, that in every rectory due provision is made for the maintenance of a suitable place of worship and for an incumbent. The canon on Status of Parishes, &c., further requires that an endowment of not less than \$4,000 shall be raised before a parish or mission can claim the right of choice in the appointment of a pastor, and that the clergyman must be in Priest's orders. These provisions seem quite reasonable, and (without enquiring too closely why they have not hitherto been acted upon), it seems advisable to work towards that end without delay. The case of

Trinity church in this city is causing me great anx iety, because of the threatened loss of the present building, and, with it, the munificent gift to the Church of the late Major Christie. I shall be glad of your advice in the matter, which is very urgent, as the 2d of July has been appointed for the sale of the building.

In order to do all within my power to improve the condition of the existing staff of clergy, I have hitherto refused ordination to candidates for the diaconate, and have encouraged our own deacons to come forward for Priest's orders. Where our clergy undertake larger fields of duty than those originally committed to them, either because the services are distributed or the population has decreased in number, a substantial recognition of such work ought to be made. The Rural Dean of St. Andrews, for example, calls my attention to extra service given in the Upper Ottawa district, for a period of more than nine months, by the Rev. W. H. Naylor, whereby congregations have been kept together and the sick visited, as occasion required. It might be better, of course, to send another clergyman, and we may look for some improvement by means of re-distribution of work; but at best, some of the cures must be enlarged, because the funds at our disposal do not admit of the support of more clergy than those now laboring amongst us. I have cited Mr. Naylor's case, because, perhaps, it is one of the most striking, but is by no means singular. A great deal of such work has been done during the past winter to my own knowledge, and very little, if any of it, been paid for.

I am sure that you all unite with me in gratitude to Almighty God, for that, in answer to our prayers, He has so blessed our efforts to relieve the mission fund of debt, that a small balance now stands to its credit, and I would here acknowledge our obligation to those gentlemen who, at much sacrifice of most valuable time, succeeded in obtaining such large contributions to the fund. Still, before we are at liberty to enlarge or extend our grants we must do justly, and pay those debts due to the missionary clergy, who have been serving for less than a maintenance: and in making this acknowledgment, I allow with feelings of shame, that the equilibrium has been restored in part at the expense of the poorest and hardest worked of our clergy. Not only so, our failure to pay the promised grants, I mean especially the supplemental grants. in full, has tended rather to reduce than enlarge the contributions by the people. It is our imperative duty to watch, both in Synod and in committee, against the repetition of an expenditure which led to so grievous a wrong. One thing is clear to me, there must be no further church extension until our resources show the prospect of a sufficient surplus. We must not administer a fund which has only a prospective existence, nor leave debts for future years to pay. The Church in Montreal is supported on the voluntary system, that is by the gifts of the people, year by year. In times of commercial depression, of gentel mid beset from along and or had avoid

eral sickness, of scarcity or famine, these gifts of necessity fall short; in times of prosperity, or even of freedom from calamity, constant additions should be made to the Sustentation fund, which seems to me to be of all our institutions the one best calculated to support us in emergencies. Parochial endowments are valuable, but as they are local in their application and liable to local contingencies, they should be raised locally and not by contributions from Church members at large. And, besides, if we wish to keep up the efficiency of our staff of clergy, we must have a Superannuation fund with such means as will enable the Church to permit clergymen who are incapacitated for further toil to retire from active duty with a suitable provision for their support.

The Theological College in this city has been conducted by the Rev. Canon Henderson, the Principal, with marked success. There are now ten students. Several of the clergy and professors of the city have consented to give lectures to the students on various subjects during the coming session. I earnestly hope that this College, which furnished the Church with so many missionaries to the satisfaction of my beloved predecessor, Bishop Oxenden, will receive adequate support in the time to come. Bishop Oxenden's testimony is very strong. On four successive occasions he repeated his conviction that the College was an absolute necessity, and renewed his thankfulness for the relief which it afforded him in providing a supply of men duly qualified and properly trained for the ministry of the Church; and my own experience leads me to adopt most fully all that he then said on the subject; in his own words, "It is one of the most useful organizations which has ever been introduced into the Diocese."—(Synod Report, XV Session).

Since my consecration in January, I have used all diligence in the visitation of the Diocese. I hope in the future to be able to send such notice of my coming, that Incumbents will be able duly to prepare candidates for confirmation, and be otherwise in such readiness that there shall be no loss of time or other hindrance. If God should continue to me the blessings of health and strength, I will endeavor to go throughout the Diocese every year; but in order to effect this, I must avoid travelling twice over the same ground. It is not too much to ask a Church to receive the Bishop in its appointed turn; there is no reason why such a visit should interrupt the usual course of events. It is even desirable that the chief pastor should see the flock under its ordinary conditions. I have been able so far to visit 56 parishes. I have held 28 confirmations and confirmed 387 persons. One church and two burial grounds have been consecrated. Four deacons have been admitted to the Priesthood, and I have presided at a number of missionary meetings in the country and in the city.

During the year two missionaries have passed away at a good old age. The Rev. J. Jones was in his ninety-second year. I visited him a few days before his death, and found him bright in intellect and, to use his

own words, "waiting for the Master." The Rev. F. S. Neve was about 75; his death was as calm and peaceful as any I have witnessed, and was probably hastened by his anxiety to perform some clerical duties which had been undertaken by him.

There is one subject yet on my mind to which I must refer before closing. I feel constantly the great need on the part of the clergy for opportunities of regular intercourse and of conference on matters pertaining to the spiritual functions of their office. It will be an evil day for the Church when secular work supercedes in the minds of the clergy the legitimate occupations of "prayer and the ministry of the Word." It is necessary especially that our younger clergy, too frequently sent to distant and isolated cures, should return from time to time to the centres of Church life, and, by conference and companionship, receive that advice and encouragement which stimulate to exertion and improvement, and which will make them in time valuable and experienced servants of Christ. It was thought necessary that a Paul and Barnabas should return to the Church which had sent them forth and rehearse all that God had done with them; and in after years when St. Paul had become a father and leader amongst the Apostles, he did not fail to report himself to St. James and the Elders at Jerusalem, and the topics under discussion on the occasion of such meetings, were the triumphs of the Gospel, and matters of doctrine and discipline. Legislation is most necessary, but it is not the life and heart of the Church. The Spirit of God abiding in us is our life, and communion and intercourse in religious matters, are to the clergy most essential means of grace. An annual meeting of the clergy for one week in the year in the city would, I believe, tend to advance their spiritual health and well-being, and I am inclined to think that that week should include one Sunday. The loss to the country churches would be more than compensated by the freshness of the pastor on his return.

I now commend you to the guidance of the Great Head of the Church; without His Spirit assisting, our wisdom is but vanity. "Except the Lord build the house, their labour is but lost that build it. Except the Lord keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain."

By permission of the House the Rev. H. W. Nye withdrew the following motion of which he had given notice:

That the 1st Article of the Rule or By-Law relating to the Executive Committee be amended, by striking out the words after "of," from "15" to "Synod" inclusive, and substituting the following: "16 Clerical and 16 Lay members, of whom 8 of each order shall be appointed by the Lord Bishop, and the remainder elected by ballot of the Synod, at its annual stated meetings."

The CHANCELLOR moved, seconded by Mr. Leo. H. DAVIDSON:

Whereas doubts have been entertained as to the right of the widows and orphans of deceased clergymen elected to the office of Bishop of the Diocese, to participate in the "Widows and Orphans Fund" of this Diocese, it is hereby declared and enacted, that according to the true intent and meaning of the By-Laws regarding said Fund, the widow and orphans of any clergyman of this Diocese who would have a right to participate in such Fund in the case of the death of such clergyman, have not been and shall not be deprived of such right by reason of the election and appointment of such clergyman to the office of Bishop of this Diocese, and that such widow and orphans shall have the right to participate in such Fund, on the death of such Bishop, provided he be not in arrears and continue to remit to the Treasurer the annual contribution of five dollars up to the time of his death.—Carried.

Rev. Canon Evans moved, seconded by DeGruchy:

The confirmation of the Report of the Committee on Superannuation as adopted by the Synod at its Eighteenth Annual Session.

Moved in amendment, by Rev. T. W. Mussen, seconded by Rev. J. B. Davidson:

That the Report of the Superannuation Fund Committee be not now confirmed, and that the whole matter be referred back to the Committee with enlarged numbers for reconsideration.—Carried.

It was decided that the ballots be taken to-morrow as follows:

That the Executive Committee to be elected be instructed to adhere as closely as practicable to the grants as proposed in the report submitted to the Synod, but that they may divert grants, increasing some and diminishing others if it is deemed desirable, and that they be further empowered to dispose of the anticipated and unappropriated surplus of \$385; but that the total expenditure be limited to \$12,000 the sum expected to be raised by the Treasurer.—Lost.

Mr. Davidson withdrew his motion on the understanding that the case of Potton be re-considered by the Executive Committee.

It was agreed that the words "and reductions in expenditure" be inserted in the 5th line of the Report of the Special Committee, on page 2, after the word "collections;" that the second column of the tabular form on page 4 be taken out; and that words "by each station," be printed as part of the headings of columns 3 and 4.

With these changes, the Treasurer's motion for the adoption of the Report, was put and carried.

Mr. Thomas, moved a suspension of the rules of order to introduce the following motion.—Carried.

Mr. Thomas moved, seconded by Archdeacon Lonsdell:

That should there be any surplus at the disposal of the Mission Fund, the same shall be rateably divided amongst the clergy, whose incomes have been diminished in the past year to meet the necessities of the Fund, until they have been fully reimbursed.—Carried.

By permission of the House, Canon Evans gave notice of motion.

Canon Norman moved, seconded by Rev. J. B. Davidson, That the Report of the Committee on Education be adopted.—Carried. Canon Norman moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas:

That Report of the Committee on Music be adopted.—Carried.

Rev. R. Liebsay moved, seconded by Rev. J. C. Davidson: That the Report of the Committee on Works of Mercy\* be adopted; and the Synod respectfully request the Bishop to recommend the Ladies' Aid Association to consider how far that Association could aid in carrying out the three objects mentioned in the Report of this Committee, and if a conference could be held between the office-bearers of that Association and the members of this Committee, the Bishop also being present.—Carried.

Rev. J. Empson moved the adoption of the Report of Committee of Conference on Diocese of Algoma, seconded by Dr. Nelson, (see page 71).—Carried.

It was moved by Rev. T. W. Mussen, seconded by Rev. J. B. Davidson:

"That the alterations in the wording of Arts. 2 and 5 of the Constitution, as found in resolution passed at the last session of Synod and recorded on page 24 of the Report of the Minutes of that Synod be confirmed."—Carried unanimously.

The following is the change confirmed by this resolution:

That in Art. 2 of the Constitution of this Synod the words "of at least one year's standing" be expunged, and the following words be inserted instead—"during the year preceding the election," and that the form of certificate in Art. 5 be altered so as to be brought into accordance with the change, the words of "one year's standing" being removed and replaced by the words "during the year preceding his election."

The Rev. F. H. CLAYTON moved:

That this Synod shall meet once in two years, instead of annually as at present.

On motion by Rev. J. B. Davidson the Synod adjourned till two o'clock.

Secondly, as regards congregations entitled to lay representation in this Synod, that such congregations shall own a church edifice, to all intents and purposes.

By permission the following was substituted and carried: That a Committee be appointed to consider the subject of Vestries in Free Churches, and the subject of lay representation by congregations not owning a church edifice, and to report at next meeting of Synod.

The Bishop named the following Committee: The Chancellor, Rev. F. H. Clayton, Archdeacon Lindsay, Rev. E. Wood, Messrs. L. H. Davidson, Rev. T. W. Mussen, A. Borrowman.

The Bishop named the scrutineers of ballot for the Provincial Synod:—For clerical vote, Rev. F. Robinson, J. P. Dumoulin, and R. Ker. For Lay vote, Dr. Scott, Mr. Borrowman and Professor Darey.

Rev. W. Craig moved, seconded by Rev. W. L. MILLS: That the Bishop be respectfully requested to appoint a Committee who shall take into consideration that part of His Lordship's address referring to the obtaining of fuller statistics from parishes, and report to the Executive Committee.—Carried.

Archdeacon Lonsdell, Rev. G. C. Robinson, T. W. Mussen, James Fulton, W. Craig, W. L. Mills, were named by his Lordship in accordance with this request.

The ballot for Diocesan Court was then taken, the Bishop having named as scrutineers Rev. P. DeGruchy and W. J. Dart for the clerical vote, and Messrs. H. Bulmer and Chas. Gibb for the lay vote.

### THIRD DAY.

Morning prayer in the Cathedral at 9'oclock. The Synod re-assembled at 10 o'clock.

After prayer by the Bishop, Rev. H. H. Waters of New Orleans and Canon O'Meara of St. John's College, Winnipeg, were invited to seats in the House.

The minutes of yesterday's meeting were read.

Moved by Mr. L. H. Davidson, seconded by Mr. G. MACRAE:

That the minutes now read be not confirmed, but that the motion of C. J. Brydges, Esq., seconded by T. White, Esq., in the words following: "That the Synod proceed to the next order of the day" be struck from said minutes, as being illegal-and contrary to the express rules of this House, to wit: Rule 16 of the Rules for the Preservation of Ordersaid resolution being neither a motion "to amend" the question under debate nor "to postpone it to a certain day," nor "to lay it on the table," nor " for adjournment."

A point of order was raised by Mr. Thomas White, that the correctness or incorrectness of the Minutes was the question. In this he was sustained by the Bishop, and the Minutes were declared correct and were signed by the Bishop.

The Committee named by the Bishop on Rev. J. B. Davidson's motion, page 26, Rev. J. B. Davidson (convener), F. H. Clayton, Canon Evans, Messrs. C. Garth and J. Hutton.

Rev. H. W. Nye presented a report of Committee on the publication of sales at church doors (see page 73), and gave notice of motion. Canon Baldwin, Dr. Sullivan, Rev. H. W. Nye, Archdeacon Lindsay handed in notices of motion.

Mr. L. H. Davidson rose to a question of privilege and submitted to the Chair, that having yesterday submitted to the House a motion in regard to the Metropolitical Title and Dignity, which motion was submitted to the House and discussed in part, and an amendment thereto was made by Geo. Macrae, Esq., Q. C., and that neither said motion nor said amendment was decided or disposed of by this House in accordance with Rule 16 of the Rules of this House for the Preservation of Order, and, as a member of this House, Mr. Davidson claimed his privilege to have the motion made

# REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO THE TWEN-TIETH SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

The Executive Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal, beg to submit to the Synod at its annual meeting in 1879, the following report of its proceedings during the past year.

Stated meetings were held in August, November, February and May; an adjourned meeting was held on the 9th instant; and there was one special meeting held on the last day of Synod, 20th June, at which were named the several sub-committees, as printed on p. 10, Journal

#### GRANTS.

Warden and South Ely.—The grant of \$100 to South Ely, now joined to Warden, and served by the Missionary there, was added to the grant to Warden, the united Mission to receive \$350.

Brome.—The grant to this Mission was increased by \$50.

Lacolle.—A grant of \$150 was made to this Parish.

Rev. E. J. Houghton-\$50 of the Iron Hill grant, were paid to Mr. Houghton as part remuneration for services there; and application has been made to the Parish for a further sum of \$50 to be paid him.

Mr. Thomas Evans, Catechist at North Gore. A grant of \$100 was made, subject to the approval of Synod.

S. P. G. The Society for the Propagation of the Cospel in Foreign parts, has given notice of a probable reduction in their grant to this Diocese The Secretary writes: "The claims from the rapidly "opening Mission Fields in the East, impel the Society to as rapid a " reduction of the grants made to old and settled Dioceses as is com-" patible with justice and security, and I fear you must prepare " yourselves in Montreal for annual reductions until the whole grant " comes to an end."

During the past year the Mission Fund has never been without a heavy balance against it, as shown by the following table, which is taken from the Treasurer's quarterly statements to this Committee:—

At the August meeting, 1878, there was a deficit of \$4,516 11

" November " " " 5,604 64
" February 1879, " " 6,603 97
" May " " " 5,033 42

The cost to the Mission Fund in the item of interest on this balance is \$308.19.

At the meeting in November it was resolved:—"That as soon as the Diocese is properly constituted, the Bishop be requested to appoint a committee, to consider with his Lordship the best means of increasing the funds for Missionary work; the arangements in regard to all the Missions; and the earliest possible augmentation of the salaries paid to the clergy in the different Missions retained."

This committee were requested to suggest some form of an agreement to be made with the congregation upon the appointment of a clergyman to any Parish or Mission.

The following committee was named: The Bishop, Canon Baldwin Mr. Brydges, Mr. L. H. Davidson, Archdeacon Lindsay, Rev. R. Lindsay, Mr. F. W. Thomas, the Chancellor, Rev. G. C. Robinson, Archdeacon Lonsdell, Mr. Hutton, Mr. Dawson, Rev. J. Fulton, Rev. T. W. Mussen, being the same committee as that named last year (p. 31, 19th Synod Report,) with the addition of the Rural Deans.

On the 9th June instant, this Committee made the following Report, which was adopted:—

"They have had several meetings upon the subject, but they could not come to any final decision until the accounts for the year ending 31st May were completed. These accounts were submitted at the meeting held this day; and it appeared that the collections and reductions in expenditure had enabled the debt which existed at the beginning of the year to be entirely cleared off, and to leave a balance of \$99 at the credit of the Mission Fund account on the 1st June."

"The Treasurer submitted an estimate based upon last year's statements of what he considered it would be possible to apply for salaries of the clergy, from which it appeared that the sum of \$12,000 would be available for this purpose.

"The Committee went carefully over the list of the revised grants as printed at page 37 of the last (No. 19) Synod report, and dealt with each case.

"They now beg to submit the following list of salaries which they recommend should be attached to the different Missions—both those which are vacant and those where a clergyman is now at work.

"The vacant Missions have been placed on the inside column.

The sum of \$7,000 has been invested on mortgage at 7 per cent. There is a charge of 6c; for discount on American bills, which leaves a balance in hand of \$4,682.14 available for investment. There is a sum of \$142.50 due for interest, but which has not yet been collected.

The total amount invested on account of this fund is \$46,686.00, being an increase of \$2,000 over the previous year.

No. 3 (Sustentation Fund—Capital Account) shewed a balance on hand according to the previous report of \$397.94.

The sum of \$7,866.76—has been invested in mortgage—and \$2.00 has been paid for collector's commission, leaving a balance of \$3,627.18 waiting for investment.

The amount invested on this account is \$64,866.76, being an increase of \$1,866.76. The amount of local endowments included in this fund has increased during the year by \$2,968—the total amount now being \$13,228.

No. 4 (Superannuation Fund Account) commenced the year with a balance at its credit of \$673.86. The subscriptions amounted to \$260—Collections, \$202.44—Interest on loans, \$163.29—making a total amount at the credit of this fund, waiting for investment, of \$1,299.59.

No investments have been made on account of this fund during the year. There is an amount, \$37.50, overdue for interest. The subscriptions from clergymen are less than for the previous year, and this fund cannot be considered in a satisfactory state.

No. 5 (Mission Fund Account) was in debt at the close of last year to the extent of \$3,344.74.

\$3,537.80 against \$3,838.71, or a decrease of \$300.91. The balance received from the Clergy Trust Fund amounted to \$1,829.80 against \$1,888.34, or a decrease of \$58.54.

These decreases in the amount of interest arise from the fact that mortgages have been repaid, and are waiting for re-investment. In the case of the Sustentation Fund also, there is an amount of interest overdue.

The general expenses, including salaries, printing, advertising, repairs, taxes, and all incidental charges, amounted to \$2,250.74 against \$2,782.06, or a decrease of \$531.32.

The interest paid on the Synod building (\$596.32) was the same as for the previous year.

The amount of rent received for the Synon Hall was \$845, against \$560 the previous year.

The amounts paid for special grants and pensions of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel were \$5,527.09 against \$5,648.76, or a decrease of \$121.67. They will be less for the current year.

The salaries paid to clergymen amounted to \$10,652.33, and for supplemental and special grants \$675, making a total sum of \$11,327.33 against \$14,923.45 in the previous year. The supplemental grants are now at an end.

No. 6 (Sustentation/Fund—Interest Account) shews that a total of \$3,964.92 has been received for interest during the year—that \$697.17 has been paid on account of local endowments, and the balance of \$3,537.80 carried to the credit of the Mission fund.

I do not think it safe to estimate the receipts from the churches at a higher figure than I have put down. The other figures can be accurately estimated.

The Executive Committee have gone over the grants to missions and have agreed to recommend the putting on again of the 10 p. c. reduction rendered necessary last year, and also to increase grants which had to be specially reduced last year.

The total amount of the new list, including salaries apportioned to missions now vacant, amount to a total of \$11,615. This will leave a margin to meet unexpected calls and to deal with any cases of new

It is very gratifying to find that the efforts made to improve the financial condition of the Mission fund have resulted so satisfactorily and have enabled reductions, rendered absolutely necessary last year, to be to a considerable extent restored to their former figures.

# REPORT OF FOREIGN MISSION COMMITTEE.

The Committee on Foreign Missions beg to report that their efforts have been wholly applied to India. India contains over 200,000,000,000 of inhabitants, who are all our fellow-subjects—members of the same Empire. In India the great heathen religions of the world are largely represented—Mahommedanism, Buddhism, and Hinduism. Our Missions and Schools have free access to all parts of the country. Our Missions in India have been very successful, especially in Southern India, in the district of Tinnevelly. It was in Southern India that Schwartz for forty years patiently by word and deed set forth the great principles of Christianity. In Southern India we have now nearly one hundred native Clergy, and a very large number of native Catechists. The Bishop of Madras wished us to support Samuel Johns, an educated native Catechist, who visited among his educated countrymen around Madras. The Committee has been able to pay the salary of Samuel Johns for the year past.

The Bishop of Madras, in his letter of 10th January last, writes that there have been in his Diocese, accessions since the middle of 1877, of about 35,000 persons. A special gift was sent from the Bible class of St. James the Apostle to the Bishop of Madras, in acknowledging which the Bishop writes that as he assigned the previous help from Canada to a Catechist connected with the C. M. S., he has sent the last to the Rev. S. G. Yesudean, a native Clergyman connected with the S. P. G., for whom he had a great regard. His district is the North-east corner of Tinnevelly. The number of accessions there have been the largest.

Beside this there have been special contributions sent in for Africa and other places, which have been forwarded. A number of contributions have been given for the Society for the Promotion of Christianity among the Jews. The Committee propose to continue sending out leaflets containing information about the work of the Church of England in the foreign field. They hope that every congregation will manifest its interest by sending a contribution.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF CONFERENCE ON ALGOMA MISSIONS.

The Committee beg to report that the work on behalf of the Missionary Diocese of Algoma has been carried on with zeal and success during the past year, many causes having concurred to raise the amount collected. Within the year covered by this Report there have been two days of Intercession appointed by authority; and, on the occasion of the consecration of the Bishop of Montreal, a large and influential Missionary Meeting was held, with a successful pecuniary result, for Algoma. Information has been so recently disseminated by circulars widely distributed, concerning the progress and stability of the Mission Work, that it is not necessary to repeat it here. It is, however, gratifying to note the increasing appreciation of the constant and self-denying labours of the Bishop and Clergy, as shown by the accompanying Treasurer's Report.

Two boys are being educated at Shingwauk, at the charges of St. George's Church, and the Church at large respectively; and a donation of \$50 is annually made to Wawanosh, the Indian school for girls.

# REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON WORKS OF MERCY.

1st. As regards the country. Young people come into the city from the country for employment; it is almost impossible for the Parochial Clergy to follow them as they move about. If there were a Committee of Ladies and Gentlemen to whom they could be directed, who would take trouble to look after them, to direct them to good boarding places and to connect them with congregations, much good might be done—

tions in the city, including the hospitals, where there are members h who ought to be attended to—and to some extent they are. They need all the time and attention of a clergyman. This, with the first object, would form a large Mission. The city Churches, for some years past, have paid for Clerical ministrations to the General Hospital which, if supplemented, would accomplish this object.

3d. As regards the Clergy. There are cases of sickness and need in the families of our Clergy. In the newer Missions great difficulty is experienced in obtaining education. The Committee feel that there ought to be some provision made to enable the Bishop to meet such cases.

How are these objects to be accomplished? There has been for years past an Institution in our midst called the Ladies' Aid Association. Its object is stated in its Report as follows: "This Association has for its object to promote an interest in the Church work of the Diocese. In the ordinary Missions which are too poor to support themselves, the public worship is maintained by the General Mission Fund of the Diocese. This Society provides supplemental support to meet contingencies which from time to time occur. Occasional sums of money are given to more needy Missions, under the sole direction of the Bishop, whose intimate knowledge of their circumstances enables him to decide how and where this aid will best forward the interests of the Church."

The Committee would recommend that the Ladies's Aid Association and the Church Home, and any other General Church Charities, be respectfully requested to give a general statement to Synod of their work for its information.

The three objects referred to might possibly be all attended to by the Ladies' Aid Association, and its funds supplemented by an appeal to the Diocese at large.

The Committee would recommend that an effort be made to endeavour to carry out these objects.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

#### REPORT OF THE RURAL DEANERY OF BEDFORD.

#### My LORD

The Seventeenth Annual Meeting of the Deanery of Bedford was held at Farnham, on June 3d inst.

There were present 14 Clergymen and 9 Laymen, representing 15 Incumbencies.

#### RESIGNATIONS.

Rev. W. Jones, with a view to recruit his failing health, and to obtain needful rest after a long period of active Missionary labour, has resigned Granby, intending again to resume work in the Diocese when circumstances permit.

Rev. R. W. B. Webster has resigned the Rectory of Bedford; Rev. J. Schulte, D. D., the Rectory of Christieville; Rev. H. Kittson the Mission of Potton; Rev. B. D. Irwin the Rectory of Phillipsburg; and the Rev. E. J. Houghton the Mission of Brome.

#### CHANGES.

Rev. O. J. Booth has removed from the Mission of Iron Hill to St. John's, to act as assistant to the Rector. Rev. B. P. Lewis has left the Mission of Sabrevois for the Rectory of Christieville.

#### APPOINTMENTS.

Rev. W. R. Brown has been appointed to the Mission of Iron Hill; Rev. R. Kerr to the Mission of Potton; and the Rev. T. A. Haslam to the Rectory of Granby.

#### VACANCIES.

The Rectories of Phillipsburg and Bedford, and the Missions of Brome and Sabrevois are vacant.

#### DEATHS.

We have to report the death of the Rev. James Jones. This venerable Missionary was for some years superannuated, and died a very old man, and full of years. The extensive Mission which was formerly under his charge is now subdivided into the Incumbencies of Bedford, Stanbridge and West Farnham, and included also a part of the Rectory of Clarenceville. Some thirty years ago Mr. Jones, even then an old man, undertook a journey to England, and with singular success raised a large amount of money, which was appropriated to the erection of churches or parsonages in such centres within his Mission as gave promise of future importance. And to his efforts on that occasion must be assigned much of that prosperity which the above-named Incumbencies have since enjoyed.

We have also to record the deaths of Messrs. Hiram S. Foster and Charles Lindsay, faithful and exemplary members of the Church, who, at the time of their deaths, were members of the Diocesan Synod.

#### CHURCHES.

The Rev. J. Ker has built a church in the eastern part of his Mission of Glen Sutton.

The churches at Abbottsford and Clarenceville have been remodelled in accordance with modern taste, and greatly improved.

#### PARSONAGES.

A Parsonage has been erected in the Mission of Glen Sutton, and another is being built in North Shefford.

#### ENDOWMENTS.

With the exception of Abbottsford, Granby and West Farnham, no other Parishes seem to have made any increase in the amount of their

In connection with this subject the following resolutions have been adopted by the Deanery:

That it be recommended to the Synod to resolve, that in the case of every country Parish where the endowment does not yield \$400 per annum, the Offertory on the first Sunday of each month be appropriated in each of such cases to the formation or increase of its endowment, until it shall yield annually the above-named sum of \$400.

#### DUNHAM LADIES' COLLEGE.

The Corporation of this Institution finding itself unable at present, for want of means, to open the College on the basis originally contemplated, and believing it to be most important that the work of instruction should be entered upon with as little delay as possible, have made arrangements, for the time being, with Miss Brandford Griffith, now Mrs. Oakley, to open a school in the College building, under the patronage of the Corporation. The staff of Teachers under Mrs. Oakley as Lady Principal, are nine in number and of the highest qualifications, and comprise Rev. R. D. Mills, M. A., Rector of Dunham, and Rev. T. H. G. Watson, M. A., Oxon. The Lady Principal makes every effort to furnish a thorough and complete education, and the expense of board and tuition has been placed at the lowest estimate consistent with the solvency of the Institution. During the past year the number of pupils has ranged from forty to fifty.

#### MISSION FUND.

Missionary Meetings have been held generally in every Incumbency in the Deanery, and every influence has been exerted to enkindle a zealous interest in behalf of this Fund. Some Parishes, notably Abbottsford and St. John's, have largely supplemented the amounts they were expected to contribute, but, owing to the unsettled state of other Parishes, induced by changes or vacancies, it is feared that there will be a considerable deficiency in the sum the Deanery, as a whole, ought to have placed to the credit of the Fund. Returns have not been supplied from all the Parishes, and it is, therefore, impossible to estimate the exact deficiency.

I. The Rural Dean having called the meeting to order, the Rev. A. A. Allen was appointed Secretary.

II. On the question being asked, "What is the condition of Church Property," it was found that the parsonage at Hemmingford needed repair. The Secretary was therefore instructed to request the Incumbent and Church Wardens to see that the work be undertaken without delay. The churches of St. Luke's and St. John's likewise need repair. HI. " Is the property in your Incumbency insured?" that, with the exception of the Parsonage of Huntingdon, the Church property of the Deanery was not insured. The Deanery, therefore, strongly recommended that insurance be at once effected by the several corporations.

IV. Grants.—The Deanery respectfully suggests that no Missions be opened, nor vacancies filled, until the minimum of stipend, as per order of Synod, be secured to each Incumbent.

#### RURAL DEANERY OF ST. ANDREWS.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE, 1879.

My Lord:—The Annual Meeting of this Deanery was held at Aylmer on the 28th of May.

There were present the Rural Dean in the Chair, the Ven. Archdeacon Lonsdell, the Rev. Canon Johnston, the Rev. T. Motherwell, W. B. Longhurst, J. A. Newnham, T. Everett (temporarily residing in the Deanery), and R. H. Conroy, Esq.

The attendance was small, owing partly to the long and expensive journeys to reach any central point; and partly to the fact that five out of the nineteen Cures in the Deanery were vacant, and others likely soon to become so.

After very careful consideration of the subjects in question the following resolutions were unanimously passed:

I. Moved by Archdeacon Lousdell, seconded by Canon Johnston, and

Resolved, That this Deanery deplores the large number of vacancies in the Deanery, to the great loss of the people in those Missions, and the increase of work on the part of the neighbouring Clergy.

II. Moved by the Rev. J. A. NEWNHAM, seconded by the Rev. W. B. LONGHURST, and

Resolved, That this Deanery desires to call attention to the following facts:

That the Missions in this Deanery are from ten to thirty miles distant from each other, whilst many in other parts of the Diocese have only from five to ten miles between them.

That in this Deanery a Mission generally includes from one to four Townships; in some other parts of the Diocese there are two or three Missions to a Township.

That by amalgamating Missions here many families would be left at more than a day's hard driving from the nearest Missionary; and by amalgamating elsewhere, at only a few hours' drive.

That in view of these striking facts, the Deanery of St. Andrew's feels most decidedly that if the state of the funds renders it necessary to amalgamate, or close, any of the Missions, such course cannot be

adopted in this Deanery without serious injury to the interests of the

III. Moved by the Rev. W. B. Longhurst, seconded by R. H. Conrol, Esq., and

Resolved, That this Deanery implores the consideration of the Bishop and Synod to the perilous condition into which more than one-half of its Missions have been thrown, by the continued reductions of grants made from the Mission Fund, and firmly insists upon the absolute necessity of the Church in this Deanery receiving increased and immediate aid from that Fund, in order simply to secure, in many cases, an occasional service to struggling congregations heretofore enjoying the Church's full ministrations, even although for this end grants made to Missions in other more thickly populated places have to be decreased, or altogether withdrawn.

IV. Resolved, That the Rural Dean be requested to confer with the Bishop respecting some remuneration to the Rev. W. H. Naylor, out of the Bristol grant, for services rendered by him to the congregations of that Mission for the last nine months; and, further, with a view of securing the temporary services of the Rev. T. Everett for that Mission.

From some of the Missions no reports were received; from others the returns were incomplete. This is to be regretted, as it is most desirable the circumstances and cababilities of each Mission should be accurately known.

The returns presented showed that contributions to Clerical stipends were in some instances below the amounts contributed last year, increasing the difficulties of the Clergy interested, who were already suffering from reduced grants. Special efforts were made in some Missions to make up to the Clergy the loss of grant, but generally without effect. One principal cause of this is found in the poverty of the country.

From the same cause contributions to the Mission Fund were below expectation, although due efforts were made in most Missions to collect for that Fund. It is to be remembered, however, that the list of "proposed contributions" adopted last year, was contingent upon no reduction of regular grants being made. It was to be expected that each Mission would make its Clergyman's stipend, instead of the Mission Fund, its first care.

Although the Deanery has not contributed very largely to the Mission Fund in a direct manner, the Clergy of the Deanery have contributed indirectly to an extent out of all proportion to their means. The reduction of grants to this Deanery during the past year amounted to nearly \$1,500. This includes the "supplemental" grants, which were fairly regarded as a portion of the Clergyman's income, and without which it was impossible to bring Clerical stipends up to the standard set by Synod.

Whatever may be the condition of the Mission Fund at the close of the financial year it should not be torgotten that the Missionary Clergy have borne more than their reasonable share of the burden of sustaining the Missions of the Diocese.

The large number of vacancies in the Deanery has a depressing effect upon the neighbouring Missions, besides adding materially to the labours of the neighbouring Clergy, who are expected to visit the sick and bury the dead, oftentimes at a great sacrifice of time and strength—a sacrifice always cheerfully made.

The following changes have taken place during the past year, viz: The Rev. B. B. Smith, J. Seaman and E. Benedict have left the Deanery and Diocese; the Rev. W. R. Brown and Robert Ker have left the Deanery for other Cures in the Diocese; the Rev. H. S. Fuller has been removed from Thorne to North Wakefield; and the Rev. J. A. Newnham has been appointed to Onslow.

The Missions of Thorne, Bristol, Aylwin, Chelsea and Buckingham are vacant.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
