making is the result of a successful effort to produce a New York City directory for 1875-6, in advance of the usual time of publication by another Company. The entire work of canvassing, printing, and binding occupied only 24 four days, and yesterday a complete book of 1,788 pages was ready for delivery. To accomplish this, one hundred and seventy canvassers were employed in taking names from about May T until May 20; forty six compliers edited the work of the canvassers, and the printing was done with the aid of ninety-two compositors and thirty proof readers and makers-up, in thirteen days. In this time the adjunct of a new street directory, made by an actual canvass of the city, and a new map of the city, with the recently annexed wards, were perfected. The cost of the enterprise was \$50,000, and the number of copies printed 5,000, to be sold at \$5 each. The directory gives 258,000 names, being 24,000 more than in any previously published.

Calling an Attorney a Shyster. A St. Louis practitioner named Mitchell was some time ago characterized as a shyster by the Republican of that city, whereupon he brought an action against that journal for libel. A protracted trial in which a great deal of testimony was taken followed, and the result has been that the jury awarded Mitchell a verdict of one cent damages. It claims that the publication complained of was made in the interest of the public; that the verdict of the jury shows that they must have been convinced of the fact; and that therefore the defendants should have had a clear verdict. Still Mr. Mitchell's experiment is hardly calculated to encourage the class of which he is a representative in the unpromising pursuit of endeavoring to make newspapers pay damages for exercising the privilege of telling the truth from justidable motives.
