# An Act to amend Chapter Thirty-two of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, and otherwise to provide for the encouragement of Agriculture, Arts and Manufactures.

TER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legis- Preamble. H tive Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

To take measures, with the approbation of the Minister of Agri-Museums. 25 culture, to collect and establish, at Toronto and Montreal respectively, for the instruction of practical mechanics and artizans, museums of minerals and other material substances and chemical compositions susceptible of being used in Arts and Manufactures, and articles manufactured in the Province, with model rooms, appropriately stocked and

80 supplied with models of works of art, and of implements and machines other than implements of husbandry and machines adapted to facilitate agricultural operations; and also free libraries of reference containing Libraries. books, plans and drawings, selected with a view to the imparting of useful information in connection with the Arts and Manufactures;

35 2. To take measures to obtain from other countries new or improved New impleimplements and machines (not being implements of husbandry or ments and machines specially adapted to facilitate agricultural operations), and to test the quality, value and usefulness of such implements and machines;

8. And generally to adopt every means in their power to promote im- General pur-40 provement in the Arts and Manufactures of the Province.

S1. The said Boards, with the consent and approbation of the Min-Schools of ister of Agriculture, may establish, in connection with the respective design. museums, model rooms and libraries, Schools of Design on the most approved plan, and furnished and supplied in the most complete and 45 appropriate manner that the funds at their disposal will admit of, regard being had to the claims thereon of the other objects for which they are hereby established.

2. And the Minister of Agriculture may cause duplicates or copies Models, &c., of inventions. of models, plans, specimens, and drawings and specifications, deposited in the Patent Office, and upon which Patents of Invention have been issued, to be made from time to time, and placed in the model rooms, museums or libraries of the Boards of Arts respectively;

Aid to 3. The said Boards may also found or give aid to Schools or Colleges schools, &c. for Mechanics and artizens, and may employ competent persons to deliver lectures on subjects connected with the Arts and Sciences, or with Lectures. Manufactures, in such manner and place as the said Board may from 10 time to time direct.

82. The said Boards shall keep records of their respective transac-Publicationof transactions, tions; and shall, from time to time, publish, in such manner and form &ç: as to secure the widest circulation, among the Mechanics' Institutes, and among mechanics, artizans and manufacturers generally, all such reports, Essays, Lectures and other literary compositions, conveying 15 useful information, as the said Boards are respectively able to procure.

83. The said Boards respectively may make and ordain such By-By-laws. laws, Rules, Orders and Regulations, not being contrary to this Act or to the laws of the Province, as they may deem necessary, touching the disposition and management of their funds, property and affairs; the 20 holding and management of exhibitions of Works of Art and Manufactures, and the execution of the duties and powers entrusted to them by this Act; and from time to time may repeal or alter the same, and make others in their stead :

2. Copies of all By-laws, Rules, Orders and Regulations, and of the 25 Copies to be minutes of the proceedings of the said Boards, shall be transmitted sent to the Bureau, forthwith, after they are respectively made, to the Bureau of Agriculture.

84. All Mechanics' Institutes, Mechanics' Branches of other Asso-Certain institations to be ciations, and Art Associations receiving grants of money from the Go- 30 under the supervision of vernment, shall be placed under the general supervision of the Boards of Arts and Manufacturers for Upper and Lower Canada respectively, in the Board. like manner as the County Agricultural Societies are placed under the supervision of the Board of Agriculture; and the said Boards shall receive from the Government, and pay over to the respective Mechanics' 85 Institutes, Mechanics' Branches of other Associations and Art Associations any grant of money to which they may be entitled:

And it shall be lawful for each Board to retain, for the use of its periodical Exhibitions, one tenth part of all such grants; and no Mechanics' Institutes or Art Association in Uprer or Lower Canada shall 40 tions to be re- be entitled to receive any grant of money from the Government, unless such Institute or Association has become incorporated under the general Act respecting Library Associations and Mechanics' Institutes, chapter seventy-two of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, or by a special Act of Incorporation, nor unless such Institute or Association shall have 45 transmitted to the respective Boards of Aris and Manufactures for Upper or Lower Canada, a properly certified copy of its Annual Report for the past year; 

3. And it shall be the duty of the respective Boards of Arts and Board to send Manufactures to send Agents to visit each incorporated Mechanics' In-agents to visit stitute and Art Association affiliated thereto, whose duty it shall be to ascertain and report on the progress each Institute or Association is

There may be formed in Lower Canada, in connection with any Provision for Library Association, or Literary or Benevolent Association, a Mechanics' the formation Branch thereof, by twenty members thereof, or any greater number, who of Mechanics' Branches of shall be working mechanics or manufacturers, and who shall subscribe Library or 15 at least one dollar each annually, to a fund specially devoted to main-otherAssociatain a reading-room, library, loctures or classes adapted to the instruc- tion. tion of artizans or manufacturers; and such Mechanics' Branch of such Institute or Association may affiliate itself with the Board of Arts and Manufactures for Lower Canada, elect a delegate or delegates to repre-20 sent it therein, in the same manner as a Mechanics' Institute may do: Provided always, that, together with the certificate of the election of such delegate or delegates, and the list of members elected, there is pro- provise. duced a statement or declaration from the proper officer, that such special fund has been altogether devoted to one or more of the objects 25 above named; and provided, further, that the President of any such Association shall not be entitled to be a member ex-officio of said Board, by reason of the affiliation of such branch.

86. There may be formed, with the assent of the Board of Arts and Union of Manufactures for either Upper or Lower Canada, at any city or town Institutes: 80 designated by such Board, a union of Institutes, to include all Institutes existing or to be formed at places within such electoral or other districts as may be determined, and to be governed by officers appointed or elected under such By-laws as may be framed by such Boards, or either of them, for the better regulation and government of such union of In-35 stitutes; and such unions may affiliate themselves to such Boards respectively, in like many er and upon the same basis as single Institutes may do; and the Boards of Arts and Manufactures, or either of them, muy delegate to such unions, or any of them, such powers with respect to the regulations of classes, the delivery of lectures, the formation of 40 Museums and schools of design, and of free libraries, and the expenditures of moneys granted to such Boards for these purposes, as such Boards, or either of them, may from time to time determine, by By-laws or resolutions in that behalf.

87. Each of the Boards shall hold a Fair or Exhibition open to com-45 petitors from any part of the Province; such Fair or Exhibition shall be held annually in Upper Canada and annually or bi-annually in Lower Canada:

2. The Boards of Art and Manufactures may hold said Fair or Exhibitions jointly with the Boards of Agriculture or otherwise, and they 50 may appoint a local Committee of the place where such Fair or Exhibition is appointed to be held, and prescribe the powers and duties of such Committee.

#### AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATIONS.

Of whom composed.

88. The Members of the Boards of Agriculture and of the Boards of Arts and Manufactures, the Presidents and the first Vice-Presidents of all lawfully organized County Agricultural Societies, and of all Horticultural Societies, and all subscribers of one dollar annually, shall, in their respective sections of the Province, constitute an Agricultural 5 · Association for that section.

Officers. 89. The Members of the Board of Agriculture and of the Board of Arts and Manufactures, and the Presidents and first Vice-Presidents of County Societies, and of all Horticultural Societies (or any two members whom a County or Horticultural Society has appointed Directors 10. instead of its President and Vice-President), shall be the Directors of such Agricultural Association; and the Agricultural Association may elect a Treasurer.

- 90. Each of the said Associations shall hold a Fair or Exhibition Fairs or Bahibitions in open to competitors from any part of the Province; such Fair or 15 U: C. Exhibition shall be held annually by the Agricultural Association for Upper Canada.
- 91. The Agricultural Associations for Lower Canada shall not hold And in L. C. a Provincial Fair or Exhibition oftener than bi-ennially; but they may encourage and assist joint Exhibitions in the several judicial dis-20 tricts into which Lower Canada is divided.

92. The Directors shall hold a meeting during the week of the Meeting of Directors, and annual Exhibition, and may at such meeting elect a President and Viceproceedings Presidents, and two Auditors, whose duty it shall be to examine and thereat. report on all moneys received and expended by the Treasurer of the 25 Association, and a copy of their Report shall be transmitted to County Societies, by the Secretary of the Board of Agriculture, on or before the first day of December in each year. The Directors shall also appoint the place for holding the next meeting and Exhibition of the Association, and may make rules and regulations for the management of 80 such Exhibition.

93. The Board of Agriculture, with whom shall for this purpose be **Council of the** associated the President and Vice-President of the Board of Arts and Association. Manufactures, or any two persons from time to time named by the said Board in place of such President and Vice-President, shall be the 35 Council of the Association, with full power to act for and on behalf of the Association between the annual meetings thereof; and they may appoint a local Committee at the place where the annual Exhibition is appointed to be held, and may prescribe the powers and duties of the said Committee. And all grants of money, subscriptions, or other 40 funds made or appropriated to or for the use of the Association (except money collected by or granted to any local Committee for the local expenses of an Exhibition) shall be received by and expended under the direction of the said Board of Agriculture as such Council, and the Secretary of the said Board, together with the Secretary of the Board 45. of Arts and Manufactures, shall be ex-officio joint Secretaries of the Association.

94. All contracts and all legal proceedings by, with, or concerning Centraets to the Association, shall be made and had with the Board of Agriculture, be made with so constituted as such Council, in its corporate capacity, and no other the Board of contracts, agreements, actions or proceedings shall bind or affect the 5 Association.

#### TITLE OF THIS ACT.

95. This Act shall be known as and may be called "The Act for the encouragement of Agriculture, Arts and Manufactures.",

#### REPEALING CLAUSE.
