Resolving the Removal of Snow-Limited Liability in Case of Accidents—Abolition of All Tax Exemptions—Payment of Aldermen—Safeguarding Votes of Electors.

The main business transacted by the Executive Committee yesterday afternoon was the discussion of the legislation to be asked for at the next session of the Ontario Legislature.

The committee decided to ask for the following amendments to the Municipal Act: To shorten the period when the city can enter upon and remove the snow from sidewalks in front of vacant lots.

To limit the city's liability in case of accidents through falling snow, ice, flooding of cellars, etc., and further that in all cases of actions for damages brought against the city.

To provide that in all cases hereafter where municipal councils submit questions to the electors on any matter.

To authorize the payment to aldermen in lieu of such annual sum or other remuneration as the council may determine.

The resolution of the City Council passed on Nov. 6 instructing the committee to apply for legislation to authorize the council to remunerate members of the Council of Revision for 1893 was read.

Ald. Crawford said the members of the court in making this were displaying more charity than the average alderman was supposed to possess.
