

DRAFTING A BASIS OF UNION

NEWFOUNDLAND SATISFIED THAT TERMS CAN BE ARRANGED.

Ottawa, April 8.—There was no conference between representatives of Canada and Newfoundland to-day, each side being engaged in the preparation of a draft of a basis of union for submission to the full conference.

Reports received at the Interior Department indicate an active immigration movement into Northern Alberta this spring. During the month of March, 370 settlers have arrived and settled north of Calgary, and this in the month when nothing more than locating the land and perhaps getting out a few logs or fence rails can possibly be done.

Washington, April 8.—The decision of the Supreme Court on the income tax law was rendered to-day. Chief Justice Fuller read the decision, the question whether or not the tax on rents from real estate is a tax on real estate, and announced that the court has decided that it is a tax on real estate, therefore a direct tax, and as provided for in the law unconstitutional.

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WEST END INCENDIARIES

THE MANY FIRES ATTRIBUTED TO BOYS IN THE LOCALITY.

In Several Cases Two Lads Were Seen Running Away From the Burning Premises—The Victims Are Wondering Why No Arrests Have Been Made by the Authorities.

Since March 3 last the section of the city in the vicinity of Dundas-Queen-streets has been a scene of numerous incendiary fires, resembling in many respects those which destroyed a number of stables in the north-west part of the city in November and December last.

These fires, which have been traced to the hands of two boys, have caused a number of stables in the north-west part of the city to be burned down, and have caused a number of stables in the north-west part of the city to be burned down.

Among the places burned were the stables of R. Vogan, baker, Queen-Brockfield-streets, and house of George W. Henshaw, 3 Waterloo-st., on March 23. On March 26, the stables of W. LeVock, wholesale butcher, Argyle-place, were burned down.

To gain an entrance to the lot where the fire originated, it would be necessary to enter the stable yards from the lane, and pass right before the slaughter house windows. No one unacquainted with the premises could in any way have applied the torch and escaped from the yard unnoticed.

Must Know the Locality.

Less than a hundred yards away from the scene of the blaze on a few minutes past 10 the same evening, the stables in the rear of 9 Bruce-street, occupied by J. Marshall, grocer and butcher, were fired. In this case the incendiary climbed onto some adjoining buildings and dropped a burning brand through a pigeon hole into the lot of the stable.

Another Burning Taper

A few yards north of where once stood Shannon's single mill, in Dufferin-street, stands a small unused office. A large quantity of papers had been scattered across the floor, and Thursday evening last a match or burning taper was dropped through a broken window, setting the inflammable material on fire in an instant. The reels extinguished the blaze before it had altogether destroyed the building.

Friday Night, April 5, added two more stables to the list.

The first was in Dufferin-street, on the Shannon property. The alarm was sent in for this fire a few minutes after 8 o'clock. The stable, which was unoccupied, was totally consumed. The firemen who reached their respective halls when an alarm came from Dundas-Arthur-streets. A stable on the Great Homestead, 85 St. Frederick-street, was also burned down.

That the boys reside or loiter very close to Queen and Dundas is evidenced by the fact that, with one exception, every fire was within two minutes' walk of every inch of street or lane or backyard in the district covered by the fires.
