Montreal Stock Market.

MORNING SESSION ACTIVE ENOUGH, THOUGH PRICES FELL FROM GENERAL CAUSES — RATES AND DISCOUNT HIGHER.

Montreal, Oct. 3.

At 2.15 p.m. in London, that is about the same time that it was 10 o'clock a.m. at Montreal, a cable to one of our local brokers stated that the Bank of England rate had been raised to 4½. A large insurance house at New York was rumored to have received a cable from London that war had been declared. These mean more tension in money, more depreciation in stock, though of course higher wheat prices. Frequenters of Wall Street, though accustomed to contemplate the possibility of a falling market and to fight off a bearish stampede which this is thought advisable, allowed market affairs to-day to manage themselves. The market opened weakly and did not rally in the considerable trading of the forenoon during which 229,000 shares were transferred almost twice as much as were disposed of yesterday. Locally the market is active enough to leave little to be complained of in this respect. The Rails contributed very heavily to this morning's business and they sold lower today again. In fact no stock sold higher. Payne, War Eagle and Republic sold as low as 113, 117, 295 respectively and Montreal-London on a call of 55 was met with 50 as a put price. The gradual wearing down of values at present is the natural consequence of the money market to which an additional tension has been given by higher rates and higher discount of the Bank of England.

Curtailment of privileges hoped for in the case of Montreal and Toronto Railways and in War Eagle's case have probably helped on the liquidation which made the session till noon active. The price recessions were in no case below the limits of fluctuations, due to the general monetary and the political difficulties. Some of the stocks have local difficulties of their own, which have not yet begun to affect them particularly, but will do so perhaps to no great extent

ere very long. Today's depressions, however, are all from the same general cause and possibly will continue for some time until the severe tension in money matters is relieved as it will be in a month, it is said.

RATE NOT UNPRECEDENTED.

The Bank of England's rate advanced from 3½ to 4½ in October quite resembles the advance last year at the same time from 3 in September to 4 in October 13. The summer rates last year were 3½, 3, 2½ in July, Sep. 3, Oct. 4, Jan. 15, 3½.

STRAWS.

The Canadian Minister of Public Works says that it is the intention of the Canadian Government to push the completion work on the system of deep waterways between the great lakes and Montreal and to erect large elevators at Port Colborne and Montreal.

Canadian trade returns for August show imports increased \$3,000,000 and exports increased \$6,000,000 over corresponding month last year.

Kansas City reports a car famine at stock yards, 800 cars being the shortage.

Minnesota reports tell of farmers holding their wheat to a much greater extent than during any previous season.

The statement of August earnings of the Atchison far exceeded the sanguine expectations of the friends of the property. Gross increased earnings \$585,738, and net gain \$707,504. Operating expenses were reduced from 83.9 p.c. last year to 67.2 p.c.

It is stated that Standard Oil interests loaned to Berlin six months ago from \$12,000,000 to \$15,000,000 gold and they are arranging for the return of the same through the National City Bank.

Mr Charles Child Wheeler, pig iron broker, reports that he made a sale this week for 100 tons of No. 1 Foundry Pig Iron at \$18.62½, upon which the seller made a profit of \$1000 on an outlay of about \$800.

The business done in B. R. T. on the floor of the New York Exchange for week ending September 23rd exceeded that of any other stock four times over. The transactions were 1,050,637 shares or 2 1-3 times the entire capital stock.

Metropolitan Street Railway's earnings on Monday, Sept 25, were the largest in the history of the company.

EARLY WEAKNESS PARTLY OVERCOME BEFORE THE CLOSE. — STOCKS SHOULD BE BOUGHT.

Montreal, Oct. 3.

During the early transactions this morning the feeling was very bearish and the pressure to sell was heavy, outside influences seemed to have had a demoralizing effect upon prices, and sympathetically with other exchanges, values sought lower levels.

After the first hour, however, a move of better sentiment assumed control and a feeling of more confidence was in evidence. Buying orders for Republic in large or small quantities came into the market and had their sustaining effect. Sales were made at 115 and 115 1/2 for 1000 shares, and broken lots sold at various prices from 117 down to 116. At the close 116 was freely bid for more.

Next in point of activity was Montreal-London, which sold at a recession of 3 1/2 points from yesterday's price; 1,000 shares for which 50 was obtained was the best price of the day, a block of 2,500 was sold for 49 1/2. It closed, however, at 50 and would have sold again had there been any stock offering.

In other respects the market was quiet, a block of 5000 King sold for 20 1/2 and 5000 Deer Trail No. 2 for 21 1/2. There were also sales made of Slocan Sov. at 37 1/2 and of Novelty at 3 1/2.

Good news comes from Deadwood camp in the shape of a new strike. Ore seems to be very plentiful throughout that district, as is proved by the discovery made while cutting and levelling from the railway.

The Rosslund news to hand is also most reassuring, shipments maintain their average. Developments continue to prove satisfactory. Additional orders for machinery drills are being placed.

The B. A. C., a property west of the War Eagle, sends in a flourishing account. The California also is making a good start, a lot of preparatory work being done.

Canadian Gold Fields Syn. is reported as acquiring and saving ore on the Summit No. 3 mine which is one of its properties

Further west the Smilkaman district promises to be the biggest thing in Southern British Columbia, and although it may be a year or so before the ore can be marketed yet if the property is half as promising as disinterested parties who have been there claim it to be, it will indeed be a most promising district.

NEW YORK EXCHANGE.

LONDON MARKET DULL, WHICH DID NOT WEAKEN NEW YORK OPENINGS. — GOOD BUYING OF ST. PAUL — A. M. T. ACTIVE ON LIQUIDATION — SUGAR, B. R. T., SO. PAC. ALSO ACTIVE.

New York, Oct. 3.

The foreign markets are in a state of demoralization. The directors of the Bank of England have taken the unusual step of meeting on Tuesday instead of Thursday, and of advancing the rate of discount 1 p.c. instead of ½ p.c., as usual.

The rate stands at 4½ p.c. now. The Imperial Bank of Germany has followed suit and has raised its rate of discount from 5 to 6 p.c. The only conclusion to be arrived at from the action of these 3 important financial institutions is that all possibility of peace in the Transvaal is at an end.

Of course the action of the Bank of England makes further importation of gold by us an impossibility, and considering that the decline of currency to the interior still continues, it is difficult to see how any material relief can be afforded to our money market for some time. This does not mean that we are going to have such high rates for call money as prevailed yesterday, but bankers generally are confident that it will be some time before a quotation below 6 p.c. is made, and that surries such as we had yesterday will be recurrent.

So far our stock market has stood the high rates pretty well. There has been a decline, but except on two or three days in the week before last, liquidation by commission houses has not been very pronounced.

That liquidation must take place is inevitable. The discrimination of banks against the Industrials will force commission houses to demand liquidation from their customers or else the taking up of the Industrials which are being carried.

Further, customers generally have been living in a sort of fool's paradise, being assured by some light minded writers on financial affairs that the war in the Transvaal would not only affect them injuriously, but would strengthen their market position.

New York, (noon), Oct. 3.

There appears to have been a mistake in the cable quotations for Americans in London. St. Paul was quoted as selling at 119, as a matter of fact the London price was equal to a N. Y. price of about 122.

Considering the decline in the London market, our market showed considerable strength. It is true that it opened lower than it closed last night, but the declines, as a rule, were not very heavy, and the character of the buying round the room was called good.

One firm which is generally supposed to do business for J. P. Morgan & Co., was a particularly heavy buyer, taking 8000 shares of St. Paul which with the 3000 taken yesterday makes 11,000 for the two days, and also buying blocks of other stocks.

Their total purchases were estimated at some 40,000 shares.

Commission houses were moderate sellers, liquidation being more apparent than it was yesterday.

There was a disposition on the floor to buy stocks partly on account of the good character of the buying round the room and partly because predictions were made that money would be less stringent than yesterday.

At present it does not look as if these predictions would be verified. It is said that \$200,000 were loaned at 6 p.c. Next quotation was 10 p.c. and immediately after 13 was bid. Loans now being made at 20 p.c. Possibly towards the ending of the week money will let up, in consequence of the large sums that have been paid into the city treasury on account of taxes, the aggregate is estimated at \$11,000,000.

After the first half hour business became dull, A. M. T., Sugar, B.R.T., St. Paul and So. Pac. being about the most active stocks. A. M. T. was heavy on what looked like liquidation. There were evidences of inside buying.

The market is at present dull and comparatively steady.

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MINING NEWS.

BIG NORTHERN STRIKE.

Victoria, B.C., Sept. 30.—The Alpha, from the north this morning, brought B. F. Botsford, managing director of the Joseph Ladue Gold Mining and Development Company, who brings news of the discovery of a rich and extensive deposit of gold bearing quartz found by some of the company's prospectors within thirty miles of Dawson. Samples assayed give from \$38 to \$107 to the ton, and the ledge shows 125 feet in width, the cropings being traced for upwards of a mile. This enormous find, he says, is not generally known in the camp, as the company are keeping their own counsel in the matter. They have already shipped in a small quartz mill, which will be started up next season.

DEADWOOD CAMP STRIKES

Rossland, B.C., Sept. 30.—A most remarkable series of strikes have been made on properties of the British Columbia Copper Company, Deadwood Camp, following up the strikes of thirty-seven feet of solid chalcopryite ore on the Primrose claim by the railway cutting. It is the same as that of ninety feet of rich ore in the north drift of the Mother Lode, the big mine shaft down to a depth of 263 feet, giving 30 per cent. copper. The A. C. Copper Company is mainly owned by New York capitalists. Johnson, the noted smelter expert, is superintendent, and vouches for the above facts. Two other big strikes are reported today, one in the Winnipeg mine, Wellington camp, of six feet of solid pyrrhotite ore in a cross-cut from the main shaft on the 300 foot level; the other on the surface of the Gold Crown, adjoining, made by a railway cutting, 25 feet wide, identical in character to that of the Winnipeg, which averages from \$60 to \$70 in gold.

THE HILLSIDE CLAIM.

An extract from the spokesman Review, of September 25, says: Work on the Hillside claim is progressing rapidly. The ledge is proving to be fully as large as was expected. It has been stripped until it is now assured that it is from 40 to 60 feet in width. The walls have been drifted and are said to be solid. Manager H. L. Percy believes that when fully opened, it will be the largest body of ore in the camp, and James P. Harvey, late manager of the Republic mine, expressed a similar view of the matter. Some of the ore carries fair values, and all of it carries some. The values are as great as has been the rule in this camp on the surface. The recent work has been devoted to determining the width of the ledge. In a few days a shaft will be started and the work prosecuted with all possible speed. The position of the claim is such that it can be worked cheaply and the ores can be handled as cheap or cheaper than any other in the camp. It will take

but a few dollars to make a good road to it from the town of Republic, and it lies within a few hundred feet of a fine mill site. As it is at this time the most promising of the undeveloped claims in the district. It lies southward of the Mountain Lion.
