HERSCHEL'S WEATHER TABLE, FOR TELLING THE WEATHER THROUGHOUT ALL THE LUNATIONS OF EACH YEAR FOREVER.

This table and the accompanying remarks are the result of many years' actual observation, the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom or never found to fail.

OBSERVATIONS.—1. The nearer the time of the Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter are to *midnight* the fairer will be the weather during the next seven days.

2. The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two the next morning.

3. The nearer to *midday* or *noon* the phases of the Moon happens, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven days.

4. The space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to the summer, though they affect Spring and Autumn nearly in the same ratio.

5. The Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, *i. e.*, from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind, as is noted in the table.

6. Though the weather, from a variety of irregular causes, is more uncertain in the latter part of Autumn, the whole of Winter, and the beginning of Spring, yet in the main the above observations will apply to all seasons, and the observer should be within sight of a good result, if he consults correctly, especially in those cases where the wind is concerned, the observer should be within sight of a good result.

EXPLANATORY.

Aphelion—The point of a Planet's orbit farthest from the Sun.
 Apogee—That part of the Moon's orbit farthest from the Earth.
 Astronomical Day is reckoned from noon to noon through the 24 hours. Thus
 July 21, 9h, is 9th A of July 21, and July 21, 15h, is 3h M of July 22.
 Conjunction—A Planet directly between the Earth and the Sun is said to be
 in Inferior Conjunction with the Sun. A Planet with the Sun directly
 between it and the Earth is said to be in Superior Conjunction with the
 Sun. Planets are said to be in conjunction with each other, or with the
 Moon, when they are in the same sign and degree.
 Declination—The distance of a heavenly body from the Equinoctial, measured
 north or south, in degrees or minutes, on a Meridian.
 Elliptic—The plane of the Earth's orbit, so called because Eclipses can take
 place only when the Moon is on or near it.
 Elation—The distance of a Planet from the Sun as seen from the Earth.
 Equinoctial—The circle in the heavens traced by the Earth's Equator.
 Node—That part of the orbit of a heavenly body which intersects the Ecliptic.

FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of the great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature and prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from violent storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, but an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a century has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets like Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast the weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the British Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bureau of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weather for more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of a telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mistakes are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.

Richibucto Harbor Range Lights, two range light towers, close to the present day beacons upon the South Beach, at the entrance to the Richibucto River. United States---Eastport to Boston.

[Sea Coast Lights are distinguished from Harbor Lights by the latitude and longitude being given. Particular Sailing Directions for entering Harbors between St. John and Boston, are also given.]

West Quoddy Light. Latitude $44^{\circ} 48' 54''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 57' 1''$ W; tower of brick, painted with red and white horizontal stripes, connected with dwelling house by white building; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; situated on the west side of the entrance to Eastport and the St. Croix River, via Lubec Narrows. Good anchorage in West Quoddy Bay 1 mile N N W from the light. No passage through the Narrows at low water; strangers should not attempt to go through without a pilot.

Little River Light, on an Island at the mouth of Little River Harbor; tower white, attached to Keeper's dwelling; fixed light varied by white flashes 1m; visible 11 miles; seen from N E by E $\frac{1}{2}$ E, via eastward to south. Also, fog bell, struck by machinery twice a minute. Latitude $44^{\circ} 39' 45''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 12' 5''$ W. Good anchorage for a small number of vessels just inside the Island. To enter harbor pass to eastward of the light.

Libby Island Light, at mouth of Machias Bay and River; latitude $44^{\circ} 34' 4''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 22' 2''$ W; grey tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. On south west end of Libby Island. Island is divided in two parts. Fog bell struck by machinery. To enter Harbor, via Eastern entrance, get Avery's Rock Light to bear N $\frac{3}{4}$ E and run for it, leaving it handy on starboard hand, then N by E to a high, round, woody Island, which leave handy on port side, then N $\frac{1}{2}$ E half a mile, and anchor.

Via Western entrance. Pass Libby Island Light a fair berth on your starboard hand, and get it to bear S S W half a mile, then run N E by E until Avery's Rock bears N by E, then continue as via Eastern Entrance.

Avery's Rock, in Machias Bay, near mouth of River; tower built from the top of Keeper's dwelling, painted white; fixed red light, visible 14 miles.

Moosepeak Light. Latitude $44^{\circ} 28' 27''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 31' 25''$ W; white tower, white flash light, 30 seconds between flashes, visible 13 miles. Mistake Island is to the west side of entrance to Bay of Fundy. For entrance to Moosepeak Harbor, pass to the eastward of light about a N W course one mile. There is another small harbor about N N E, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the light, called the Cow Yard. Bearings—to Libby Island light, N E by E $\frac{3}{4}$ E, 9 miles; Petit Menan light, W $\frac{1}{2}$ S 15 miles.

Moosepeak Automatic Buoy, in deep water, off Moosepeak light; works by action of the sea; often heard 4 miles; Bearings—Moosepeak light bears N W 2 miles, Petit Menan Ledge W $\frac{3}{4}$ S 15 miles, Petit Menan light W 15 miles, Libby Island light N E $\frac{3}{4}$ E 9 miles.

Washie's Island Light: white tower; fixed red light, visible 12 miles. To enter Moosepeak Reach, west entrance, leave light on starboard hand; also, a guide to Pleasant River.

Narraguagus Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; located on Pond Island; entrance to Narraguagus Bay and Millbridge; bell struck by wind to answer signals in thick weather.

Petit Menan Light; latitude $44^{\circ} 22' 2''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 51' 51''$ W; tall grey tower; fixed light, varied by light flashes once in 2 minutes, visible 17 miles. But if approaching Boston from Cape Ann, via Broad Sound, bring Long Island Light to bear S W by W, and run for it until Deer Island Point Beacon bears N W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, three-eighths of a mile distant, then W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N up the harbor. Strangers should bear in mind that in the middle of Broad Sound there is but 8 feet of water at low tide; but by keeping in the southern side of the Sound, leaving the Graves Automatic Buoy half a mile on the port hand and the Devil's Limb Buoy (1 black can buoy No. 1) $\frac{1}{2}$ mile on port hand, and running straight to Ram's Head Buoy (black can buoy No. 5) about W S W, passing Aldrich's Ledge Buoy (black can No. 3) $\frac{1}{2}$ miles (on port), then leaving Ram's Head Buoy 50 yards distant on port, and run about W $\frac{1}{2}$ S to clear Deer Island Point Beacon, you can carry 14 feet safely.

Such newspapers and periodicals may be issued not less frequently than once per month.

Newspapers posted for City Delivery will not be delivered by Letter Carriers, unless prepaid by 1c. stamp.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals Addressed to Places in Canada, Newfoundland and United States.

On all Newspapers and Periodicals other than those specified above, the postage rate will be *one cent per 4 ounces* in weight, which must be prepaid postage stamp.

Newspapers and Periodicals *published not less frequently than once a month* and weighing *less than one ounce* may be posted singly, if prepaid by postage stamp *one half cent each*.

Newspapers and Periodicals published in the United Kingdom, and brought by mail to Canadian Booksellers or News Agents, may be re-mailed by such Booksellers or News Agents, *FREE* of postage.

Parcels cannot be transmitted by Post to any place beyond the limits of Dominion of Canada.

Parcels for British Columbia and Manitoba, via the United States, will be forwarded if over 2 lbs 3 oz each in weight; for Winnipeg they may be sent weighing 5 lbs.

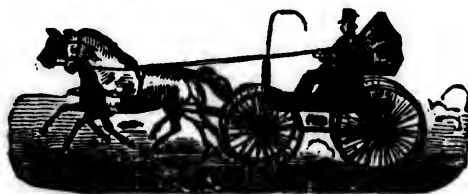

Hackney Carriages.—Rates of Fare.

The prices or rates of fare to be taken and recovered by and paid to the owner, driver, or other person having charge of any licensed Hackney Carriage shall be as follows; that is to say: for conveying one passenger from any public stand to any other part of the City, or from any one part of the City to any other part thereof, the sum of thirty cents, and for every additional passenger of the same household, each twenty cents; other passengers, not of the same household, each thirty cents. When detained at any place by any passenger, there shall be an additional fare of fifty cents every half hour detention. When agreement for hire is made by the hour, the fare shall be the sum of one dollar for each hour, and in that proportion for each division by the quarter of the hour. In case any driver shall be required to cross the ferry of the harbor to or from Carleton, he shall, in addition to the above fare, receive twenty cents additional rate for one passenger, or more than one of the same household; but if not of the same household, then twenty cents such additional fare for each passenger; and also in addition to the fare, he shall receive the ferrage charge for himself, his carriage and horses, both going and returning. Every owner, driver or person having charge of any Hackney Carriage shall when requested so to do, carry with each passenger one trunk and also an additional valise, carpet-bag, portmanteau, bundle, basket, or other article used in travelling, without charge or compensation therefor; and for every additional trunk or other article more than hereinbefore provided, he shall be entitled to demand and receive the sum of five cents.

If any Pilot shall be employed in the removal of any ship or vessel within
the said port or harbor of Saint John, from any mooring ground to any wharf,

That the pilotage dues earned by any pilot for piloting a vessel into or out of the harbor of Musquash shall be collected by the pilot performing the duty making returns of such pilotage duty performed and amount of money earned and pay unto the Secretary and Treasurer twenty-five cents per foot of the outward pilotage so earned.

Time Ball on Northern Tower of Custom House.

The Ball will be hoisted half its elevation each day (Sunday excepted) fifteen minutes before one o'clock. At one minute before one o'clock it will be hoisted its full length; and at one o'clock, mean time, the Ball will be dropped. A Chronometer keeping correct Greenwich time should then show 5h 24m 15s, and the difference between this and the time shown by a Chronometer, is its true error on Greenwich time at the moment. At the above hour of one o'clock when the Ball drops, represents 5h 24m 15s at Greenwich, the error of a Chronometer may be ascertained, no matter where the ship is lying. Masters of vessels arriving at Saint John should compare their Chronometer by the Time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which frequently varies from harbor rates. Latitude $45^{\circ} 16' 42''$ North. Longitude in Time 4h 24m 15s West of Greenwich.

Facts about Milk.

Cream cannot rise through a great depth of milk. If milk is, therefore, desired to retain cream for a time, it should be put into a deep narrow dish; and if it be desired to free it most completely of cream, it should be poured into a broad flat dish, not much exceeding one inch in depth. The evolution of cream is facilitated by a rise, and retarded by a depression of temperature. Wet and cold weather the milk is less rich than in dry and warm; and on that account more cheese is obtained in cold than in warm, though not in windy weather. The season has its effects. The milk in the spring is supposed to be the best for calves, in summer it is best suited for cheese, and in autumn, the butter keeping is better than that of summer. Cows less frequently milked than others give rich milk, and, consequently, rich butter. The morning's milk is richer than the evening's. The last milk of each milking, at all times and seasons, is richer than the first milk, which is the poorest.

Flower Gardens.

It will soon be time to commence the preparation of all kinds of bedding for next year's display; in doing this the cuttings should be taken off carefully without disfiguring the beds. The cuttings can be stuck in the open in boxes, pans, or pots. Upon the whole, we prefer rough wooden boxes, but two feet long, fifteen inches wide, and five or six inches deep. The bottoms of the boxes are perforated, so as to allow of free drainage. Too much stress cannot be laid on the fact that efficient drainage is all important, when it is intended to keep the cuttings over the winter in the boxes or pans in which they are struck. Cuttings struck and established before winter in properly prepared boxes are easily kept over. We lay considerable stress on this, because tens of thousands of cuttings of verbenas and geraniums are lost

every winter from two causes: being put in too late, and the pans or boxes being sufficiently drained. A layer of crocks an inch deep should be spread over the bottoms, and over the crocks a thin layer of moss, so as to prevent the soil percolating through, and so choking the drainage. Almost any kind of soil will do to strike the cuttings in; light garden soil, with a sprinkling of sharp sand, is as good as any.—*Farmers Advocate.*

Live Stock in Midsummer.

The latter part of summer is often very trying to live stock. Pastures short, old grain is high, the new not yet fit to feed. Milk may be in great demand and the farmer loath to cut in upon his corn fodder, intended for curing, to feed off the aftermath; he is lucky who can turn his young stock of cattle and horses into mountain or high-wooded pastures, where they may have water and may make at least half a living upon underbrush, etc. Early sown fodder corn comes in well now for milch cows, and there is really no other good use for it. If cut for curing it is hard to dry without moulding and decaying, and if left to stand until after the middle of September, when it will cure well, it will be as woody and tough as "corn stalks." When fed to milch cows, fodder corn ought to be cut short and sprinkled with two to three quarts of corn meal per cow each day. There will then be no complaint of the quality or the quantity of the milk. If those are fed without the meal the milk will surely be thin, and the cows are exhausted by the increased feed and soon fall off in yield.

Horses in pasture are often extremely annoyed by flies. If they can stand when not in use, in dark, sweet stables, by all means turn them into the pasture only at night. Gnats and mosquitoes are of little annoyance to horses, but the larger day-flies and the (*Estrus*,) or Bot-fly, set them almost crazy.

A loamy soil that is neither so light as a sandy nor so tenacious as a clay soil is, as a rule, best adapted to fruit orchards. What are known as calcareous loams are also prized by the fruitgrowers; so are the most lands in the limestone districts. Fruit trees make a rank growth in alluvial soils, but generally speaking, they are neither so hardy nor so fruitful as are trees in soils containing more sand, clay or gravel, and less vegetable mould. The fruit is not so high-flavored as if from a loamy soil. A gravelly soil is not suited to fruit trees, and must be mixed with clay, muck, peat and the like to insure any success.

Rye is one of the most valuable of all crops for soiling, as it makes a good growth before most grasses begins to shoot. It is not always a profitable crop when grown for grain, but its value is inestimable for early pasturage and soiling. There is another use to which rye can be put with advantage, which is to allow it to make a heavy growth and then plow it under for early potatoes. Used for this purpose it largely increases the yield, especially if it is sprinkled with a mixture of lime and ashes.—*Dixon (Ill.) Western Farmer.*

Eating Lemons.

A good deal has been said about the healthfulness of lemons. The latest advice is to use them so they will do the most good runs as follows: Most people know the benefit of lemonade before breakfast, but few know how it is more than doubled by taking another at night also. The way to get the better of a bilious system without blue pills or quinine is to take the juice of one, two or three lemons, as the appetite craves, in as much ice water as makes it pleasant to drink, without sugar, before going to bed. In the morning on rising, or at half an hour before breakfast, take the juice of one lemon in a goblet of water. This will clear the system of humors and bile, with efficacy, without the weakening effect of calomel or congress water. People should not irritate the stomach by eating lemons clear; the powerful acid of the juice, which is almost corrosive, infallibly produces inflammation after awhile, but properly diluted, so that it does not burn or draw the throat, it does its full medicinal work without harm, and when the stomach is clear of food has abundant opportunity to work the system thoroughly.
