


This table and the accompanying remarks are the result of many years' actual observation, the whole being conand will by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the structed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom or never found to fail.

Observations.-1. The nearer the time of the Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter are to midnight the fairer will be the weather during the next seven days.

2. The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two the next morning.

3. The nearer to midday or mon the phases of the Moon happens, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next

4. The space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to 5. The Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, i. c., from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind, as is noted in the table. Though the weather, from a variety of irregular causes, is more uncertain in the latter part of Autumn, the whole of Winter, and finding of Spring, yet in the main the above observations will apply to those periods also. the summer, though they affect Spring and Autumn nearly in the same ratio.

FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature a prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from viole storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a central has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets if Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the Brit Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bur of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weat for more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always ble towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mist are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much mains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact scient

Facts about Milk.

If milk is, therefore ired to retain cream for a time, it should be put into a deep narrow dish; if it be desired to free it most completely of cream, it should be poured Frederictor a broad flat dish, not much exceeding one inch in depth. The evolution meam is facilitated by a rise, and retarded by a depression of temperature. wet and cold weather the milk is less rich than in dry and warm; and on account more cheese is obtained in cold than in warm, though not in ndery weather. The season has its effects. The milk in the spring is posed to be the best for calves, in summer it is best suited for cheese, and autumn, the butter keeping is better than that of summer. lows less frequently milked than others give rich milk, and, consequently, do Dorchester. ch butter. The morning's milk is richer than the evening's. wa milk of each milking, at all times and seasons, is richer than the first wn, which is the poorest.

Flower Gardens,

will soon be time to commence the preparation of all kinds of bedding for next year's display; in doing this the cuttings should be taken off fully without disfiguring the beds. A layer of crocks an inch deep should be so over the bottoms, and over the crocks a thin layer of moss, so as to pre the soil percolating through, and so choking the drainage. Almost any of soil will do to strike the cuttings in; light garden soil, with a sprinklic sharp sand, is as good as any.—Farmers Advocate.

Live Stock in Midsummer.

The latter part of summer is often very trying to live stock. Pastures short, old grain is high, the new not yet fit to feed. Milk may be in g demand and the farmer loath to cut in upon his corn fodder, intended curing, to feed off the aftermath; he is lucky who can turn his young stock cattle and horses into mountain or high-wooded pastures, where they have water and may make at least half a living upon underbrush, etc. Easown fodder corn comes in well now for milch cows, and there is really other good use for it. If cut for curing it is hard to dry without mould and decaying, and if left to stand until after the middle of September, where will cure well, it will be as woody and tough as "corn stalks." When fed milch cows, fodder corn ought to be cut short and sprinkled with two to find quarts of corn meal per cow each day. There will then be no complain the quality or the quantity of the milk. If those are fed without the matche milk will surely be thin, and the cows are exhausted by the increased fit and soon fall off in yield.

Horses in pasture are often extremely annoyed by flies. If they can stand when not in use, in dark, sweet stables, by all means turn them into the past only at night. Gnats and mosquitoes are of little annoyance to horses, but larger day-flies and the (Estrus.) or Bot-fly, set them almost crazy

A loamy soil that is neither so light as a sandy nor so tenacious as a c soil is, as a rule, best adapted to fruit orchards. What are known as calca ous loams are also prized by the fruitgrowers; so are the most lands limestone districts. Fruit trees make a rank growth in alluvial soils, a generally speaking, they are neither so hardy nor so fruitful as are trees in containing more sand, clay or gravel, and less vegetable mould. Rye is one of the most valuable of all crops for soiling, as it makes a growth before most grasses begins to shoot. There is another use to which rye can be put with advantage, whis to allow it to make a heavy growth and then plow it under for early potate. Used for this purpose it largely increases the yield, especially if it is sprink with a mixture of lime and ashes.—Dixon (Ill.) Western Farmer.
