FORTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

To the Members of the Mechanics' Institute, Montreal.

GENTLEMEN,

In laying before you the Forty-seventh Annual Report, the Committee would call your attention to the work of the several Sub-Committees during the year. You will see by the Report that the finances are in a healthy condition, and that there is a surplus after paying all outstanding accounts. This year the Reading Room, Library, Entrance Hall, Corridors and Long Room have all been thoroughly cleaned and renovated, which has added much to the appearance and comfort of the members.

The Lecture and Class Committee regret not being able to make arrangements for Lectures. Mr. Storey made a proposition to deliver one or more Lectures, with stereoscopic views, which we were obliged to decline for want of accommodation.

We much regret the loss of five Life Members during the past year.

We have also to report a decrease in our annual membership.

We are pleased to state that the Reading Room has been better attended the past year than for many years.

The assortment of papers for the Reading Room we believe has given general satisfaction, which is proved by the absence of all complaints.

The Library shows an increase in circulation of the previous year, and it is pleasing to note, that a better class of Books in proportion has been issued during the past year.

The general condition of the Library is most satisfactory.

The reports of the various Sub-Committees and the Financial Statement for the year ended 31st October last, duly audited, are appended.

The whole is respectfully submitted by the Committee, and with the earnest hope that their labours of the past year, will meet with the approval of the Members.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg to report that certain necessary repairs connected with their department, have been accomplished, viz., the store of one of our tenants has been all tinted and repaired, together with the Long Room, Reading Room, Library, and Entrance Hall.

The general condition of the building has been faithfully attended to, and also the comfort and convenience of the members.

We are pleased to report a further increase in the revenue from Rents, of \$71.25.

Your Committee held a meeting last February, to consider the proportion of assessment paid by the Institute and the tenants, and after a very careful consideration, it was proved that the Institute paid too high a proportion, and it was decided that a re-adjustment should be made, which has been effected, thus making a saving of \$64.99 a year.

We have arranged with a second Building Society to hold their meetings in the Long Room. And also arranged with the Association of Engineers and Firemen to hold a meeting once a week in the same place.

We have had our Boiler officially inspected, which was found to be in good condition.

LECTURE AND CLASS COMMITTEE.

Your Committee regret in not being able to report more favourably in their department; some correspondence for Lectures took place last December, but it was found impossible to make arrangements for Lectures, especially as the Hall is regularly rented.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE.

Your Committee are sorry in having to report the death of five life members during the past year, viz: Hon. J. L. Beaudry, Mr. Geo. F. Prowse, Mr. James E. Major, Mr. John Dougall and Mr. R. Graham.

French.-4 Daily, 1 Weekly, 1 Fortnightly.

American.-6 Daily, 15 Weekly, 13 Monthly.

THE LIBRARY.

The Annual Stock-taking of the Library was carefully done in July, under the personal supervision of Messrs. Harper, Hughes, Teulon and Lampard. And the result was most satisfactory.

At the time of Stock-taking last year there were in the Library, 9,746 Books. Since, there has been added by purchase, binding and donation, 184 Works. To end of Stock-taking in July, 1886, total number of volumes 9,930. From date of Stock-taking in July to October 31st, there has been added by purchase, binding and donation, 92 Volumes, of which 25 were Volumes of Magazines bound, 7 English or general literature, 26 Novels, and Juvenile Books, 7 History, 5 Biography, 9 Science, 1 Travel, 6 U.S. Government Reports, 3 Quebec Government Reports, 3 Education, 66 General literature, 26 Fiction.

At the time of closing the Library for the Stock-taking, there were 177 Volumes in circulation, all of which have been returned.

The donation of Books were from the U.S. Government, the Quebec Legislature, Sir W. Dawson, G. W. Stephens, British Association for the advancement of Science, The American Steam Boiler Insurance Co., and Mr. Jas. H. Bartell, Civil Engineer, Montreal. The above named Governments, and each of these gentlemen have had their donations duly acknowledged. And the Committee desire to place on record their thanks for the same.

All Books added in future by donation will be marked by special label.

The amount expended on the Reading Room has been \$439.70.

On the Library (including building) \$345.54, viz., for new Books, \$185.52, and for binding, \$160.02.

The number of Members using the Library this year, is about the same as last year. The number of Readers this year have been 647 against 638. And the number of volumes issued, 12,619, against 12,432.

The particulars of the class of books circulated during the year is as follows:—

In the purchase of books, special care has been taken to meet the desires and the intellectual tastes of those who use the Library. and every entry in the "Suggestion Book" has received the most careful thought of the Committee, and in most cases the work asked for has been ordered.

The Magazine department is large and of increasing importance, and are of much value as works of reference, and your Committee are pleased to report that all our magazines have been bound up to date.

In conclusion your Committee would call the attention of the members to the need of increasing the amount of Insurance on the Library, as in the event of a fire occurring, in all probability a total destruction of the books would be the result.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT, 1886.

The Finance Committee beg to submit the following report, and have pleasure in stating that the general result of the past year's business has again been satisfactory. That by the most careful supervision of the finances of the Institute they have been able to maintain the general efficiency thereof, and after paying every claim, so that there is not an account, so far as known, unpaid, they have a larger balance to their credit than for some years past, as the following statements will show:—

ANNUAL MEETING,

Held in the Long Room of the Mechanics' Institute, 6th Dec., 1886.

MR. ROBT. IRWIN, President, in the Chair.

The foregoing Report was presented and read by the Secretary, which, after discussion, was on motion received and adopted, and ordered to be printed, and that the thanks of this meeting be given to the retiring officers. Carried.

At the Regular Monthly Meeting of the General Committee, held October 25th, 1886, a letter addressed to the President, Mr. Robt. Irwin, was read from J. Cradock Simpson, offering the sum of one hundred and five thousand dollars for the purchase of the Mechanics' Insiitute.

It was resolved to call a Special General Meeting of the members, and, on the 15th November, such meeting was held; and after much discussion, it was *Resolved*: "That the question of the sale of the building be referred to the General Committee, with instructions to report thereon at the Annual Meeting."

The Committee thought it best to seek the advice of some competent architect, and they decided upon Mr. A. C. Hutchison, who prepared a report upon four schemes, and an alternative or fifth scheme, which was submitted to him, the whole of which was read at the Annual Meeting; and the Committee leaves them for the general consideration of the meeting, and if any of the plans more than another meet the opinion of the Committee they favour the latter, which would enable them to build a suitable building and leave a reserve in hand to prosecute our work in other parts of the city, such sum to be reserved until some further amounts may be contributed by the citizens and our members,
