U. S. Investigators Send Report on Conditions for Com. ing Year.

Washington, Jan. 23—Europe this year will require huge imports of foodstuffs from the American continent, according to a public announcement made by the United States Department of Agricul-ture. to a public announcement made by the United States Department of Agricul-ture. The announcement was based on a report by G. F. Warren and W. F. Chandler, who returned recently after making a study of European agricul-tural and market conditions. Germany alone, it was said, will need 2,000,000 tons of imported foods before the newt harvest, and the United King-dom, France and Scandinavian countries. Czecho-Slovakia, Austria, Italy and Switzerland are looking to America 'for great quantities to supplement their own supplies. Excellent 'yields' of wheat and rye were obtained before' the severe drought of last spring developed, the investigators reported, but barley, oats, corn, potatoes, sugar beets and fodder crops were ex-tensively damaged. Pasturage was so severely damaged in some countries, it was said, that livestock was sold off with a resultant depression of meat markets, and the drought delayed planting/ of winter wheat and caused a reduction in acreage.
