MANITOBA GOVERNMENT PROPOSES ELIMINATION OF GRAND JURIES

(By Canadian Press.)

Winnipeg, March 20—If a resolution to be brought down by the Government during the present session is carried by the legislators, grand juries in Manitoba will become an institution of the past and an annual saving of \$50,000 will be effected.

If the grand jury is eliminated cases will go direct to a judge or petty jury from the preliminary hearing. No true bills or no bills would be required.

Hon. R. W. Craig, K.C., Attorney-General, in announcing the introduction of the resolution said he would strongly support the policy of eliminating grand juries.
