THERE IS NO WEAKENING.

Tomorrow a representative delegation of prohibitionists from different parts of the Province will appear before the Government at Fredericton to present the case for the most strict enforcement possible of the prohibitory law.

Referring to conditions in the United States, the Washington correspondent of the New York Tribune, a strong Republican paper, announces that President Harding will take his stand for re-election on a strict enforcement platform.

Of conditions in Ontario the Toronto Star points out that in that city, where the poorest results might be expected, there is less than one fourth as much drunkenness as in 1913, and declares it is not true that the Ontario Temperance Act does not curtail the evils of the drinking habit.

There is no agitation worthy the name against the O. T. A. or prohibition in Ontario. There is no movement for a return to license that amounts to anything.

WE LAG BEHIND.

Hon. W. J. O'Hearn, the new Attorney General of Nova Scotia, submitting the annual report of the Department of Neglected and Dependent Children to the Legislature, paid a tribute to the Children's Aid Societies and the Juvenile Courts.

It is much to be regretted that New Brunswick is still without a superintendent of Neglected and Dependent Children, and without even one Juvenile Court.

The City Council did the right thing yesterday in authorizing the expenditure for poles which was recommended by the Civic Power Commission.

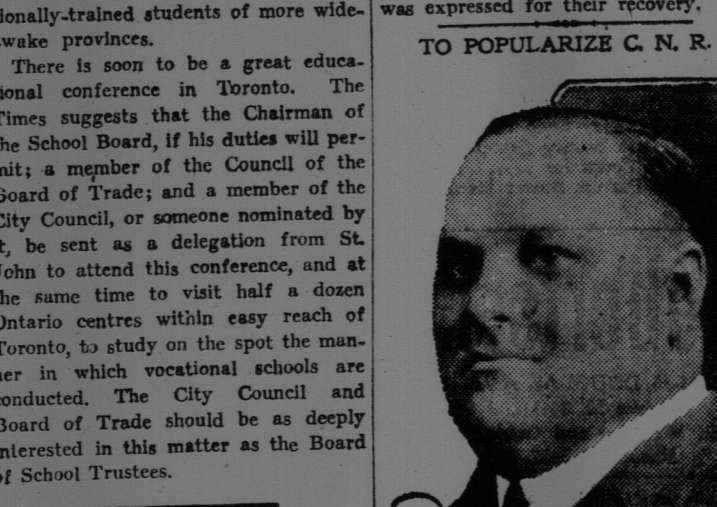

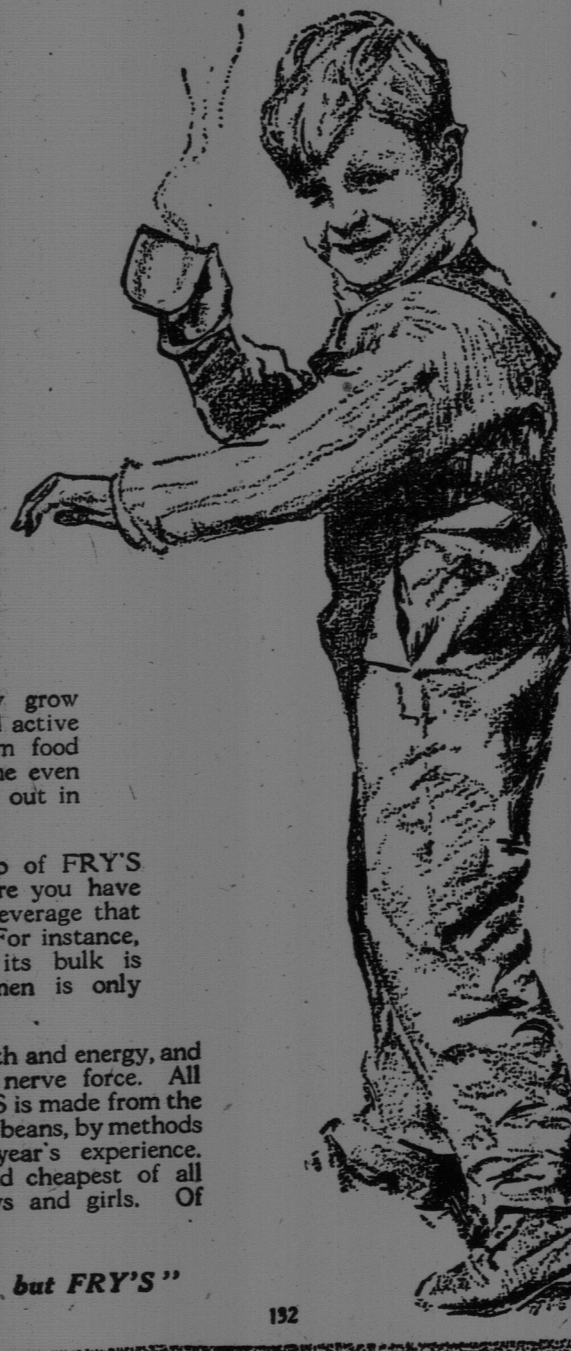

American Wife of Clemenceau Dies; Estranged 23 Years

Was Mary Plummer, of Durand, Wis., When 'Tiger' Was Her Tutor in Girls' School in Connecticut.

Milwaukee, March 20.—The death in Paris of Mme. Mary Plummer Clemenceau, estranged wife of the "Tiger" of France and war-time Premier, is announced by "The Milwaukee Journal."

Mme. Clemenceau was seventy-three years old and had been an invalid in Paris for ten years. Although separated from the "Tiger" in letters to Wisconsin relatives she denied as late as 1919 that they were divorced.

Newspaper sketches covering the life of George Clemenceau make mention that he "was divorced twenty-three years after the marriage."

When Georges Clemenceau was an exile from France and was teaching French in a young ladies' seminary at Stamford, Conn., he fell in love with one of his pupils. Her name was Mary E. Plummer and she was the belle of the village of Durand, Wis. They were married in New York at the time France and Germany were girding for the war of 1870.

Clemenceau yielded to the entreaties of his friends and returned to his native country, beginning his remarkable career which culminated after the dominant part he took at Versailles in drafting the treaty that ended the World War.

Three children were born to the couple. The Wisconsin woman proudly shared in the repeated successes of her brilliant husband. But there came a

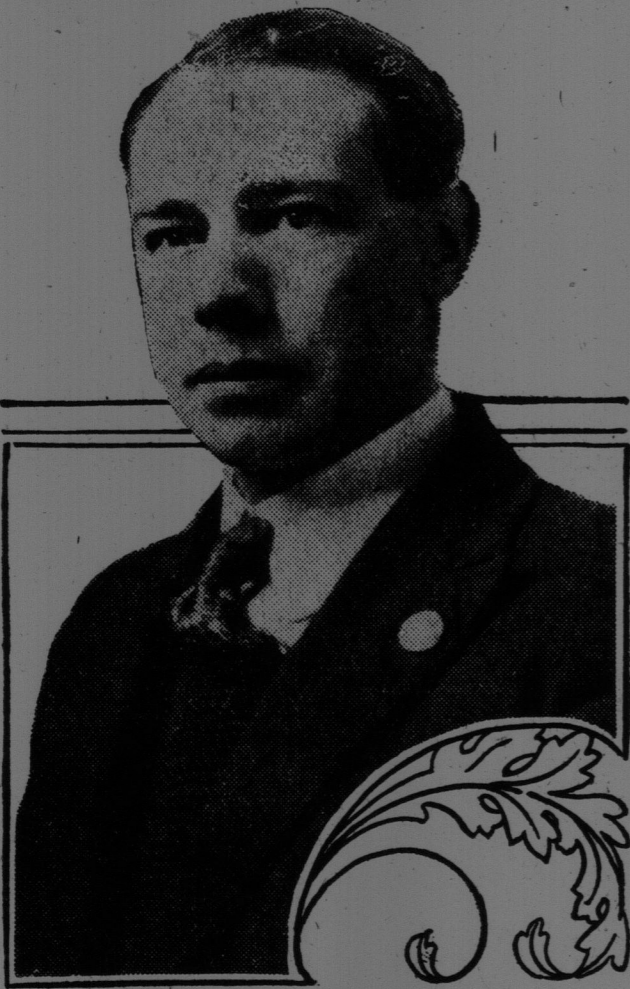
