ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

Report of the Managing Committee, For the Year 1870.

The Managing Committee of the St. GEORGE'S SOCIETY, for the year 1870, beg to present the following Report :

The balance of cash in hand, at the expiration of the year 1869, was \$305 07 ; and the total amount of receipts from all other sources, for the year, is \$1349 83, including life-members' subscriptions.

The disbursements during the year amounted to \$1293 23, leaving a balance of \$361 77 in the Treasurer's hand.

The subscriptions of life-members, amounting to \$30 00, have been set apart, and invested on deposit, at interest, according to the rule.

The investments of the Society consist of—1st. Canada Permanent Building Society Stock, \$1000 00, dividends 10½ per cent. per annum ; 2nd. Provincial Permanent Building Stock, accumulating \$100 00, ditto capitalized \$400 00, dividends 9 per cent. per annum.

City of Toronto debenture \$125 00, interest 6 per cent. ; Village of Yorkville debenture \$100 00, interest 6 per cent. per annum ; Government debentures, " Phipps' Fund," \$1000 00, interest at 5 per cent. per annum. Total, \$2725 00.

In addition to numerous requests for advice and counsel, 1229 applications for relief or assistance have been

entered upon the books, and considered during the year; and the sum of \$906 88 has been paid out, on account of such applications. The number of persons applying is about 400, being an average of three applications from each person.

The sum of \$9 50 was paid towards burial expenses, during the year.

The Committee regret to have to report the loss by death of three life-members, Colonel John Prince, Captain Clarke, and Mr. William Denyer.

The Society's annual service was celebrated in St. James' Cathedral, on Sunday, the 24th of April, kindly granted on this, and on a subsequent occasion, by the Very Rev. the Dean; prayers were read by the Society's Chaplains, and an eloquent and appropriate sermon was preached by the Rev. Henry Holland, B.A., Rector of St. Catharines. The proceeds of the collection transferred to the Treasurer amounted to \$112 43.

On the evening of Monday, the 25th of April, about 175 of the members and friends of the Society sat down to a social supper, in the Mechanics' Institute. This entertainment was in all respects pleasant and successful; and the proceeds of the sale of the tickets, after payment of all expenses, amounted to \$30 11, which was transferred to the Charitable Fund.

The Committee made arrangements with the owner of the steamboat "City of Toronto" for a moonlight excursion, on the evening of the 11th day of July; but owing to the failure of the vessel to keep her appointment, the excursion was not a success, having barely paid its own expenses.

The annual pic-nic was held on the general civic holiday, in the month of August, at the Mimico Grove; but, owing to various causes, was not so well attended as usual,

and added nothing to the funds.

The Society's excursions, while the demand for them were largely increased, and your Committee made arrangements for contributions to them, which was pretty generally met from this source, and the Committee to call on the Society.

During the year, it was found that it would be unadvisable to adopt of giving pecuniary aid, therefore made arrangements for bakers, in the City, to supply the orders of the visiting orders, which has been found to work satisfactorily, and the Society's ability to relieve them.

For some years past, it has been recommended that members to be appointed to the Office, and consider cases referred to them, to visit all cases referred to them, and increased demands, it is recommended that members to properly discharge their duties, and of Ward Committees have been found to be much more efficient, and it is recommended that it should be so.

Emigration still continues to be a matter of great importance, and through the record of years

and added nothing worth mentioning here to the Society's funds.

The tent continues to be a source of revenue, and added a net return of \$64 00 to the funds. As it has become in need of repair, and must soon be replaced, a contract has been entered into with Mr. J. Adams for a new one, of much larger dimensions, which will be ready about 1st May next.

The Society's exchequer having become nearly exhausted, while the demands upon it, so far from decreasing, were largely increased by the continued tide of emigration, your Committee made an appeal to the English public here, for contributions to the "Charitable Fund." This appeal was pretty generally responded to; and the sums derived from this source, and from subscriptions in arrear, enabled the Committee to carry on the charitable work of the Society.

During the year, it became apparent to the Committee that it would be unadvisable to continue the system hitherto adopted of giving pecuniary assistance in all cases; they therefore made arrangements with several butchers, and bakers, in the City, to supply bread and meat, upon the orders of the visiting or general Committee. This plan has been found to work satisfactorily, and to increase the Society's ability to relieve the distressed.

For some years past, it has been the practice for two members to be appointed each month to attend daily at the Office, and consider cases requiring immediate relief, and to visit all cases referred to them; but from the largely increased demands, it was found impossible for any two members to properly discharge these duties; and a system of Ward Committees has been adopted, which is found to be much more efficient; and the Committee venture to recommend that it should be continued.

Emigration still continues to increase. A glance through the record of your Committee's weekly operations

will show that their labours have been almost wholly engrossed by the necessities of English emigrants, who arrive here destitute and houseless.

It is gratifying to observe, that but a small per centage of those emigrants who were assisted by the Society in the preceding year have been applicants for relief during the year which has just passed; from which it may be reasonably inferred, as indeed the Committee in many instances know the fact to be, that they have succeeded in obtaining steady employment, and making themselves comfortable homes.

The Rev. O. Styleman Herring, B.A., Incumbent of St. Paul's, Clerkenwell, who has taken an active part in promoting emigration, having visited Canada, your Committee had several interviews with him, and endeavoured to impress upon him the importance of exercising great discrimination as to the persons who should be recommended to emigrate.

Your Committee have had ample proof, that while immigration has been of inestimable benefit to a large proportion of those sent out, there were others who are utterly unfit to earn a livelihood in this country, and who by the change have been subjected to the severest hardships and disappointments.

Finding that a strong desire existed among many of those recently arrived, to associate for the purpose of forming a fund to assist out their friends at home, and to aid by kindly counsel and advice those almost daily arriving here, a meeting was called at the Agricultural Hall, on the 7th October, which was addressed by the Rev. Mr. Herring and others, both members of the Society and immigrants; and it was then determined that the objects sought could be best accomplished by co-operation with the St. George's Society. Several of the immigrants joined the Society, and it is to be hoped that many more will, as they become able,

follow their example, and thus help to extend to others, on their arrival, the advantages they have themselves received. An Immigration Aid Fund has been commenced, to which any member wishing to assist his friends to immigrate may contribute weekly, or other subscriptions of not less than twenty cents each. There are nine contributors to this fund at present, and the amount on hand is \$61 00, which is specially invested for the benefit of the individual subscribers.

Your Committee believe that much good may result from this movement; and hope that many more Englishmen may avail themselves of the advantages the Society in this respect affords.

A special service was held in St. James' Cathedral, on Sunday, the 9th of October, at which the Chaplains of the Society, assisted by other clergymen, officiated; and at the request of the Committee, a sermon was preached by the Rev. Mr. Herring. A collection was made, which added \$51 70 to the Society's funds.

The relief of the necessities of newly arrived immigrants, will probably continue to be the principal occupation of the Society's Officers.

One of the most effectual modes of accomplishing this object, is by the pointing out to them where employment can be obtained; and, in this connection, your Committee would strongly recommend that the City authorities be memorialized, to open an Employment Office, for the laboring classes, for a certain time each day, where those seeking work, and those requiring such assistance, might be mutually served.

Your Committee would here remark, that this Society was, in its origin, never intended to become what, for the past few years, it has practically been, an Immigrants' Aid Society. The means at their disposal are too limited to enable the Committee to perform the duties of such a So-

ciety satisfactorily ; and it cannot but be manifest, that so far as they have endeavoured to do so, they have assumed duties and responsibilities which properly belong to the Province at large.

The annual distribution of Christmas cheer took place in the building formerly known as the Wesleyan Church, Adelaide Street, kindly placed at the disposal of the Society by Mr. Benjamin Walton, the present owner.

The amount collected for this purpose in money was \$684 75, besides several contributions in kind ; a list of which is herewith presented. The provisions distributed were 5666 lbs. of beef, 200 lbs. of mutton, 100 lbs. of pork, 3108 lbs. of bread, 86½ lbs. of tea, and a small quantity of coffee, rice, potatoes, and other articles, kindly sent in by the respective donors.

Tickets were issued to 480 families, numbering upwards of 2000 persons, who were thus supplied with material comforts at an inclement season, which they would otherwise have been unable to obtain. All approved applicants were liberally supplied ; and a balance unexpended of \$220 79, forms a welcome addition to the Charitable Fund.

Your Committee desire to acknowledge the liberality of William Thorne, Esq., of Holland Landing, in sending seven cords of wood, which, distributed in small quantities, has proved a great boon to many ; and also to thank Mr. J. Jacques for a donation of \$50 00 ; and Mr. J. Adams, for a handsome banner flag ; and several other friends, for special donations, of which a list will appear.

The sincere thanks of the Committee are also due to the Society's Physicians, for the promptitude and cheerfulness with which they have responded to so many applications made to them during the year.
