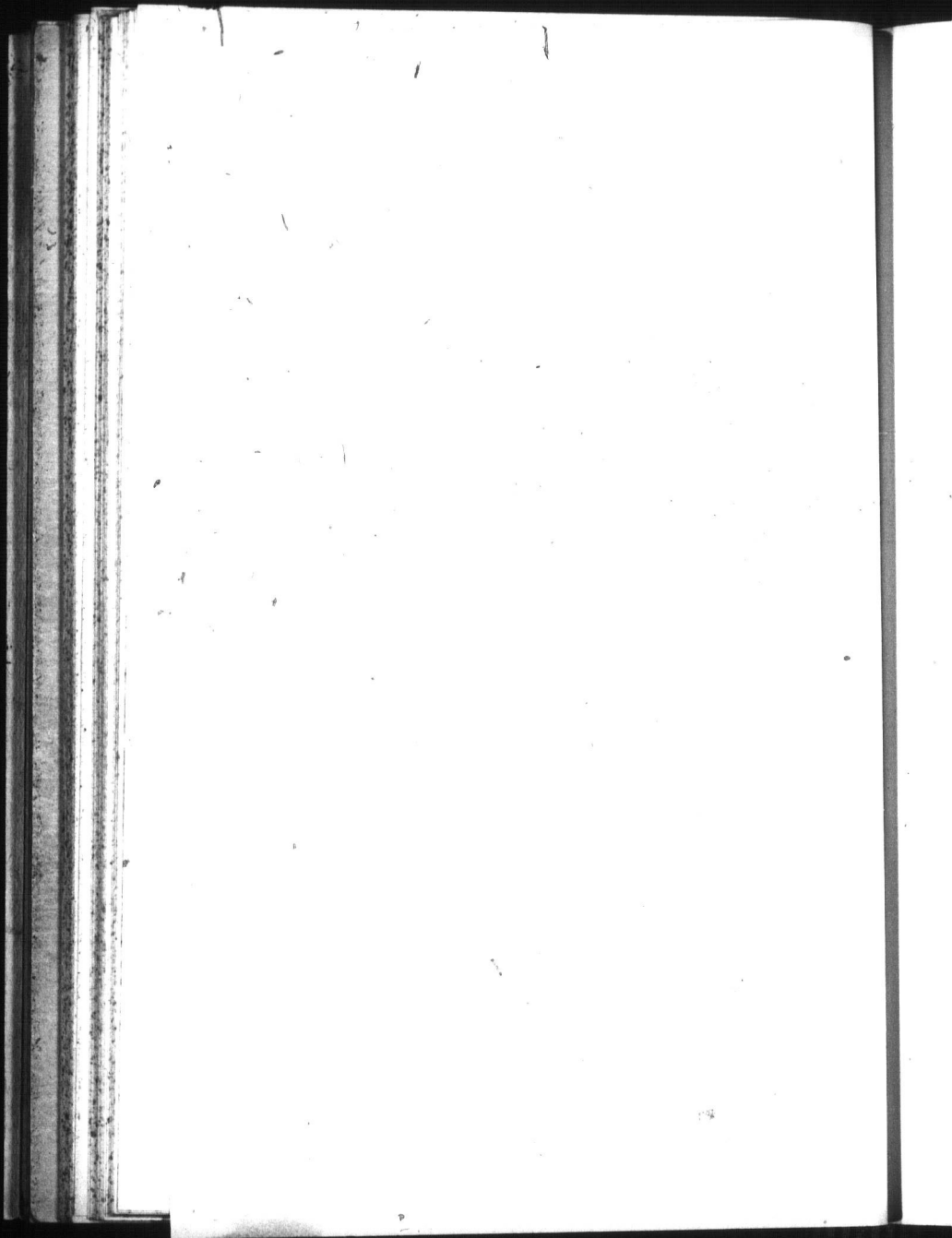

The Board of Managers would earnestly impress on every member and adherent of the congregation the great importance of using our weekly (white) envelope system regularly this year. It is our only source of revenue. It is of the utmost importance that our revenue this year be large and if all join, it can be so. Those not yet using this envelope should join in this effort. It is the duty of every one to do so and thus become helpers.

GENERAL INFORMATION.

ALL SEATS BEING FREE, the maintenance of the Church depends entirely upon the voluntary contributions of the members and adherents. It is therefore the duty of every member and adherent to undertake to give a certain sum of money EACH SABBATH.

“Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him.”—1st Cor. xvi. 2.

As envelopes will be issued to anyone contributing five cents and upwards weekly, the system is within the reach of all.

It is to be hoped that every member and adherent of the Church, whether old or young, who has an income, will ask for envelopes and give according to his or her means.

Statements will be rendered quarterly showing with what regularity contributions have been made.

A committee of the Managers is in attendance at the close of the weekly prayer meeting to allocate sittings.

Envelopes can be obtained in the vestibule before or after any of the Sabbath services, from Mr. J. Bennett who is in attendance there.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION.

Toronto, January 18th, 1899.

Pursuant to notice read from the pulpit on the two preceding Sabbaths, the Annual Meeting of the congregation was held this evening in the lecture hall.

The meeting was opened with prayer. The chair was occupied by the Rev. Alex. Gilray.

On motion of Mr. D. W. Clark, seconded by Mr. G. R. W. Thomas, Mr. William Bennett was appointed Secretary of the meeting.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting as printed in the year book were accepted as read.

The report of the Board of Managers was read by Mr. C. R. Peterkin, who moved its acceptance.

The nominations for the seven vacancies on the Board of Managers were proceeded with, which resulted in the election of the following gentlemen :—

The Scrutineers appointed by the Chairman for above election were: Messrs. J. Mann (chairman), T. Henderson, J. W. Lowes, A. E. Bastedo, D. Urquhart, J. Rowley.

The Treasurer's report, being the Financial Statement for the year 1898 as printed and distributed to the congregation, was accepted as read.

The Sabbath School report was read by Mr. W. H. Acheson, Associate Superintendent, who moved its acceptance.

The Women's Foreign Missionary Society report was read by Mrs. Gray, its President, who moved its acceptance.

The Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor was read by Miss Lottie Rhind, who moved its acceptance.

The Women's Association report was read by Mrs. R. Wilson, who moved its acceptance.

The Bible Class report was read by Mr Adamson, who moved its acceptance.

The Junior Society of Christian Endeavor report was read by Mrs. R. Wilson, who moved its acceptance.

The Speedwell Mission Band report,—Mr. C. R. Peterkin stated that there was no report as yet, but there would be one in a week or so.

The Session report was read by Rev. A. Gilray, who moved its acceptance.

The Auditors' report was read by Mr. Merson.

The above reports were then submitted to the congregation and adopted.

It was moved by Mr. C. R. Peterkin and duly seconded that the same trustees for 1898 (namely Messrs. Jas. Turnbull, A. E. Bastedo and E. H. Harcourt) be re-elected for 1899. Carried.

On motion, duly seconded, Messrs. W. G. Merson and Frank Nicholson were re-appointed auditors for 1899. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. J. Joss, seconded by Mr. J. W.

Lowes, the year book containing the various reports be printed as usual by the Managers. Carried.

It was moved in amendment by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Mann, that the matter be referred to the Managers to deal with. Lost.

The original motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Wm. Elder, seconded by Mr. W. H. Acheson, that the expenditure for the service of praise in this congregation shall not exceed the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) per year, and that the Session be respectfully recommended to abolish the body known as the Music Committee, and retain the entire control of the service of praise in its own hands.

After considerable discussion on the matter the motion was submitted to the congregation, resulting in its being carried, the result being :—

SESSION REPORT FOR 1898.

During the year 76 members were added : 32 on profession of their faith in the Saviour, and 44 by certificate.

After the roll was purged the membership stands at 840.

Eight members were removed by death.

There were three adults baptized and nineteen infants.

The Session find from year to year that the work in the S. S. C. E. and Bible class and in all departments of the congregation is growing in interest, especially in responsibility. How shall this work be best accomplished is a question that must engage the most earnest attention of all labourers in our midst, and can only be wisely and truly answered in the presence and power

of the Cross. What a call there is for humble persevering faith and love which endureth all things that His honour may be more worthily maintained for whose glory alone the Church is founded.

MANAGERS' REPORT FOR 1898.

The Managers in presenting their Annual Report for 1898, do so acknowledging God's goodness to us as a congregation.

We are pleased to note that there is an increase in the weekly offerings, both open and by envelope, over last year, which is very encouraging, and we hope it may result in a short time in our current expenses being met by this method of contributing towards the support of the ordinances, and leave all contributions from other sources to reduce the floating debt of the Church.

This is an increase of \$7.73 in open contributions, and \$44.51 in envelopes, being a total increase of \$52.24 over last year.

If all the above had contributed regularly it would have produced \$5,291.00. As a matter of fact, on account of irregularity of contributions, only \$3,783.08 was received, thus making a loss of \$1,507.92. The Managers therefore urge all contributors by envelope to do so regularly, and now kindly invite those not using them to begin at once.

The Managers are pleased to inform the congregation that they are making an arrangement by which they hope there will be a reduction in the interest account for the future of about \$189.00 per year.

In order to provide for the ordinary running expenses of the Church, the Managers require \$125.00 per Sabbath. The average collection last year was about \$91.50, leaving a shortage of \$33.50 per Sabbath to be made up by special contributions at the end of the year. This can be largely overcome by more regular contributions from those using the envelopes, and by those who do not now use the envelopes contributing in this way.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

It will be noticed from our financial statement on another page that the school has paid all its expenses, \$196.81, as well as \$121.90 to the Church Treasurer, and has for Missions \$104.00. The average collection per Sabbath has been \$8.06, an increase of \$1.00 over last year. The average attendance has been 447, a decrease from last year of 7. The number of names on the roll is 647. No books have been added to the library but \$38.78 has been spent in repairing books and purchasing catalogues. The result of the faithful teaching has been as it was in the early Church—some have been blessed. 17 have joined the church and observed the Saviour's last command. In some cases greater knowledge of Divine love seems to produce greater hardness of heart.

We gratefully acknowledge the practical assistance rendered by the Y.P.S.C.E. Sabbath School Committee. We earnestly

wish that parents would sometimes visit the school and try by home influence to make the work more profitable in the up-building of the Saviour's cause in our midst.

The year has come and gone, and many of those who were with us when it commenced have gone to other fields of usefulness and will be much missed by us. We would specially mention the name of Miss Abbie Grimason, (now wife of the Rev. T. Menzies, of British Columbia) who had been a member of our Society ever since it was organized, and who was one of our most active and valuable workers, but while we shall miss her we feel sure that she will be a true "Endeavorer" wherever she may be, and we trust that God's blessing may ever be with her in her new home.

We have, during the year, added to our roll the names of twenty-four new members, nineteen "Active" and five "Associate." There have also been a number removed, so that at the present time there are one hundred and ten names on the roll—Honorary, Active and Associate.

The total amount contributed for all purposes was \$145.42, of which \$50.40 has been devoted to Home and Foreign Missions, and \$66.64 has been handed to the Managers of the Church.

The wise selection of leaders for the various meetings denotes the time and care devoted to this part of the work by the Prayer-Meeting Committee.

The "Look-Out and Calling Committee" have done good work visiting many of the young people of the Church who were strangers.

The Missionary Committee has met with great encouragement in their work. The tract distributing each Sabbath afternoon has been continued in eight districts. Cottage prayer-meetings have been held. Good books and magazines have been distributed.

During the year our Flower Committee distributed one hundred and eighteen bouquets and twenty plants, with suitable verses of Scripture attached, amongst the sick in the congregation.

The Sabbath School Committee supplied on an average substitute teachers for three classes each Sabbath.

The Temperance Committee did good work during the Plebiscite Campaign, and 15,000 pamphlets supplied by the Alliance were distributed in this locality, and we pray that the day may yet come when this curse—"Strong Drink"—will be banished from our fair land.

In closing, we would say that the work has been very

pleasant, and we are grateful to our Heavenly Father for having permitted us to serve Him, even in a small way, and for whatever has been a means of blessing to any one we would give Him all the praise. Our earnest prayer is that He may use our Society in bringing many of the young people into His Kingdom, and into more active service for their King.

We extend a hearty invitation to all to come to our meetings, and join with us in our endeavors to serve our Master.

During the past year the Association held twelve meetings with an average attendance of seventeen.

Last January we distributed among the ladies of the congregation about 250 "cent-a-day" boxes, all have not yet been returned, but so far they have realized \$197.65.

\$15.10 was handed to the Treasurer as the result of a very enjoyable parlor concert, held in the home of Mrs. Wm. Clark, on the 5th of April.

Under the auspices of the Association two lectures were given, one by the Rev. Mr. McCaughan on the 11th of Oct., entitled "William Prince of Orange;" the other by the Rev. Wm. Patterson on the 28th of November, his subject being "Ireland and the Irish People." The combined receipts were \$179.25.

Nine quilts were made and distributed as follows: Four were sent to the North-West, three were sold, and two given in the city. Two dozen comfortable hoods were made and distributed, also a quantity of clothing was given in the city where it was needed.

A case of urgent need came to our notice last winter from Apsley, Ont., a small place where the people were suffering for the want of clothing. We made an appeal to the congregation which was heartily responded to, and about 100 pounds of clothing in very good condition was forwarded as soon as possible.

On the 23rd of December we met and filled ten Christmas baskets.

Our Visiting Committee have as far as possible called on the new families who have united with our Congregation.

In closing we cannot say we have done all that we could,

but we trust that what we have done has been in the Master's Name and for His honour. May He give us grace to serve Him more acceptably in the year upon which in His providence we have entered.
