Special to the Tribune. THE PACIFIC RAILWAY LOAN SECURED.

Sir Hugh Allan ready for Huntington - Witnesses in New York - A Close Contest - The Cabinet - Lord Dufferin.

OTTAWA, June 20. Sir Hugh Allan left England yesterday, having entirely succeeded in securing the required Pacific Railway loan from British capitalists.

On the 4th of July he will submit the terms of the loan to the Pacific Railway Directors.

On the terms being agreed to, the railway will be immediately commenced.

Location and survey parties, all completed, leave Ottawa on Saturday.

Sir Hugh Allan expresses himself ready to answer Huntington's charges. Agents have gone from Canada to New York to work up evidence and secure witnesses against the Government.

Gibbs, the new Minister, is opposed in South Ontario, and will have a close contest.

It is reported that Hugh McDonald, of Antigonish, takes Howe's place in the Cabinet, Stewart Campbell receiving a judgeship.

Lord Dufferin leaves Quebec in the Druid to-morrow for the Maritime Provinces.

Shipping Notes. Death of a New Brunswick Captain. Captain Lyons, of the ship Cosmopolis, at Antigonish, on the 11th May, 99 days, died the day after the vessel's arrival.

He had been ill during the whole of the passage. The deceased is a native of Sackville, N. B.

The steamer Linda which arrived here yesterday morning, reports having seen the ship Gov. Wilnot, hence for Liverpool, 25 miles west of Seal Island, at 2 p. m., on the 18th inst, wind W. S. W.

Waterlogged Brigantine. The Coravia, Wilson, master, arrived in London, River on the 6th inst, from Adelaide, reports that on the 29th May, in lat 37 N, lon 96 W, she passed a waterlogged brigantine, apparently of about 230 tons, with foremost masts about six feet above the deck-house, and part of the mainmast; she had a topgallant forecastle, a large poop extending to the mainmast, in which was a large hole, as if the vessel had been in collision, two wood stacked anchors on the bows, and an elliptic stern, but no name visible; she appeared to be St. John built, and to have been abandoned about a month.

The Anchor Line. Messrs. Scammell Bros. are informed by cable that the steamship Tyrion of the Anchor Line will be despatched for Halifax this port, leaving Glasgow on the 23rd and Liverpool the 28th July.

The proprietors of this line are determined to keep our trade fully supplied with steamers, and their efforts to accommodate our merchants should be fully appreciated. We hope to learn that the Tyrion will be a full ship.
