## Dominion Parliament.

OTTAWA, Feb. 29.—Sir Leonard Tilley delivered his Budget Speech. He said that while the credit and financial condition of Canada never stood better than to day, it was true that the state of trade was unsatisfactory. Depression prevailed which had been produced by a decline in lumber exports and over importation. He reviewed the expenditure of the last fiscal year and claimed that the increased expenditure of that year was no evidence of extravagance on the part of the Government. The increase had been due to the sinking fund, public works, increase of postal facilities and other necessary improvements. Where expenditure has increased over a million and a half dollars more than half of that amount could be considered a direct charge upon the country—i.e. to say, increases which would necessarily increase the taxation of the people. The increased expenditure upon capital accounts has been met by the surplus revenues, the interest upon investments and from receipts from the land grant bonds. He then proceeded to review the various departments of the Government, adopting a system of averages, that expenditure and taxation were no higher per head, in fact, less than in the last fiscal year. The revenue of last year was over a million dollars in excess of the estimate. He cited the increased deposit in the savings banks as a proof that the country was still prosperous. The reduction of wages was due to similar reduction in the United States but if we had no protective tariff the wages would have been much lower. He closed with a reflection upon the Opposition for their unpatriotic conduct in finding fault with the policy of the administration. Sir Richard Cartwright followed in a three hours speech. He claimed that one half of Sir Leonard Tilley's speech was devoted to proving that there was not a depression, and the other half to assigning causes for the depression which was known to exist. Since Confederation the population of Canada had increased about 1,000,000 while the annual volume of taxation had increased \$22,000,000. The taxation had increased from \$4 to \$9 per head of population. Ottawa, March 3.—Among the bills introduced to day was one by Hon. Mr. Costigan to prevent the adulteration of food and drugs. Any person guilty of adulterating food or drugs with any substance of a fine not exceeding \$50 for the first offence and to a fine of \$200 and imprisonment with hard labor not more than six months for the second offence. If the adulteration is not injurious to health the fine is to be not more than \$30 for the first offence and not more than \$100 for the second offence. For the adulteration of intoxicating liquors, for the first offence, the fine is \$100, or less, or imprisonment with hard labor for not more than a month; and for a second offence a fine not exceeding \$400 and imprisonment with or without hard labor not exceeding three months.
