DUBLIN, Jan. 12.—Parnell, before starting for Limerick, made an address to a large crowd who stood on the platform of the railway station. He said he would do nothing to impede the success of the movement to secure Irish independence, but on the contrary would do everything possible to further the Irish cause. He declared he would stand by the position he had assumed in the committee room of the House of Commons, when he announced he was willing to sacrifice himself provided he saw the Irish cause safe.

BERLIN, Jan. 10.—An engraver named Beck and an innkeeper named Korte, have been arrested at Munster on a charge of producing a fictitious notebook of Martin Luther, the supposed discoverer of which recently caused great excitement in the city. It is alleged a youthful apprentice of Beck, named Ebbrecht, made the engravings and ivory carvings.

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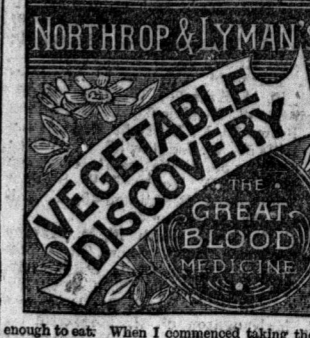
