Chicago, Oct. 17.—A warning to capital against cutting wages if financial depression comes by President Comptroller of the American Federation of Labor and a plea for harmony between employer and toiler, by Senator Hanna were made at the closing session of the National Civic Federation conference today.

It was in reply to one of the previous speakers who took occasion to tell the employer and employees, in event of a possible financial reaction, not to make any unreasonable demands on the laborer, that Mr. Comptroller spoke of the harm that would follow any attempt to lower wages. Labor leaders and employers believe that together for more harmonious relations.

After the business session of the day, a banquet was held, at which Senator Hanna, President Comptroller, members of the Federation, leading business and labor leaders were present.

Samuel Comptroller expressed his appreciation of the work of the Federation, and desired to correct misapprehensions, which he said, were the minds of some regarding organized labor, and clear false notions, so that the public and capital could go along hand in hand in the production of the wealth of the country.

He spoke against rows of freedom and individualism expressed by some at the conference. He declared that the workers would oppose any effort to cut wages; but such effort would accentuate the industrial crisis. Successful action would be taken to protect the wealth of the world to which the workmen are contributors.

He spoke against the open shop, and compared the "closed" shop to various organizations, social and professional, which, he said, bar persons objectionable to them. Mr. Comptroller took occasion to reply to Sir Wilfrid Laurier's speech on the subject of "boycott" and "hildgong" as weapons of labor, which were mentioned by the speaker.

Mr. John Stone, lecturer in the electrical department of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, who is well known for important inventions in the development of long distance telephony, has recently proved the value of a system of wireless telegraphy by sending messages from Cambridge to Lynn, Mass., a distance of about 32 miles, under conditions that have hitherto been deemed impossible. 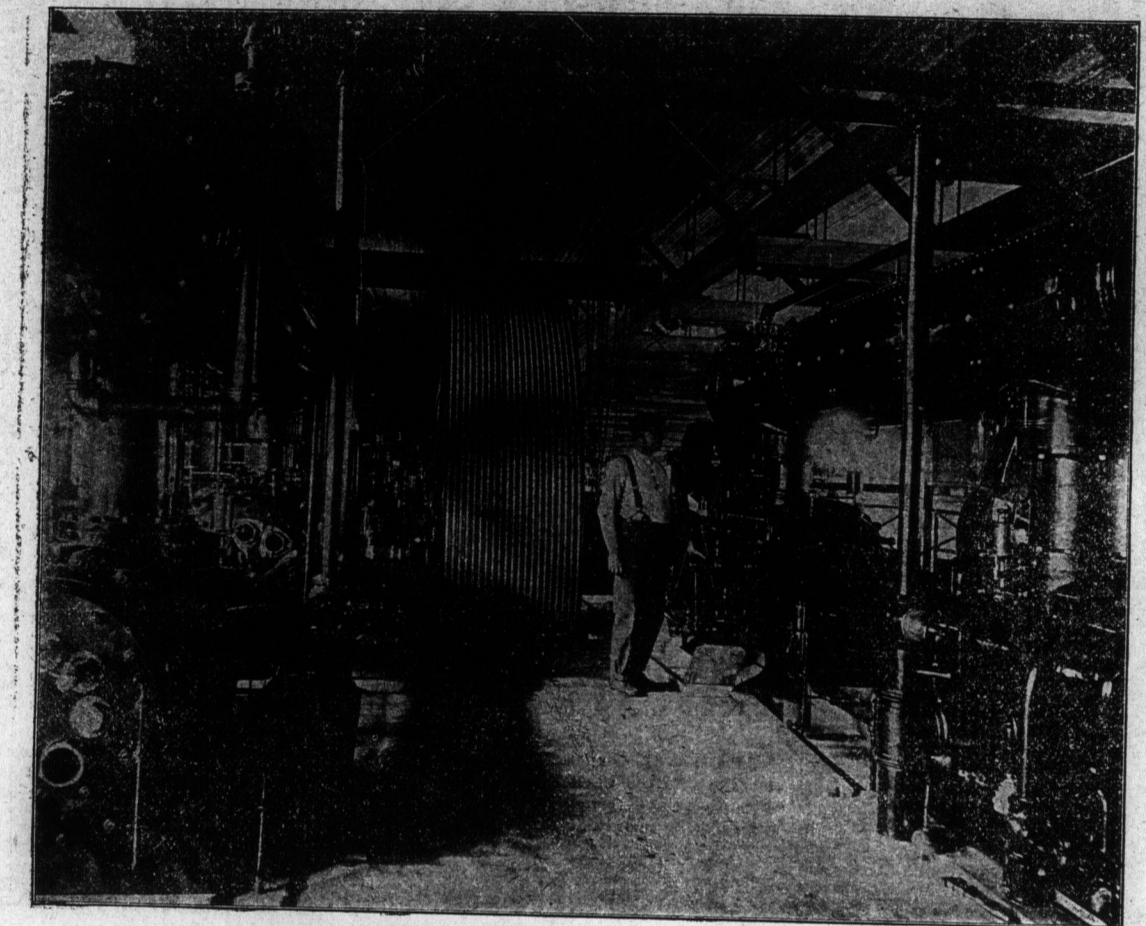
