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
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
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

Moveable Fasting-Days.

Ember-Days four Times in the Year, viz. Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday.

- 1. Next after the First Sunday of Lent.
- 2. In Whitfun-Week.
- 3. Next after the Fourteenth of September, being the Exaltation of the Cross.
- 4. Next after the Thirteenth of December, being St. Lucy's Day.

Days of Abstinence from FLESH, tho' not FASTS.

The Fridays above excepted from Fasts. All Saturdays, except those in Lent, and those on which Ewes and Ember-Days fall.

All Sundays in Lent.

- The three Rogation-Days; viz. Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before Ascension-Day.
- St. Mark's Day, out of the Diocese of Canterbury, except it falls in Easter-Week.
- If Christmas-Day falls on Friday or Saturday, it is not kept with Abstinence from Flesh.

Of Advent and Marriage.

Advent.

The first Sunday of Advent is always that which either falls on St. Andrew's Day, or the next to it, either before or after; that is, from the 27th of November, to the 3d of December.

The Time of Marriage.

T HE folemnizing of Marriage is forbidden from the First Sunday of Advent, till after Twelfth-Day; and from the Beginning of Lent till Low-Sunday; all other Times it may be folemnized.

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Necessary RULES for a Christian.

YOU must often examine your Thoughts, Words, and Actions, especially after much Business, Speaking, &c. that you may discern and amend your Faults.

Hold your Peace in such Things as belong not to you, and where your Speech is not for the Honour of God, and Good of your Neighbour.

Often call to mind your Life past, and what our Saviour Suffer'd for you in every Hour of his.

You must live as the you had nothing, and yet posses of all Things; and remember, that Meat, Drink, and Cloaths, are a Christians Riches.

Offer yourfelf entirely to God; and the you have nothing to requite his Favours with, but yourfelf, you will be comforted when you confider that He gives All, that gives Himfelf. The Apostles left their poor Boats and Nets, and received for them a most ample Reward. The poor Widow gave only two Mites, and her Oblation was preferred before those of the richest Persons.

He eafily parts with all Things, who always confiders that he must die, and be taken from them.

In publick Affemblies use no extrawagant or unusual Gestures, but in all Things observe a great Modesty and Discretion.

In all Things defire and prefer that which conduceth most to the Service and Glory of God: As o comf riance, and reli Neve but ende fon or a for it. Ever make Ad r Ejacu Dccits o

to comfort the Afflicied, reconcile such as are at Variance, visit the Sick, and such as are in Prison, and relieve the Poor.

Never go to Bed with any Disquiet on your Mind, Vords, but endeavour to Pacify your Conscience by Confes-siness, fion or an Act of Contrition, if there be Occasion d your for it.

Every Month at least Confess your Sins, often not to make Acts of Contrition, and daily use Aspirations, Honour or Ejaculatory Prayers, that so you may prevent the Peccits of the Dewil.


