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# BY-LAWS.

## No. 224—A PY-LAW

*To amend By-Law No. 210, and to form a new Statute Labor Division, and for other purposes.*

PASSED 29th April, 1872.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient on account of the 12 & 13 Side Road being rendered impassable by the dirt excavated out of the ditch not being levelled, to form a new Statute Labor Division—*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh, assembled under and by virtue of the Municipal Acts of Ontario.

I. That a new Statute Labor Division be formed of Lots 12 and 13, in Concessions 9, 10 & 11, and that Watson Guy be appointed Overseer in said Division.

II. That Lot 25, Concession 11, be detached from Division No. 38, and attached to No. 42.

III. That Henson Toy be appointed Overseer for No. 36, in place of Robert Harris, he having resigned.

## No. 225—A BY-LAW

*To Alter the Existing Limits of the Four Polling Sub-Divisions in the Township of Raleigh.*

PASSED 29th April, 1872.

**W**HEREAS it is necessary and expedient that the limits of the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Polling Sub-divisions in the Township of Raleigh should be altered, so as to meet the requirements of the Act 32nd Victoria, Chapter 21, of the Statutes of Ontario;

*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario; also an Act, Chapter 21, 32nd Vict., passed by the Legislature of Ontario;

I. That the Township of Raleigh shall be divided into Four Polling Sub-Divisions under and as required by the Act passed by the Provincial Legislature of Ontario, Chapter 21, in the year 1869.

II. That the First Division shall embrace and consist of all that portion of the Township of Raleigh, from the River Thames to the line between Concessions numbered Nine and Ten, from the eastern boundary of the Township to the line between lots numbered 12 and 13.

III. That the Second Division shall embrace and contain all that portion of the Township between the Twelve and Thirteen Side Road and the western limits of the Township, from the River Thames to the line between Concessions numbered Nine and Ten.

IV. That the Third Division shall embrace all that portion of the Township lying between the line between Concessions numbered Nine and Ten, and the line between Concessions numbered Twelve and Thirteen, from the western boundary, to the eastern boundary of the Township.

V. That the Fourth Division shall consist of and embrace all that portion of the Township lying south of the line between Concessions numbered Twelve and Thirteen, from the eastern to the western boundary of the said Township of Raleigh.

No. 226—A BY-LAW

To grant authority to the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate School in School Section No. 6, in the Township of Raleigh, to borrow the sum of Two Hundred Dollars for the purpose of building a new School House.

Passed 24th June, 1872,

WHEREAS, the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate School, in Section No. 6, in the Township of Raleigh, have made application to the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, to grant them authority to borrow the sum of two hundred dollars, to be paid in two annual instalments.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario, also the Separate School Act, Chap. 5, 26th Vic., passed 1863.

I. That it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees of the mentioned Separate School to raise by way of loan, and at a rate of interest not exceeding ten per cent. per annum the sum of two hundred dollars, to be paid in two annual instalments, from any person or persons, body or bodies corporate, who may be willing to advance the same.

No. 227—A BY-LAW

To raise certain sums of Money therein mentioned, in the Township of Raleigh, for the year A. D. 1872.

PASSED 24th June, 1872.

WHEREAS, by By-law by the Municipal Council of the County of Kent, passed the 15th day of June, 1872, and entitled a By-law to raise the sum of \$20,503 98, to meet the current expenses of the County for said year.

AND WHEREAS, the municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise the sum of \$2242 02 as their portion for said year to be paid to the Treasurer for the said County of Kent, without any deduction, on or before the 31st day of December next.

AND WHEREAS, the apportionment of the Legislative School grant for said Township of Raleigh, for the said year 1872, amounts to \$409, according to the Chief Superintendent of Common Schools.

AND WHEREAS, the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise an equal sum of money according to law in such case made and provided.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary to raise the following sums of money to meet the current expenses of the Corporation of the Township for said year 1872, viz :

For the Salaries of Township Officers, the sum of.....	\$619 60
For the support of the poor in the Township, the sum of.....	120 70
For non-resident School Accounts, the sum of.....	360 20
For Miscellaneous Accounts, the sum of.....	607 83

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario.

I. That there shall be raised, levied, and collected, upon all the rateable, real and personal property in the Township of Raleigh, the sum or rate of four and four-tenth mills on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid County purposes; the sum or rate of three and six-tenth mills on every dollar thereof to meet the current expenses of the Township for the current year; the sum or rate of one mill on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid School purposes, (except on the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of Separate Schools) the sum or rate of One Dollar upon the owner or harbinger of every dog, and the sum or rate of Two Dollars upon the owner or harbinger of every bitch entered upon the Assessment Roll of the Township for the current year.

II. That if the above sums of money so raised and collected by the said rates shall exceed in any case the amounts so required for the aforesaid purposes respectively, the Treasurer of this Corporation shall pass such excess to any deficiency that may arise to any or either of the mentioned purposes in this By-law, and if no such deficiency shall happen then all such excess, if any, shall be kept by the Treasurer, and appropriated to the general purposes of the Township under the direction and control of the Council thereof, as all the monies are which may come into his hands.

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III. That the Clerk of this Corporation is required to levy a special rate over and above all other rates against the estate Real and Personal of any School Section within this Municipality, on the request of the Trustees, (who shall furnish him on or before the First day of September with a written statement signed by such Trustees, of the amount of money to be raised for Common School purposes in such School Section), such a rate *pro rata* on all the rateable property in such School Section as will amount to the sum of money required by such Trustees for the aforesaid purposes, together with the sum of Six per cent. to defray the expense of levying and collecting the same.

IV. That the Collector is hereby authorized and required to collect according to law, the Special Rates levied on the freeholders and householders of such School Sections the sums of money set opposite their respective names, and to pay the amount so collected (on or before the 14th day of December next, after retaining the sum of Six per cent. for levying and collecting the same) to the Secretary-Treasurer of such School Section, whose receipt with the Corporate Seal attached, and deposited with the Treasurer of this Corporation, shall be his acquittance for the sums so paid.

V. It shall be the duty of the Collector of this Corporation to pay over all money collected by him to the Treasurer every two weeks under a penalty of the forfeiture of his salary, and to finally collect and pay over all moneys collected by him and make a return to the Treasurer by the Fourteenth day of December next, according to law. Provided, that this clause shall not apply to Special School Rates.

VI. That the Collector shall be allowed the same fees as is now allowed to Bailiffs of the Division Courts for all property seized, appraised, advertised and sold by him, by virtue of his office.

No. 228—A BY-LAW

To make such provision for Draining a certain locality in the Township of Raleigh hereinafter described, and for borrowing money to complete the same.

WHEREAS, James Miller and others, being a majority of the resident owners of lots of land numbered 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, and NW part 25, in the 16 Concession; also lots numbered 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25, in the 15th Concession; also the SE halves of lots numbered 19, 20, 21, 22, and S 1/2 of lot 23, in the 14th Concession of the Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of said Township of Raleigh, to cause a drain or ditch to be opened, commencing about the centre of lot No. 25, in the 16th Concession, and on the southerly side of the line of road between Concessions number 15 and 16, thence southwesterly along the said southerly side of the said line of road between between Cons. numbered 15 and 16, to a certain tap drain on lot No. 22, thence northwesterly following said tap drain to where it intersects a drain known as the Fuce Creek drain.

AND WHEREAS, the Council being of the opinion that it would benefit the said locality was the said drain made, instructed William G. McGeorge, P. L. S., to make a survey thereof and report to the Council thereon.

AND WHEREAS, the said William G. McGeorge has examined the line of the proposed drain, and made a survey, taking the levels thereof, made an estimate and reported the same to the Council as amounting to \$1244 50, and hath apportioned the said sum of \$1244 50 amongst the lots, parts of lots and roads to be benefitted by said drainage, as per schedule following and forming a part of this By-law, subject nevertheless to appeal as by law provided.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, by virtue of and under the Act passed by the Provincial Legislature of Ontario, 2nd of March, 1872, Cap. 26, to provide for drainage works.

I. That the said drain be shall in accordance with the survey, levels, and report furnished to this Council by the said William G. McGeorge, P. L. S., that Messrs. White and Dillon be and are hereby appointed Commissioners to let the said drain by public contract to the lowest bidder, (not exceeding the estimate), to take security from the contractors with good and sufficient sureties, for the due performance of the work, to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor, less fifteen per cent. until finally accepted by the Engineer, and that the Commissioners be paid the sum of \$1 50 cents each for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending the same.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected from off the lots and parts of lots to be benefited by making said drain the sum of \$1053, as set forth in said schedule, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage, and the incidental expenses attending the same, to be paid in the manner following :

III. That the sum of \$1053 shall be divided into five equal annual payments, bearing interest not exceeding the rate of five per cent. per annum, the first payment to be made in 1872, and to be continued each year until fully paid.

IV. That the Clerk shall in each year place the payments on the Collector's Roll against the lots or parts of lots as aforesaid, to be collected and paid over to the Treasurer, as other taxes are collected and paid over, to form a sinking fund to meet the payment of the Debentures hereinafter mentioned.

V. That the sum of \$191 50, assessed on the road allowances, shall be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general fund of the Municipality on the order of the Reeve.

VI. That for the purpose of raising funds to complete the making of said drain, that it shall be lawful for the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan at a rate of interest not exceeding five per cent. per annum the sum of \$342.40 for which amount the Reeve shall cause debentures to be made out in sums of not less than \$100 each, and payable on the 15th day of December in each year, such debentures to be under the Seal of the Corporation, and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer, and made payable at the Royal Canadian Bank, in the Town of Chatham, with coupons attached for the interest, payable yearly at five per cent. per annum.

VII. That in consequence of some of the lands assessed for said Drain being non-resident lands, the Collector may be unable to collect said assessments from the lands, thereby causing a deficiency to meet the Debentures as they become due, it therefore shall be lawful for the Treasurer of this Corporation to pay from the general funds of the Township

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such sums as will make good such deficiency. And he shall replace the same to the general funds so soon as said sums are collected from said lands.

VIII. That this By-law shall be published in the *Chatham Banner* newspaper for four weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

**No. 229—A BY-LAW**

*To make provisions for Draining a certain locality in the Township of Raleigh hereinafter described, and for borrowing money to complete the same.*

**WHEREAS**, Isaac Dairymple and others being a majority of the resident land owners of the lots numbered 19, 20 and 21 in the 15th Concession of the Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of said Township of Raleigh, to cause a drain or ditch to be opened, commencing at the line between Lots number 20 and 21, thence southwesterly across said lot number 20 to the line between lots number 19 and 20, thence running northwesterly along the west side of the line between the said lots numbered 19 and 20 to the drain already made on the line of road between the 14th and 15th Concessions.

**AND WHEREAS**, the Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit the said locality was the said drain made, have instructed Sherman Malcolm, P. L. S., to make a survey thereof and report to the Council thereon.

**AND WHEREAS**, the said Sherman Malcolm, has examined the line of the proposed drain, and made a survey, taken the levels, furnished plans, with an estimate of the costs of constructing said drain and reported the same to the Council as amounting to the sum of \$337 84 and hath apportioned the said sum of \$337 84 amongst the lots and parts of lots to be benefitted by said drainage as per Schedule following and forming a part of this By-law, subject nevertheless to appeal as by law provided.

*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, by virtue of and under the Act Cap. 26, passed by the Provincial Legislature of Ontario, March 2d, 1872, to provide for drainage works.

I. That the said drain shall be made in accordance with the survey, levels, and report furnished to this Council by the said Sherman Malcolm, P. L. S., and that Messrs. White and Dillen be and are hereby appointed Commissioners to let the said drain by public contract to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate) to take security from the contractor with good and sufficient sureties for the due performance of the work, to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor, less fifteen per cent. until finally accepted by the Engineer, and that the Commissioners be paid the sum of \$1 50 each for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending the same.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected from and off the lots and parts of lots to be benefitted by making said drain the sum of \$337 84 as set forth in said Schedule, to be paid in manner following.

III. That the said sum of \$337 84 shall be divided into five equal annual payments, bearing interest not exceeding the rate of five per cent. per annum; the first payment to be made in 1872, and continued in each year until fully paid.

IV. That the Clerk shall in each year place the payments on the Collector's Roll against such lots or parts of lots as aforesaid, to be collected and paid over to the Treasurer as other taxes are collected and paid over to form a sinking fund to meet the payments of the Debentures hereinafter mentioned.

V. That for the purpose of raising funds to complete the making of said drain, it shall be lawful for the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan, at a rate of interest not exceeding five per cent. per annum; the sum of \$270 27

for which amount the Reeve shall cause Debentures to be made out in sums of not less than \$100 each, and payable on the 15th day of December in each year, such Debentures to be under the Seal of the Corporation and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer, and made payable at the Royal Canadian Bank, in the Town of Chatham, with coupons attached for the interest payable yearly at five per cent. per annum.

VI. That in consequence of some of the lots and parts of lots assessed for said Drain being non-resident lands, the Collector may be unable to collect said assessments from the lands, thereby causing a deficiency to meet the Debentures as they become due, it therefore shall be lawful for the Treasurer of this Corporation to pay from the general funds of the Township such sums as will make good such deficiency; and he shall replace the same to the general funds so soon as said sums are collected from said lands.

VII. That this By-law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for four weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

### No. 230—A BY-LAW

*To make provision for Draining a certain Locality in the Township of Raleigh hereinafter described.*

**WHEREAS** John E. Bennett and others, being a majority of the resident owners of the South-East halves of Lots of land numbered 7, 8 and 9, in the 10th Concession, and the North-West halves of Lots of land numbered 7, 8 and 9, in the 11th Concession of the Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh to cause a drain to be opened, commencing on the Easterly side of the Six and Seven side road, and on the South side of the line of road between Concessions numbered 10 and 11, running Easterly along said line of road, across Lots numbered 7, 8 and 9, to a Creek on Lot number 10.

**AND WHEREAS**, the Council being of opinion that the opening of the said Drain would greatly benefit the mentioned lots, as well as the line of road between the said Concessions No. 10 and 11, instructed Wm. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., to examine the said line and report thereon.

**AND WHEREAS**, the said Wm. G. McGeorge has examined the line of the proposed drain and reported the same with an estimate of the cost, amounting to the sum of \$728, and hath apportioned the said sum of \$728 amongst the lots, parts of lots and roads to be benefited, as per schedule hereunto annexed, and forming a part of this By-law, subject to appeal as by law provided:

*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, by virtue of and under the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario.

I. That the lots of land above described shall be drained in accordance with the report and estimates of the same made by William G. McGeorge, Provincial Land Surveyor.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected from and off the lots and parts of lots to be benefited by the said drainage, (along with the ordinary assessed taxes of the present year) the sum of \$510, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage and the costs incidental thereto, and that the sum of \$218 assessed on the road allowance shall be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality on the order of the Commissioner.

III. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-law shall be let to public contract to the lowest bidder (and not in any case to exceed the estimate), who shall give security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

IV. That Messrs. McNeil and Dillon are hereby appointed Commissioners for the letting and superintending of the work, who are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor, less fifteen per cent. until finally accepted by the Engineer.

V. That the said Commissioners shall receive the sum of \$1.50 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending the same.

VI. That this By-law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

### No. 231—A BY-LAW

To authorize the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate School in School Section No. 4, in the Township of Raleigh, to borrow the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, for the purpose of erecting a new School House.

PASSED the 19th day of September, 1872.

**WHEREAS**, the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate School in School Section No. 4, in the Township of Raleigh, have made application to the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, to grant them authority to borrow the sum of two hundred dollars for the purpose of erecting a new School House.

*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario, and School Acts now in force.

I. That it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate School in School Section No. 4, in said Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan, and at a rate of interest not exceeding the sum of ten per cent. per annum, the sum of two hundred dollars for the purpose of erecting a new School House, (to be paid as follows, namely one hundred dollars on the 31st day of December, 1872; fifty dollars on the 31st day of December, 1873, and fifty dollars on the 31st day of December, 1874,) from any person or persons, body or bodies corporate, who may be willing to advance the same.

### No. 232—A BY-LAW

To Define the limits of the Different Electoral Divisions (for Municipal Elections) in the Township of Raleigh; to fix the Polling Places therein, and to appoint Returning Officers therefor.

PASSED the 21st day of November, A. D., 1872.

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary and expedient (and for a more equal distribution of the Municipal Electors) that the Electoral Divisions number one and two in the Township of Raleigh should be enlarged by extending the same to the centre of the 9th concession.

*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled under and by virtue of the acts Respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario.

I. That the First Electoral Division shall embrace and contain all that portion of the Township of Raleigh lying between the centre of the 9th concession and the River Thames, from the line between the lots numbered 12 and 13 and the eastern boundary of the township; that the polling place shall be at the school house in School Section No. 12, and that James Rhodes shall be the Returning Officer therefor.

II. That the Second Electoral Division shall embrace and contain all that portion of the Township of Raleigh lying between the centre of the 9th concession and the River Thames

from the western limits of the said township to the line between the lots numbered 13 and 13; that the Polling place shall be at the common school house in School Section Number Four, and that Abraham D. Shadd shall be the Returning Officer therefor.

III. Taylor shall be the Returning Officer therefor.

### No. 234—A BY-LAW

To appoint and confirm the appointment of certain Municipal officers in the Township of Raleigh for the year 1873.

PASSED the 17th day of February, 1873.

**W**HEREAS it is necessary that the Municipal officers appointed by this Corporation should be appointed under the seal thereof.

*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh assembled under and by virtue of the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada, and the amendments thereto passed by the Provincial Legislature of Ontario.

I. That George Coutts, appointed by the Reeve, and David Smith, appointed by the Council, are hereby confirmed in the office of Auditors, and that their salary shall be Eight Dollars each, and no more.

II. That Joseph Randall is hereby confirmed in the office of Assessor, and it shall be his duty to complete and return his roll to the Clerk not later than the 16th day of April, and that his salary shall be sum of Eighty-five dollars, and no more.

III. That Martin Dillon (the younger) is hereby confirmed in the office of Collector, and he is hereby required to enter into bonds himself in the sum of \$5,000.00, and other good and lawful securities to the amount of \$10,000.00, which bond will require him to collect all rates levied on the Collector's Roll, and to pay over the same (less the Special School Rates which he will have to pay to the Secretary-Treasurers of the School Sections from which such Special School Rates were collected) to the Treasurer of this Corporation in manner

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following, that is to say, on his receiving his Collector's Roll he shall commence to collect the rates, and shall pay in all moneys received by him for taxes every two weeks, and make his returns to the Treasurer as required by law, at a salary of \$50.00, and no more, except the sum of five per cent. allowed for collecting the Special School Rates.

IV. That Martin Drew is hereby confirmed in the office of Inspector of Licenses, and that his salary shall be the sum of \$16.00, and no more.

XI. That a New Statute Labor Division be made to consist of lots 12 and 13, in Concessions 12, 13 and 14, and that Andrew Broadbent be Overseer, known as No. 65.

XII. That Lots 12 and 13, in Concessions 5, 6, 7, A. and 8, be also another Division, and that Robt. Slade be overseer, known as No. 66.

XIII. That the Statute Labor Divisions along the Town Lines be done away with, and the Clerk enter the Statute Labor on these lots on the Rolls of the adjoining Divisions.

## No. 235—A BY-LAW

To appropriate certain sums of money for the Improvement of Roads and Bridges in the Five Rural Road Divisions in the Township of Raleigh, and to appoint Commissioners for the same.

PASSED 17th February, 1873.

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary and expedient in accordance with the 89th Section of the Assessment Act of 1868 & '69, that the sum of \$429 50 accruing from non-resident lands Statute Labor Tax, (as reported by the Clerk,) should be appropriated as the law directs.

**AND WHEREAS**, it is necessary that an additional sum of \$1500 should be appropriated for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township.

*Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, by virtue of and under the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario, and the Assessment Act of 1868 and 69.

I. That the sum of \$1929 50 be and is hereby appropriated for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh, in accordance with By-law No. 38, of the consolidated By-law of 1865, and the above recited Acts, that is to say:

III. That the following persons be and are hereby appointed Commissioners for the several Rural Road Divisions, viz:—For the First Rural Road Division—Gilbert H. Dolson. For the Second Rural Road Division—Thomas J. Crow. For the Third Rural Road Division—Timothy Dillon. For the Fourth Rural Road Division—Stephen White. For the Fifth Rural Road Division—Malcolm McNeil.

IV. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to withhold the following amounts (as overdrawn) from the respective Divisions, which are charged with the same on the Balance Sheet of the Auditor's Report of the Treasurer's Accounts, viz:—From Rural Road Division No. 1, the sum of \$184 48; from Rural Road Division No. 2, the sum of \$20 04; and from Rural Road Division No. 3, the sum of \$114 38, and to charge the several Divisions with said sums.
