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YORK LANDS GO FOR TAXES

Some Interesting Matters in Connection With the Sales Yesterday—People Absent There to Make Money.

Punctually at 11 o'clock yesterday morning Mr. J. Macdonald, Treasurer of the County of York, opened the sale for taxes, in the Council chamber. After reading the warrant directing the sale, Mr. Macdonald depicted on the floor of the King to act as auctioneer. He announced that each parcel would be offered for sale at the amount of the arrears of taxes. If there should be two or more bidders the parcel would be sold to the one who would accept the smallest amount of land.

Throughout the day about 60 or 70 persons were in attendance. Some were seeking to get lots adjacent to their present holdings, some were looking for good investments. Some were buying to get a parcel free of mortgages and others preferred a tax sale as a cheap and simple method of foreclosing.

As is generally known, a purchaser at a tax sale does not become the actual owner until the expiration of a year. At the time of purchase he pays the purchase money to the County Treasurer. Any time during the year the former owner or his representative may pay the amount with a bonus of 10 per cent. Should he not do so, the parcel is sold to the highest bidder.
