

Montreal, July 28.—The new Cunard liner Andania arrived in port yesterday on her maiden voyage from Southampton. Captain Miller today expressed himself as well pleased with the vessel's behavior on the passengers were unanimous in their appreciation of the boat's accommodations. Being a new ship, no attempt was made to test the speed of the Andania, and as a dense fog was experienced for three days it would have been impossible. Including detention caused by the fog, which totalied 47 hours, 34 minutes, the Andania covered the 2,152 miles from Bishop's Rock, outside of Southampton, to Father Point, in 7 days, 20 hours, 36 minutes, an average speed of 13.32 knots an hour. 


