Imported Goods Shall Be Legibly Marked in English or French Indicating Originating Country.

Ottawa, Ont., June 17—(Canadian Press)—Budget resolutions were taken up in the Commons yesterday. Amendments to the Marking Act were approved in committee with but little discussion. The amendment provided that the governor in council may order that goods imported into Canada "shall be marked" in legible English or French words so as to indicate the country of origin. The Act before amendment made marking the country of origin compulsory.

Newspaper Report Had Ships Sold to British Interests.

Ottawa, Ont., June 18—(Canadian Press)—"I hope the good news is true." S. W. Jacobs, Liberal, George Ellenne Cartier, asserted in the Commons yesterday when asking the Government as to the truth of a press report that ships of the Canadian Government Merchant Marine were to be sold to British interests.

"It is a newspaper report," the Prime Minister replied.
"It would be good news to private interests," Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen interjected.

Port Jarvis, N. Y., June 18—A cloud-burst which held this city in its grip for nearly 24 hours ended this afternoon, leaving practically the entire city under two to six feet of water. Officials estimated that the damage would amount to nearly \$1,00,000.






