Londoners' Coal was Taxed to Pay Cost of Construction.

After the great fire in London in 1666 it was decided to erect a new St. Paul's. The first stone of the new church was laid on June 21, 1675, and it was thirty-five years later before the Rev. Dr. Denby could be chanted on the completion of the work.

The rebuilding was regarded in the light of a national undertaking, and to defray the cost the government imposed a duty of 1s. 6d. per chaldron on sea-borne coal entering the Thames.

The duty was imposed to make the church the property of the public, and according to Mr. Denby, the coal duty realized £50,151 18s. 6d. and public subscriptions and other gifts raised the total to £57,623 12s. 3d.

The stone used in the building is from the famous Portland quarries, and was selected because of its durability in regard to both weather and smoke.


