GROCERIES.

There has been more activity in groceries during the past week and trade has developed some very strong features. The advance in refined sugars at Halifax has firmed up the market there. Granulated is now firmly held at 4% to 5c and yellow at 3% to 4% c. The demand for canned goods has been much more active both on local and outside account. Several good-sized lots of tomatoes have been sent to the States lately and some wholesalers say the entire pack will disappear before the new season opens. Soaps, both bar and laundry, have advanced another 4c, owing to the scarcity and dearness of tallow. Dried fruits are in better supply and a steady demand is reported. Payments are fair.

LEATHER. to special features have developed in the during the week just closed. A big strovement in trade is reported and a ge amount of leather has passed into nufacturers' hands lately. No. 3. Sheepskins are in active demand at \$1 to \$1.20, according to the amount of wool. Calf skins are scare and in demand at 7c to 9c per pound.

Local mills have taken considerable pulled wool lately, but trade has developed no new features as regards prices, which are generally steady. Farmers' offerings of fleece have been light. Local dealers are paying 18c to 19c for good combing wool. Quotations are: Fleece—Canada combing 18c to 20c, fine trashy and tub-washed 18c to 19c, clothing 21c to 24c, according to grade; Southdown 25c to 28c. In pulled wools there is a scarcity of good extra and super wools in this market, and closely sold up at outside prices; extra 25c to 27c, supers 21c to 23c, pulled black 18c to 20c, pickings 8c to 10c,

Travelers have just about finished taking orders for spring goods, and reports received from them from time to time indicate a volume of business equal to if not above that of last year. Outside of a good enquiry for rubbers trade is as quiet as it usually is during the month of February. Heavy goods of all kinds are moving slowly. Fashion rules that colored goods shall again be in vogue this season, and as a result the orders booked for tan and scarlet boots and shoes have been even larger than last year. Several manufacturers report the turnout of tan goods this season very little short of those of dark, and say they have had some difficulty keeping pace with orders. Payments are fully up to those of the corresponding month last year.

There are no special features to note. The movement in heavy goods has been restricted somewhat by expected tariff changes, but a fair sorting trade has been done during the week. A good many orders for spring delivery are seing booked, and from present indications a good lively trade may be looked for as soon as navigation opens. A good enquiry is reported at the moment for ingot tin and tin plates, the latter at firm prices owing to the moderate stock held here. There are no changes to note in prices, and collections are reported by the different wholesalers interviewed to be fairly good for this season of the year.

The Boom in Tallow. The recent big advance and subsequent firmness of the tallow market is, as is usually the case with an advancing article, causing much speculation among those immediately miterested as to the future-of this commodity. In Liverpool tallow has advanced three shillings during the last five days, and local dealers who have any quantity to sell are correspondingly firm in their views. We might use the singular number in referring to the dealers who have much tallow to sell, for the bulk of the supply on this market is held by one man. Until lately he has sold at 8c, but at the moment 8% to 9c are his prices, and he is reported to have said that he will not go below them. It is the general opinion of dealers that the situation warrants still higher prices for tallow, taking into consideration the moderate supply held here, current light arrivals and the advancing markets both in the United States and Europe. The recent advance here has affected both the grocery and leather trades. Soap in the former has advanced 1c for both bar and laundry, and the feeling in harness leather is much firmer, due directly to the high price for tallow, which is required in its manufacture. much speculation among those immediately

Ontario payments have been good, as we remarked last week, but collections in the Northwest and Manitoba are reported rather slow.



TIPS FROM WALL-STREET.

New York, Feb. 15.—Life was put into the stock market this morning by sudden and sharp breaks in the industrials. Sugar dropped half a dozen points. All the other trust stocks sympathized. In some stocks a strenuous effort was made to create an apparent borrowing demand for some rather dangerously situated stocks. This is practically true in sugar trust. Representatives of the clique were bidding a premium for loans of the stock just before the close of the market, but this is an old device and very transparent.


