Food and Drink for the Sick.

In acute inflammatory rheumatism, meat is any form should be avoided, while fruits, green vegetables, and vegetable soups are likely to prove beneficial.

Imperial Drink.—Dissolve from two to three drachms of tartaric acid in a quart of boiling water, add the juice of a lemon and a little lemon peel...

LEMONADE.—Pare thinly the rind of a lemon into a jug with an ounce of white sugar and pour over them one pint of boiling water.

MILK LEMONADE.—Sugar, one and a half pounds, dissolved in a quart of boiling water, together with half a pint of lemon juice and one and a half pints milk.

LIQUOR TEA.—Place in a jug one ounce of bruised linseed, two drachms bruised licorice root, half an ounce of lemon juice, and pour over them one pint of boiling water.
