CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS. ONTARIO.

Business in lumber cannot be called active, but there is a steady movement which augurs well for a healthy fall trade. Any uneasiness which has been exhibited has been confined to dealers in certain localities who purchased heavily early in the season and subsequently found their stocks rather large. This has been the case to a moderate extent in Toronto, where the lumber consumption has been restricted by the strike in the building trades. Now that this obstacle has been removed and building operations are again proceeding unimpeded, a large consumption of lumber may be expected. Work on many buildings was suspended during the strike, while other projects remained in an embryo state. Some of the latter

will doubtless be commenced immediately, while others may be deferred until next spring.

Price lists issued by manufacturers show little change. For inch No. 1 cuts and better in white pine \$50 at the mill is asked, and for 1 1/2 inch \$55. There is a good demand for box lumber. Ten-inch box and common is held at \$16 for 10-foot lengths and \$17 for 12 and 14-foot lengths. Mill culls are firm at \$12.50 for 1 x 12 inch, 6 to 16 feet. In hemlock the call is chiefly for inch and dimension. Most of the mills quote \$12.50 for 1 x 10 and 12-inch up to 16 feet in length, while \$15 is asked for \$22 feet.

Prices of white pine shingles have been shaded about ten cents per thousand, this being due to the weakness of red cedars. The production of the white pine variety is gradually diminishing, as there is very little money in manufacturing pine timber into shingles.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The feeling in lumber circles throughout the Eastern Provinces is one of great confidence. It is believed that no difficulty will be found in disposing of the entire production of spruce lumber at remunerative prices. There is a distinctly better feeling in respect to British deals.

Information concerning the drives is of a more encouraging character. The St. John river has risen rapidly and logs are running freely. It is said that the river is full of logs for fifteen miles up from Fredericton. The main corporation drive is expected to reach the Douglas boom in about ten days. Present indications are that fewer logs will be hung up than was anticipated a month ago. The Fredericton Boom Company discontinued operations at the Mitchell boom last week, notwithstanding that several million feet of log are yet to be rafted. The action of the company has been severely criticized by lumbermen.

There is no material improvement in the cedar shingle market. Extras are still selling as low as \$340 on Boston rate of freight.

MANITOWA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

There is a very active demand in Winnipeg for lumber, as building operations are on an extensive scale. It is estimated that the value of building work in that city this year will reach upwards of \$5,000,000. The mills are taxed to their full capacity to supply the demand, although of late larger shipments have been received from British Columbia and the United States. Dimension timber has been advanced 50 cents per thousand.

The lumber situation in British Columbia

is still complicated. The over-production of logs has resulted in a drop in price of about \$4 per thousand, and unless the Provincial Government should grant permission to the loggers to export some of the stock, there does not appear to be much probability of immediate relief. The proposal of the loggers is that they be allowed to export the logs now in the water up to 50,000,000 feet, or that they be given export privileges for a period of six months. As stated last week, the logging camps are to be closed down for a period of 45 days from August 1st next.

The shingle market is somewhat demoralized. The mills have large stocks on hand and are not experiencing a very active demand. One of the largest concerns is said to have become temporarily embarrassed on account of the over-production.

The Builders' Exchange of Vancouver have shown sympathy with the action of the mill men in refusing to sell lumber to the contractors, apparently believing that this action was in the best interests of the trade and likely to bring about a termination of the labor difficulties. The woodworkers have demanded a nine-hour day, and the mill men claim that they cannot grant such concession and compete in the lumber market of the North-West with the mills of the Lake of the Woods and the United States. As the general business of the city and district is being affected, it is thought that steps will be taken to bring about an early settlement.

UNITED STATES.

The strike in the building trades in New York City having been settled, it is expected that considerable activity in the demand for lumber will follow. Already there has been an improvement in the situation. In the outlying districts the yards are busy, with some dealers actually rushed with business. Retail dealers are placing orders freely, as during the strike period they were averse to increasing their stock to any extent. The call for spruce is equal to the supply, with prices steady and some predictions of an advance. It will probably be found difficult, however, to put prices to a much higher basis without restricting the consumption. There is a better feeling in the pine trade, the scarcity of the lower grades having offset the tendency towards weakness shown by the upper grades. Box lumber is the best seller in the list and is held for high figures by most shippers.

The hardwood situation shows little change. Stock is still scarce, although the new cut is coming onto the market quite freely. Efforts to make an exceedingly large cut in the South-Western States were thwarted by floods, and it is doubtful if prices would decline materially even in the event of a curtailment in the demand, which at the present time seems very improbable. Maple is especially

scarce, while black ash cannot be obtained in any quantity.

The shingle market is characterized by uncertainty. Owing to the over-supply, dealers do not know what price to ask for Pacific Coast red cedars. White cedar shingles of first quality range from \$3.40 to \$3.50 in the Eastern States. The lath market is firm on the basis of \$3 for cargoes, New York delivery, while car quotations are \$3.15 for 1½ inch and \$3.30 for 1¾ inch.

GREAT BRITAIN.

A few weeks ago British dealers were disposed to let go of their stocks on the belief that they would be able to replenish them at a lower price later in the season. In this respect there has been a change of opinion, as it is now generally admitted that materially lower prices this year for Canadian lumber are out of the question. Trade, however, is only moderately active, and should the business of the country become depressed, it would probably be reflected in lower prices for lumber for next year's delivery. White pine deals continue very strong, as the supply is small and no satisfactory substitute has yet been found. There is a surplus of the lower grades of some classes of lumber, but this is not the case in respect to white pine, the splendid demand in the United States having prevented heavy shipments to Great Britain. For a quantity of first quality broad pine deals \$30 was recently obtained at a public sale, and as much as \$32 is being asked for first quality c. i. f. London. Spruce prices are firm. Some box-makers who have been obtaining their supplies from the Baltic are turning their attention to Canadian spruce, owing to the fact that the Baltic production has been advanced in price. Quebec waney timber is very scarce. Some dealers have been compelled to withhold quotations until they could learn more definitely as to the quantity likely to be shipped from this side.

The Board of Trade returns show that during the first six months of this year the quantity of hewn and sawn lumber imported into Great Britain was 3,314,245 loads, as compared with 2,914,246 loads for the same period in 1902. The import from Canada was about the same as last year.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

The barque Grenada sailed from Bear River, N. S., last week for Buenos Ayres, with a cargo of lumber.

Thomas Denton, of Saginaw, Mich., has finished shipping 100,000 cubic feet of square timber to England via Quebec.

T. Wallace, of North Bay, has completed the delivery of 225,000 ties required for 70 miles of the Temiskaming Railway.

The Shier Lumber Company, of Bracebridge, Ont., are loading their hardwood on scows and shipping via the Portage to Huntsville.

The schooner Laura C is loading deals at Three Rivers, Que., for the United Kingdom, on account of Dobell, Beckett & Company.

The Saginaw Lumber & Salt Company of Sandwich, Ont., is reported to have bought a raft of 4,000,000 feet of logs from the Edmund Hall Estate. It will be manufactured at Sarnia.

The Ontario Government is asking for tenders for the construction of superstructure of a bridge across the Winnipeg river at Rat Portage. It is understood that considerable timber will be required.

The Department of Interior at Ottawa wants tenders by August 12th for a license to cut timber on Berth No. 1078 on the west shore of Lake Winnipeg, in the Province of Manitoba, and comprising an area of two square miles.

The steamer Deremore is loading a cargo of deals at Chicoutimi, Que., for London. The steamer Aldernay took on a quantity of deals at Pierreville and will complete her cargo at Montreal. It is destined for London. The steamer Nordvoen loaded at Montreal and completed her cargo at Three Rivers en route to the United States.

The barque "Inverdrule" has loaded a cargo of deals in the Louise Basin, Quebec, for H. R. Goodday & Company. The "Manchester Engineer" and the "Hermes" are loading at Quebec for the same port on account of Goodday & Company. The "Hyundo" is loading at Sillery Cove, for Dobell, Beckett & Company.

The quantity of Canadian white pine deals in the public docks at London on June 30th of this year was 766,000 pieces as compared with 919,000 pieces at same date last year. The stock of spruce deals was 616,000 pieces, as against 731,000 pieces last year. Oak, elm, ash and birch timber also show a decrease.

Messrs. Churchill & Sim, London, England, referring to Canadian lumber, say that prices for really good deals reach higher level, but always, of course, for small quantities. Oak and birch timber have been the best of the hardwoods, elm, ash and white pine timber being neglected. The import from the St. Lawrence up to June 30th was 381,000 pieces of pine deals, 230,000 feet of spruce deals and 15,000 pieces of birch planks, all showing a marked decrease as compared with the corresponding period of last year. From New Brunswick the import was 7,000 pieces pine deals, 250,000 pieces of spruce deals and 80,000 pieces of birch planks.

THE OTTAWA VALLEY.

(Correspondence of the CANADA LUMBERMAN.)

Inquiry goes to show that prices, while showing no advance, continue firm. The fact that so much of the lumber was contracted for months ahead in big blocks is probably accountable for this. In conversation with several manufacturers and dealers it was learned that the LUMBERMAN quotations are about right. It is sometimes a difficult matter to get a line on prices on account of the great difference in grades and styles handled by the different mills to suit the wishes of individual customers.

The mills of the Ottawa district, and the Nipissing and Georgian Bay districts as well for that matter, are now shipping steadily on the present season's cut of white pine lumber. Present season's deals were first on their way to second hands some time ago. With the assurances that practically all their logs are clear of the streams running into the main rivers, the lumber operators are turning their attention more closely than ever to the work at the mills. The moderation of the industrial turmoil in New York City has cleared the way to some extent for the receipt of Ottawa district lumber, but the advent of vacation season has on the other hand given business in some quarters a set-back. Lots of lumber is being sent out of the Ottawa and district yards by both rail and water nevertheless. A shortage of cars for the American trade is complained of, though shipments to Canadian points are not interfered with.

It's the large men, however, who are getting in their fine licks on the lumber carrying business. It is not an uncommon sight to see a tow of from four to eight barges on the move bound for Montreal for export. Upwards of 2,500,000 feet of lumber has been seen in one of these flotillas. The Canadian barges carry about 300,000 feet apiece, but the American

barge's, on account of low bridges and small canals, have to be content with from 120,000 to 150,000 feet each. This year's shipments by water are far in excess of those of last year.

An important sale of timber limits in the Nipissing district has just been completed. Messrs George Gordon & Company, of Pembroke, have purchased from Holland & Graves, of Bying Inlet, 36 square miles of timber limits situated on the Sturgeon river. The price was in the neighborhood of \$200,000. The limit has a good stock of white pine on it, and will be worked during the coming season. On the face of it the price indicates a marked advance in timber values. Other timber limit dickering's are under way.

This has certainly been a great year for square timber in the Ottawa river district. For several days last week, there was a steady procession of cribs through the Government slides at the Chaudiere Falls. Fraser & Company, Gillies Bros. and J.R. Booth all had big rafts on the river at the one time. The Booth raft contained 155 cribs, the Fraser raft 152, and the Gillies raft 40. The Fraser raft made a record run, doing the distance from the mouth of the Coulonge to Ottawa city, 125 miles, in ten working days. Besides this timber sent by river, the C.P.R. is handling fully 1,000,000 cubic feet of square timber. This includes the output of the Hull Lumber Company, Rideau Lumber Company, R. H. K'ock and Robert Hurdman, taken off limits in the Kippewa and Temiscamisque districts. This timber is to be delivered into the Ottawa river at Papi-neauville, and from that point rafted down to Quebec city. Edward Moore will have a couple of big rafts down by river. All the logs, or pretty near all, are off the Dumoine, Black, Coulonge, Desert and Lievere rivers. On some of these streams and the Gatineau there are logs awaiting the sweepers, but their number is small compared to the grand total. Some of the firms, wearying during the long May drought of ever getting rain, called their river drivers off the small creeks. Now that the latter are running full, there are no men to move the logs, and the latter will remain up country until next season. The W. C. Edwards Company sent a gang of men back up the

Black river, to release a big drive which was in this predicament.

It is estimated that half as many more logs were taken off the Coulonge this season as last. This does not mean that that many more logs were cut this season, for the logs floated down included many stranded from last season. J. R. Booth, Hawkesbury Lumber Company, Gilmour & Hughson, W. C. Edwards & Company, MacLaren Company, McLachlin Bros., Gillies Bros., and other Ottawa district firms of smaller calibre all got their logs down.

Mr. J. R. Booth has decided to extend his lumber railroad running from Egan Estate on the western division of the Canada Atlantic Railway into his limits. The road is now eight miles in length, but the advance of the log makers has made it necessary to extend it another five miles. This is the road over which Mr. Booth handles logs during the winter seas.

Davidson & Thackray, whose planing mill and sash factory was destroyed by fire, have decided to build on an isolated site in the west end of the city. The new mill will be a one storey brick structure 200 x 400 feet.

Talking about the long life of well managed limits, it may be remarked that the raft of square timber moved down the river a few days ago by Fraser & Company, was taken off the limit on which over half a century ago the late Alexander Fraser started the lumbering operations that brought him his millions.

Fraser & Company's new mill at Deschênes, Quebec, above Ottawa, is being rapidly fitted up. It will be running in a few weeks time. There is nothing to touch it hereabouts.

TIMBER LIMIT TRANSACTIONS.

George Gordon & Company, of Pembroke, Ont., are announced to have purchased from the Holland & Graves Lumber Company, of Bying Inlet, Ont., 36 miles of timber lands situated on the Sturgeon river, Nipissing district. The price paid was in the neighborhood of \$200,000. Valuable white pine covers the limit, which will be operated during the coming winter.

Further particulars have come to hand concerning the extensive purchase of timber lands on Vancouver Island B.C., by an American syndicate. Messrs. C. H. Cobb, James Campbell, Rufus H. Smith, of Seattle, and Frank Bronell, of Everett, paid \$1,000,000 in cash to the Dunsmuir Estate for fifty acres of timber limits on that island. It is said that the purchasers are to have a choice of any fifty acres of the 3,000,000 acres owned by the Dunsmuir Estate. One estimate places the quantity of timber on fifty acres of the property at 2,500,000,000 feet, although it is believed that this estimate will be found to be above the actual quantity.

Most of the timber is fir and cedar and is said to be of fine quality.

LUMBER FREIGHT RATES.

Detroit, Mich., July 8.—At a meeting of the Lumber Carriers' Association held here yesterday, the Great Lakes Towing company submitted a proposition that will, if carried into effect, place lumber tonnage on a more equitable footing than has heretofore existed. Instead of 20 per cent. discount from tariff rates at the end of the season allowed to other tonnage, the lumber carriers under the new agreement will get 30 per cent. except at the ports of Chicago and Tonawanda, where a 35 per cent. discount from the tariff rates will be granted to members of the association. The cash discount will be 40 per cent. instead of 5 per cent. as given other tonnage. A flat price of \$5 is also made for taking lumber tow barges into locks at the Soo, thus doing away with the necessity of the steamer handling a long tow in the locks.

The saw mill of Oram Wheeler at Barnston, Que., was destroyed by fire last week.

The saw and shingle mill at Brudenell, Ont., owned by James Costello was burned recently. It is understood that there was no insurance.

The large saw mill of Murray & Gregory at Marble Cove, near St. John, N. B., was totally destroyed by fire a few days ago, together with about 2,000,000 feet of sawn lumber and three small dwellings. The loss is over \$50,000, with about \$20,000 insurance.

News has been received by cable from Shanghai that the schooner Carrier Dove, which sailed from the Hastings mill, Vancouver, on April 20th, for Shanghai, with a cargo of 902,782 feet of lumber, drove ashore ten miles north of the mouth of the Yangtze-kiang river a few days ago. It is not known whether the vessel will be a total loss.

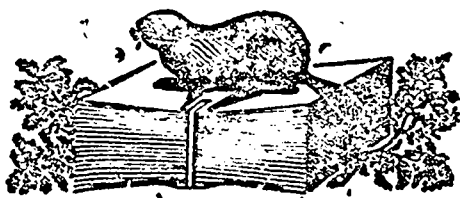
