**A few Pastoral Words**  
**TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS**  
**OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.**

MY DEAR FRIENDS,

Having the opportunity of addressing those of you who attend the house of God regularly, twice each Lord's day, it may seem needless for me here to dwell on the religious duties which you owe to God and man. Yet there are aspects of duty to the Church of God, the discussion of which may find a fitting place in the preface to the Annual Report of the congregation.

Let me then remind you of the fact that the church is a divine institution, brought into being for two main ends,—to be a means of doing good to those who compose it, and a channel through which they may do good.

Regarded in the first light, we all need such stimulus to a higher religious life, as the services of the sanctuary afford. None of us is sufficient for himself or herself. We all need help and encouragement from one another. The minister profits as much as the people from the exercises of God's house. His aim is to cheer on the Lord's children,—to help them in their pilgrimage,—to assist them in their conflict with the world, the flesh, and the devil; and to be qualified to do this, he has to give himself to study, reflection and prayer. His whole course of life is ordered with a view to the spiritual welfare of his flock. But they also help him with their prayers, their sympathies, and their tokens of appreciation of his work among them; and so the relation of pastor and people is mutually helpful. Those, therefore, who neglect the assembling of themselves together, miss a great deal, and are illfitted to meet even the stern realities of the present life, as well as illprepared for the joint life of the church of the first-born.

But it is even more important that we should be impressed with the second aim of the organized church,—which is to afford a channel for the united efforts of the people at doing good. We are all too apt to think of the advantages to ourselves or our families in this connection, as the one and only thing to be considered; whereas, we should be even more concerned to do good to others than get good for ourselves. Joint praise, joint prayer, joint study of the Word of God, joint givings for the Lord's work,—these things make the Church of God a mighty spiritual agency. It is the instrument divinely appointed for

converting sinners and building up saints. Let us all keep constantly in view, then, the great aims of the church, and we shall be careful not to weaken its power for good by unnecessary absence from its services. None of us should think that it is a matter of little consequence whether we attend or not. All have their place to fill, and it should be always made a matter of conscience with them to do their utmost to fill it. Come yourselves and bring others with you. Let every one be a canvasser for the church.

"Brethren, the time is short: it remaining, that both they that have wives be as though they had none; and they that weep, as though they wept not; and they that rejoice, as though they rejoiced not; and they that buy, as though they possessed not; and they that use this world, as not abusing it; for the fashion of this world passeth away."

These are significant words of the Apostle Paul, and as, with advancing years, I see more and more of life, I am more deeply impressed with them. We have but one life to live here; let us, therefore, make the most of it. Let us do what we can with our gifts and means and opportunities, since the period in which we can make use of them, for the good of men and the glory of God, is fleeting. We have but one chance. "We brought nothing with us into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out."

A year ago, I drew attention to the importance of doing something towards relieving the burden of debt resting on the church, amounting to upwards of \$14,000. During the past year an effort was made to provide in part for this indebtedness, and several friends outside the congregation showed their sympathy with the efforts making by our people, and have given liberal subscriptions towards this object. It is part of the plan of the church authorities to pay off a considerable instalment of the debt immediately. This will be a permanent relief to the congregation. But meantime, all are asked to remember that for the present the interest on the \$13,000 has to be provided for as usual. And I would ask all our friends not to "grow weary in well doing; in due season they shall reap, if they faint not." Let all those who claim St. Gabriel's as their church,—all that desire to see it firmly and permanently established,—all that believe it to be an important religious centre in this great city,—all that would therefore wish it to prosper, rally round it, and do each his or her part, however little,—and we shall see better days yet than any we have known in the past.

"The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious unto you. The Lord lift the light of His countenance upon you and give you peace."

From St. Denis Street, south of Sherbrooke Street, eastwards to Maisonneuve Village.

DISTRICT NO. III—WILLIAM CLELLAND, *Elder.*

East of Cadieux Street, north of Sherbrooke Street, to city limits.

DISTRICT NO. IV—P. M. MAC TAVISH, *Elder.*

From Cadieux Street, north of Sherbrooke Street, west to St. Urbain Street, excluded.

DISTRICT NO. V—JAMES ROBERTSON, *Elder.*

From St. Urbain Street, all included, west to Park Avenue, above Sherbrooke Street.

DISTRICT NO. VI—THOMAS GRAHAM, *Elder.*

From St. Denis Street to Bleury Street, and from Sherbrooke Street, to St. Catherine Street.

DISTRICT NO. VII—JOHN A. STUART, *Elder.*

From St. Denis and Bonsecours Streets, to McGill and Beaver Hall Streets, south of St. Catherine Street.

DISTRICT NO. VIII—WILLIAM DARLING, *Elder.*

From Park Avenue and Bleury Street, to University Street, north of St. Catherine Street, but west of Phillips Place, south to St. Antoine Street.

DISTRICT NO. IX—ROBERT STEWART, *Elder.*

From St. Antoine Street, north to city limits, and from University Street, excluded, westwards.

DISTRICT NO. X—J. M. FARQUHAR, *Elder.*

From McGill Street, westward, south of St. Antoine Street.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION  
OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

January 9th and 16th, 1895.

The annual meeting of the congregation of St. Gabriel Church, in accordance with the constitution and by-laws, was held in the Lecture Room, on the evening of Wednesday, January 9th, 1895.

Rev. Dr. Campbell occupied the chair, on motion made by Mr. J. A. Stuart, seconded by Mr. J. M. Farquhar.

The reports of the Treasurer and Secretary not being ready, it was moved by Mr. John Loughhead, seconded by Mr. W. J. Helps, and carried :—

“That this meeting stand adjourned until the evening of Wednesday, January 16th.”

---

The adjourned annual meeting of the congregation of St. Gabriel Church was held in the Lecture Room on the evening of Wednesday, January 16th, 1895.

The Rev. Dr. Campbell having opened the meeting with devotional exercises, it was regularly moved, seconded and carried :—

“That Rev. Dr. Campbell occupy the chair, and that Robert Stewart, Jr., act as Secretary.”

The minutes of the last annual meeting were then read and confirmed, after which reports were presented by the Board of Trustees and the Treasurer of the Purchase and Interest Fund. The Rev. Dr. Campbell also submitted reports from the Session and Ladies' Aid Society; Miss Darling, from the Christian Endeavour Society; and Mr. T. H. Blair, from the Young People's Association. All were hopeful and encouraging, and on motion of Mr. T. H. Blair, seconded by Miss A. M. Kyle, it was carried :—

“That the reports and financial statements as now read be received and adopted, and that the same be printed and distributed among the members and adherents of the congregation.”

It was moved by Mr. J. M. Farquhar, seconded by Mr. Arch. McNaughton, and carried :—

“That the year 1894 was one fraught with special tokens of the Lord's favour to the congregation, as indicated in the statistics submitted from the Session, and by the reports of the several religious and benevolent organizations of the church read this evening, and that it is therefore meet to-night to make due acknowledgement of God's goodness to us as a people.”

“That whereas the Ladies’ Aid Society and the Lady Visitors have done faithful Dorcas work in the way of providing many comforts to those in adversity, and also by visiting the sick and needy, this meeting records its warm appreciation of such services and offers a vote of thanks to the Ladies’ Aid Society and the Lady Visitors for their faithful attention to such christian duties during the past year.”

Moved by Mr. W. J. Helps, seconded by Mr. George Bryson, and carried:—

“That whereas the services of the Choir in leading the praise services of the church, calls for much training and zeal on the part of its members, the thanks of this meeting be now tendered to all the members of the Choir for their efficient services during the past year.”

Moved by Mr. Wm. Morrison, seconded by Mr. Geo. F. Barker, and carried:—

“That the careful and systematic instruction of the children and young people in Bible knowledge and in the privileges of public worship, is one of the most important departments of church work, and that this meeting expresses its deep interest in our large and very efficient Sabbath School; and while thanking the Superintendent and the Teachers for their valuable services, this meeting also requests the Board of Trustees to provide for the necessary financial requirements of the School during the current year.”

Moved by Mr. Arch. Watt, seconded by Mr. Wm. Arnott, and carried:—

“That the congregation appreciates the services of the Treasurer and the Secretary, and that this meeting now tenders a cordial vote of thanks to Mr. J. G. Veith, the Treasurer, and Mr. Andrew McAllister, the Secretary, for the faithful performance of the arduous duties pertaining to their respective offices.”

Moved by Mr. J. Loughhead, seconded by Mr. J. A. Stuart, and carried:—

“That the congregation record their continued satisfaction with the management of the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee, and now thank the Convener, Mr. A. McNaughton, and the Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. J. M. Farquhar, for their services in looking after the Purchase and Interest Fund, and that the following be elected a new committee, viz:—Messrs. A. Barker, with authority to take up subscriptions to this fund on the usual terms or in special calls, for payment on the interest and debt remaining due on this church.”

Moved by Mr. Arch. McAllister, seconded by Mr. Wm. Arnott, and carried:—

“That in accordance with Article III of the By-Laws, this meeting does now elect Messrs. F. A. McRae, John MacTavish, Thos. Sonne and J. M. Farquhar, to be members of the Board of Trustees, to fill the vacancies occurring at this time, and furthermore that the interim election by the Trustees of Messrs. J. G. Veith and Arch. Watt, be now concurred in and confirmed by this meeting.”

It was moved, seconded and carried :—

“That Messrs. James Henry and Alex. Abernethy, be elected Auditors for the ensuing year.

After a vote of thanks to the Rev. Dr. Campbell, for the efficient manner in which he had presided, refreshments were served by the ladies, and the remainder of the evening was spent in social intercourse.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF  
THE ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

For year ending December 31st, 1894.

Having now reached the end of another year in the history of our congregation, it devolves on the Board to submit their Report on the financial and temporal affairs of our church. As the Treasurer's Statement will be made out in detail, showing the revenue and expenditure, it will not be necessary at this stage of the proceedings to deal with the separate items, only it is the urgent wish that all will pay earnest attention to the reading of the same.

We regret to note that the Weekly Offerings for the year 1894, fall a little short of those of 1893, a state of things that the Board greatly deplore, when we take into consideration the large communion roll of our church.

It is not the desire of the Board that the matter of contributing should become a burden to any one, but they would like that all should feel it their duty as well as a privilege to be able to contribute their mite to further on the work of Christ's Kingdom.

You will also notice by the Treasurer's Statement that the Revenue does not quite come up to the Expenditure,—this deficit has been met by some kind friends, through Dr. Campbell, for which we return our hearty thanks.

The Treasurer's Statement shows the amount received during the year as revenue proper for the maintenance of ordinances, to have been:—

In the early part of the year the Board made it their duty to make a personal canvass to some of those who were not subscribers, and to try and impress upon them their duty in the matter of becoming subscribers to the funds of the church, the result of which we are sorry to say only met with moderate success.

In regard to the Double Offering every Tenth Sabbath, we feel greatly thankful to those who have responded to the call, although it has not met with the success that was expected.

Owing to the low state of the finances in the early part of September, it was deemed advisable to issue a circular to the congregation so that all might be offered the opportunity of either increasing or diminishing his or her weekly offering, as circumstances might warrant, and also to try and impress on those whose names do not appear on the Treasurer's Books, to make it an act of duty to become a contributor; the result of this has been fair, although not reaching what was anticipated.

We have now had the Auer Light in the church for a full year, and have much pleasure in reporting that it not only gives a much better light, but also is a great saving in our gas bill.

At a request from the pulpit, our people were called on to give a special collection on the last Sabbath of the year, to help to meet the deficit. The response to this request was in every way well worthy of the congregation, as the Treasurer was made happy by receiving the sum of \$119.25.

Before closing this report, we beg leave to thank the different organizations in the church who have so handsomely helped us during the past year, and probably when we take into consideration



the great depression there has been, we should have every reason to be thankful, and the congregation can rest assured that the Board will always endeavour to transact the affairs of the church with the strictest economy. Forgetting that which was behind let us press on and make the year we have just entered upon, the best in the history of the congregation.

Since our last annual meeting, the Board appointed Mr. J. G. Veith on the Board, in place of Mr. A. Watt, resigned, and in addition Mr. A. Watt was appointed in place of Mr. Wm. Reed, and the wish is that these appointments be now confirmed.
