COUNTY OF WATERLOO.

In the year 1834, the County of Halton comprised the territory now known as North Wentworth, Waterloo and Wellington; and in 1837, by Act of Parliament, the Wellington District was set apart, comprising the townships of Luther, Proton, Amaranth and Melancthon from the County of Simcoe; the townships of Guelph, Garafraxa, Erin, Eramosa, Nichol, Waterloo, Wilmot, Woolwich, Wellesley and Mornington, from the Gore District. At a subsequent period the United Counties of Waterloo and Brant were formed. These were separated in 1863.

The County of Waterloo is bounded north by Wellington; east by Wellington and Wentworth; west by Perth, and south by Brant and Oxford. It contains eleven municipalities: the town of Galt, the villages of Berlin, Hespeler, New Hamburg, Preston and Waterloo, and the townships of North Dumfries, Waterloo, Wellesley, Wilmot and Woolwich.

The County contains almost every variety of soil and surface—clay, loam, sand and gravel, hill, valley, meadow land and swamp. The land is fertile, and well cultivated and improved. It is well watered by the Grand, Speed, and Conestogo rivers, together with a number of smaller streams, tributaries of the rivers. The timber is principally hardwood. In several parts of the county limestone of a superior quality abounds. Waterloo holds a high position as a manufacturing county; mills, factories and foundries abound, and orders from all parts of the continent, and from Europe, are being constantly filled.

The County is intersected by the Grand Trunk, and the Guelph and Galt Branch of the Great Western Railway. The roads are generally well gravelled, thus affording every facility for the transportation of merchandise.

County of Waterloo.—Area—328,463 acres, or 513 square miles. The township of Waterloo contains 91,154 acres; Wilmot, 62,600; Woolwich, 58,000; Wellesley, 66,860; North Dumfries, 47,000.

Summary of the Statements of the Assets, Liabilities, Revenue, Expenditure, &c., of the County of Waterloo, 1866.

The following sums are the aggregate of all the towns and townships within the county, as well as of the county itself as a separate corporation:—Number of acres assessed, 314,801; number of ratepayers assessed, 6,954.

Assets.—Assessed value of real estate, \$6,204,811; assessed value of personal property, \$698,360; amount of arrears of taxes, \$7,843; other assets, \$66,155.

LIABILITIES.—Corporation debentures, \$120,111; other liabilities, \$1,200.

REVENUE.—Collected under the year's rates, \$61,922; from Government on account of administration of Government, \$3,261; other revenue, \$13,740.

EXPENDITURE.—Interest paid on debentures, \$6,783; educational purposes, \$22,650; salaries and other expenses of Municipal Government, \$8,500; administration of justice, \$7,503; roads and bridges, \$19,060; all other accounts, \$10,573.

Waterloo is divided into two Ridings. The North is represented in the Legislative Assembly, by Isaac E. Bowman, Esq., of St. Jacobs, and the South by Jas. Cowan, Esq., of Galt. The Hon. A. J. Fergusson Blair, M.L.C., Brock Division.

NORTH DUMFRIES.

This township is bounded north by Waterloo; east by Beverly, county Wentworth; west by Blenheim, county Oxford; and south by South Dumfries, county Brant.

The township of Dumfries (north and south) was first settled by W. Dickson in the year 1816. In 1817 the settlers numbered thirty-eight, making with their families a population of one hundred and sixty-three of all ages. There were in that year 245 acres cleared, and the business of the township, apart from agriculture, consisted of one sawmill and one store.

Among the early settlers were John and George Telfor, J. D. Campbell, Michael Knox, and Thos. Chisholm.

North Dumfries is well watered by the Grand and Nith Rivers and Cedar Creek. The soil is generally a light sandy loam, the surface rolling, and well adapted for wheat and other cereals. Great attention is paid to stock raising, and a number of Durham cattle and Leicester sheep have been imported.

The timber is a mixture of pine, oak, beech, maple, elm, cherry, bass-wood and cedar. Limestone of a superior quality is abundant.

There are at present in the township five flouring mills, two woollen mills and several sawmills.

WATERLOO.

This Township is bounded north by Woolwich; east by Guelph and Puslinch, county Wellington; west by Wilmot, and south by North Dumfries. It was originally block number two on the Grand River, and comprised 94,012 acres. In May, 1798, it was owned by Richard Beasley, Jean Baptiste Rosseau and James Wilson. In December, 1803, Richard Beasley became the sole proprietor of block No. 2, having obtained, at that date, a quit claim deed from Joseph Brant, (Tyendenaga), chief warrior of the Five Nation Indians, of a part of the block comprising 13,430 acres. On the 28th of June, 1802, Beasley conveyed 60.000 acres to Daniel and Jacob Erb. This purchase was afterwards known as the "German Company Tract." Waterloo is one of the most thickly settled townships in the Province. The majority of the inhabitants are of Pennsylvanian Dutch or German extraction. Many of the early settlers brought considerable capital with them, and consequently, in connection with their temperate and industrious habits, their prosperity continually increased, and their farms and residences will compare favorably with those of any township in the country.

The land is principally a sandy and vegetable loam mixed with gravel. The Grand River runs through the centre of the township, and in the south of it is joined by the Speed. Numerous other branches of the Grand River are spread over the township. In 1825 the population was 1,640; in 1841, 4,424; in 1850, 7,759, and in 1864, 13,952.

Post Villages.—Berlin, Blair, Bloomingdale, Breslau, Bridgeport, Doon, Freeport, Freiburg, Hespeler, New Aberdeen, Preston, and Waterloo.

WELLESLEY.

Wellesley is bounded north east by Peel; north by Maryboro'; east by Woolwich; west by North Easthope, and south by Wilmot. This township formed a part of the "Queen's Bush," which also comprised the townships of and was first settled about the year 1856. The first land conveyed was in 1847 to Wm. Cunningham, to Josiah Hall in 1848, and to John Hawke in 1851.

The soil is of excellent quality, the timber principally hardwood. It is well watered by branches of the Nith and Canestoga Rivers.

In 1837 the township contained sixty-three inhabitants; in 1841, two hundred and fifty-four; in 1850, three thousand three hundred and ninety-six; and in 1861, five thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

WILMOT.

This township is bounded north by Wellesley; east by Waterloo; west by north and south Easthope, and south by Blenheim and Blandford. The township was first settled by Christian Naffziger, a German Menonist, who obtained from the British Government a free grant of fifty acres to each family who should emigrate with him from Germany to Canada. He returned in the year 1826 with a large number of settlers. These grants comprised the first quarter of each lot to actual settlers on the north and south of "Erb's road," north and south of "Snyder's road," and north and south of "Bleanis' road." Block "A," comprising the first, second and third concessions, and block "P" the first, second, third and fourth concessions, was purchased from the crown by the Canada Company in 1829.

The Township is well settled. In 1841 the population was 2,220; in 1850, 4,863, and in 1861, 6,173. The soil is chiefly a sandy loam. Among the first settlers were Elias Waldfong, Joseph Goldsmith, Christian Howick, John Haymaker, Daniel Hunziger and Solomon Behringer, who obtained grants in 1830-31.

WOOLWICH.

Woolwich is bounded north by Peel, county Wellington; east by Maryborough, county Wellington; west by Wellesley, and south by Waterloo.

The land is of the best quality and the timber is principally hardwood. It is well watered by the Grand river on the east and the Conestoga on the west. The surface is generally hilly, and the soil a stiff loam intermixed with clay.

In the year 1807 a portion of this township, 45,195 acres, was granted by the Crown to one William Wallace, who disposed of the entire block to John and Jacob Erb and Augustus Jones, trustees for the German Company, the members of which first settled this section. In conveying this tract to the Company Wallace omitted to supply the bar to his wife's dower, and fifty-two years after, efforts were made, under the dower, to exact a consideration or a division of the property. This measure necessarily caused a great deal of excitement at the time, but by the exertions

of the Hon. M. H. Foley, at the time representative of the North Riding of Waterloo, who procured the passage of a bill by the Legislature quieting all titles, the claims of the Wallace family were negatived.

· A large and flourishing village in the Township of North Dumfries, on the river Nith, fourteen miles from Berlin, and seven from the Paris station of the Great Western Railway, with which it is connected by a good gravel road. The village site was first settled by James Jackson, and the village laid out for James Jackson, J. K. Andrews, and Robert Wyllie, the present Postmaster The Post Office was established in 1838, James Jackson first Postmaster. There are excellent water privilege in the village. It contains a large iron foundry, established in 1849, John Watson, proprietor. The cost of the buildings and machinery was about \$20,000; threshing, mowing and reaping machines, agricultural implements and stoves are manufactured to the value of \$40,000 per annum. An engine of twenty-eight horse power, and twenty-eight hands, are constantly employed. A shoe-peg and furniture factory, James Gladstones, proprietor, steam, ten-horse power, employing six hands This establishment manufactures upwards of seven thousand dollars' worth of furniture and shoe-pegs per annum. In the village, and its vicinity, there are four flouring mills, propelled by the Nith and Cedar creek. The Springfield mills, with seven run of stones, David Goldie, proprietor; the Nithville mills, with three run of stones for flouring, and two for the manufacture of oatmeal, James Piper, proprietor; and the Ayr flouring mill with three run of stones, Daniel Manley, proprietor.

Ayr contains also an extensive woolen carding and spinning mills, giving employment to two carding machines and five hands, Robert Walker, proprietor; brewery, stave-cutting, and carriage manufactories, and the various other branches of mechanical industry are well represented.

The Town Hall, erected in 1850, was built at a cost of \$800, size 35 by 50. The Free Church of Scotland, erected in 1844, cost \$1500; the Methodist Church cost about \$1200; the Common School buildings, erected in 1854, cost \$3000. There is an excellent library numbering about 1000 volumes in connection with the Farmers and Mechanics' Institute. The "Ayr Observer" is a well conducted paper, and deservedly popular. A Village in the Township of Wilmot, and a station of the Grand Trunk Railway, nine miles from Berlin, three from Hamburg, sixteen from Stratford, and seventy-two from Toronto. Jacob Beck, Esq., settled the village in 1855. It is situated on Spring or Beck's creek, a tributary of the Nith. The village contains several extensive manufactories, the principal being the flouring mills of Messrs. Beck, water power, and Jas. Crombie & Co., the former having three run of stones, and a capacity of two hundred bushels per diem, manufacturing about \$20,000 worth of flour per annum, and the latter turning out flour to the annual value of about \$40,000; Beck's iron foundry, steam, eight-horse, employing twelve hands, manufacturing agricultural implements, stoves, castings, &c., to the annual value of about \$10,000, and the flax mills of Messrs. J. & J. Livingston, manufacturing about twenty-five tons of flax per annum. There are also two saw-mills, a pail, tub, stave, and heading factory, and a number of cooper's, blacksmith's, and other shops in the village. There are two churches in Baden, Lutheran, Rev. George Smith, and Methodist, Rev. Jacob Anthus, and an excellent school, average attendance, 80-Eli

The post-office was established in 1854, Jacob Beck, first P. M. The Fifth Division Court is held here. Stages to Wellesley, Phillipsburg, and Lisbon. Daily mails. Population, about 500.

BERLIN.

The County Town of Waterloo, situated on the line of the Grand Trunk Railway. The town is located in a healthy and well settled part of the County, on an eminence gradually sloping westward. The town plot was settled about the year 1830, by Phineas Varnum, who built and occupied a tavern and blacksmith's shop, on the site now occupied by the Commercial Hotel, on the corner of King and Queen Streets. The first store was opened in the same year, by William David and Frederick Millar. Jacob Heiler, at present residing on King Street, and John Huffman, were among the first settlers of the village. Berlin was made the County Town in 1852, the County buildings were erected in the following year, and the town incorporated in 1854.

Berlin has no water-power, and depends chiefly on the trade of the surrounding country. The following are the principal manufacturing establishments:

Berlin Tannery, Louis Breithaupt, proprietor, steam-power, engine 40 horse, employs about forty hands: manufactures all kinds of leather, turning out from 400 to 500 sides, and between 500 and 1000 sheep skins per week. The proprietor intends manufacturing morocco and bookbinders' stock on a large scale. Mr. Breithaupt also deals extensively in slaughter hides, Spanish hides, kips, slaughter and Spanish; oils, wool, and findings of every description, and belting of all sizes.

HOFFMAN'S CABINET FACTORY.—Extensive steam-power, employs about thirty hands. This large establishment is extensively engaged in the manufacture of cabinet ware of every description, sash, door and blind, flooring and Venetian blinds, &c. Mr. Hoffman is also proprietor of one of the largest general merchant stores in the town.

SIMPSON AND ALDOUS' CABINET AND CHAIR FACTORY, King Street, steam 30 horse-power, employs about thirty men. In connection there is a steam saw mill, manufacturing capacity about two millions feet per annum.

ZIEGLER'S CARRIAGE AND WAGGON FACTORY, King St., employs seven hands. Carriages, buggies, waggons, &c., are here manufactured of the best materials. The business represents about \$10,000 annually. A blacksmith's shop is attached.



The name of the post office of the village of New Germany, situated in the township of Waterloo, eight miles from Berlin. It contains a Roman Catholic Church, two stores, schools, hotels and mechanics' shops.

Population, 150.

GALT.

A Town in the County of Waterloo, is situated in the Township of North Dumfries, and on both sides of the Grand River. The surrounding country is remarkable for its fertility, and the scenery in the neighborhood of the town is very picturesque. It is the largest and most populous town in the county, and in regard of its manufactures is second to none in the Province. The numerous extensive establishments are fully employed, and Galt has not inappropriately been called the "Manchester of Canada." Its water power is unlimited, and a reference to the subjoined list of the principal establishments, will give a good idea of its claims to be the "wealthiest incorporated town in Canada." The streets are neatly laid out, and the employment of stone in building, which is procured in any required quantity in the immediate vicinity, gives the town a remarkably substantial appearance. In 1845 the population was estimated at 1,000; in 1852, it was 2,248; and in 1861, 3,069. The present population is probably about 3,500.

DUMFRIES FOUNDRY—Goldie, McCulloch & Co.—This establishment has been in operation for about 25 years. The motive power is steam, two engines—aggregate, 40 horse, employing upwards of one hundred operatives. There are two departments, one for the manufacture of engines, boilers, and general mill gearing, the other for woollen machinery. All the manufactures are of the most approved model, and the best proof of the excellency of the manufacture is found in the demand not only from all parts of Canada, but from the West Indies, California, and other distant countries.

VICTORIA FOUNDRY—Lutz & Co.—Established about twenty-five years water power, equivalent to 15 horse—employs from 25 to 30 hands. Manufactures all kinds of agricultural implements, shingle-sawing machines, stoves, ploughs, &c.

Union Foundry—J. W. Davis & Co.—Steam, 10 horse, about 12 hands, manufactures ploughs, stoves, hardware, tin, copper, and sheet-iron ware, all of superior quality.

GALT AXE FACTORY.—H. H. Date.—Established 17 years, water power, employs about 40 hands, and manufactures axes and edge tools.

Dickson Mills.—Richard Blain.—Erected in 1843. The main building is of stone, 75 by 45 feet, and four stories high. Water power, equal to 60 horse; capacity, 25,000 barrels per annum. Mr. Blain is also proprietor of a cooperage and stave factory, water power, employing 20 hands; capacity, 40,000 flour barrels, and one million staves annually.

DUMFRIES FLOURING MILLS.—Thomas Stewart.—Water power, four runs of stones; capacity from 100 to 150 barrels a day. Employs five hands.

Robinson & Howell's Woollen Factory.—Steam and water power, engine 45 horse, employs about 50 hands. This establishment manufactures cloths and tweeds exclusively.

James J. Thompson & Co.'s Woollen Factory.—Steam and water power, engine 25 horse, employs 30 hands, two sets of machinery, ten looms. Tweeds are the principal manufacture.



The village was settled in 1835 by Robert Hays, William Hobson, and E. Everett, and the Post Office was established the following year-Robert Hays, first postmaster. The village is well supplied with water privileges by the river Nith, and contains a flouring mill, a woollen and a cheese factory. There is an Episcopal Church, Rev. H. Mellish, pastor, and an excellent school ably conducted by Mr. T. J. Newman, and averaging eighty pupils.

The Post Office was originally called Wilmot, but was changed to its present name in 1853. It is named after Mr. Robert Hays, who built the mills here in 1835.

HESPELER.

An incorporated village in the township of Waterloo, pleasantly and advantageously situated on the River Speed, and on the line of the Guelph and Galt Branch of the Great Western Railway, twelve miles from Berlin. The village was first settled by Jacob Hespeler in 1845, and was formerly known as New Hope, which name it retained until it was incorporated in 1858. The post office was established in 1854, Conrad Nahrgang, first P. M. Andrew Shaw opened the first store in 1845. There is an abundant supply of water power. The village contains four churches—Presbyterian, built of stone, erected in 1862, Rev. M. McKenzie, pastor; New Connexion Methodist, erected in 1857, of stone, at a cost of \$1,000, Rev. J. Williams, pastor; the Evangelical (German), built of stone in 1863, and the Roman Catholic, also built of stone in 1858. There is also a Lutheran Church about to be built. The Common School averages 180 pupils, A. J. Brewster, teacher.

Population, about 900.

The following are the principal manufacturing establishments:

HESPELER KNITTING MILLS—Randall, Farr & Co., proprietors— Established 1864-6—water power, equal to 75 horse—employs about 100 hands, building of stone, the principal being 150 by 55 feet, and another 70 by 30, both two storys high. All description of fancy knitted goods are manufactured chiefly for the Eastern markets.

HESPELER WOOLLEN FACTORY—J. Hespeler & Son, proprietors.—This is the largest establishment of the kind in the Province, employing about 100 hands, and turning out about 1,000 yards daily. The premises have been lately enlarged, making altogether six sets. The motive power is principally water, but steam is also employed.

HESPELER FLOURING MILLS—J. Hespeler & Son, proprietors—water power, six run of stones; capacity, about 100 barrels a day.

HESPELER DISTILLERY—J. Hespeler & Son, proprietors—water power, capacity, 12 barrels a day.

Krib's Saw and Planing Mills, and Barrel and Shingle Factory.—Capacity, one million feet of lumber, and twenty thousand flour barrels annually, steam power, two engines, twelve and twenty horse power, employs twenty-five hands. Mr. Kribs is also a builder and contractor, having put up the greater number of the dwellings, stores and factories in and around the village.







It was first settled, and the village site laid out by Frederick Miller, who purchased several hundred acres from the Canada Company. The Post Office was established in 1842, Frederick Miller, first postmaster. The village contains two churches, Baptist, frame, erected in 1865, Rev. Edward Greitzner, pastor; and Lutheran, Rev. Samuel Schlichter and Christian S. Spring, pastors; a common school, averaging 100 pupils. Alder Creek furnishes excellent hydraulic power, and there are in the village one flouring mill, one steam saw mill, a woollen factory, and a chair and rake factory. There are also two hotels, two general stores, two blacksmiths and waggon shops, and several other manufacturing establishments.

NEW Perry, 1st Li William Scott, first P. M. The Nith affords excellent water power, and the manufacturing establishments are numerous and extensive. The village contains three churches, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, and Evangelical. Population, about 1,200.

New Hamburg Foundry—Samuel Merner, proprietor.—This establishment is one of the largest in the county, steam, 8 horse, (intending to increase to 20 horse), employing 20 hands, manufacturing the justly popular "excelsior reaper and mower, and self regulating separator." plows, threshing machines, cultivators, drills, and all kinds of agricultural implements. The foundry was established in 1848. In connection there is a large tin and sheet iron factory.

Hamburg Carriage Factory—Frederick Merner, proprietor, employs 12 hands and manufactures all kinds of carriages, waggons, sleighs, &c., to the value of about \$10,000 per annum.

Holland Woollen Mills—situated about a mile east of the village. George A. Reid, resident manager. This large establishment belongs to the Hamilton Manufacturing Company. Steam, two engines of ten and twelve horse power, twelve looms employing about forty hands, and producing about eighty thousand yards per annum. The chief manufactures are tweeds, blankets and flannels.

HAMBURG WOOLLEN MILLS—Duncan Fisher, lessee, established about 23 years. The machinery is complete and goods to the value of \$10,000 are annually manufactured, twelve hands are employed.

HAMBURG LAGER BEER BREWERY—Stephen Rau and Sons, proprietors. This extensive establishment affords every convenience for brewing, the machinery is worked by an engine of six horse power and nine hands are employed, the buildings are of stone.

A small village on Mill Creek, in the township of Waterloo. The property where the mills and factory are built was settled as early as the year 1808. There is a woolen factory with complete machinery, capable of turning out between four and five thousand dollars worth of material yearly. The manufacture of brick, drain tiles, pails and lumber is extensively carried on.

PETERSBURG.

A village and station of the G. T. Railway, situated on lot number nine, Snyder's road, township of Wilmot, six miles from Berlin. and sixty-eight from Toronto. It was settled in 1838, by Messrs John Ernst, Peter Wilker, Jacob Stoebler, Segler, and Marteyne. The post office was established in 1840. John Ernst, first post master. It contains a Lutheran Church, frame cost \$1800, and capable of seating six hundred persons, Rev. J. Shultz, D.D., pastor, one tannery, a steam sawmill, potash factory, two excellent hotels, and several mechanics' shops.

The "Diana Tannery," Christopher Zoeger, Esq., proprietor, water power, employs five hands, and is capable of turning out 800 hides, and 1000 calf skins per annum. All kinds of leather is manufactured. The tannery was established about 1843. Daily mails. Population, about 250

A village in the township of Wilmot, situated on Smith's Creek, 12 miles from Berlin, about 3½ from Baden and the same distance from Hamburg. The village was laid ont in 1843, by Christopher Doering, and the post office was established in 1857. G. C. Doering, first and present post master. It contains Lutheran Church, Rev. Godfreid Schmidt, pastor, and a common school, averaging 50 pupils. Stage to Wellesley and Baden.

Daily mail. Population, 350.

PRESTON.

An incorporated village in the Township of Waterloo on the line of the Guelph and Galt branch of the Great Western Railway eight miles from Berlin, three from Galt, and sixty from Toronto. It is also situated on the river Speed, which supplies an abundance of water power.

The vicinity and site of the village was settled about the year 1832 chiefly by German families. The east end was settled in 1834 by John Erb, and the west end by Joseph Erb in 1852. The Post Office was established in 1834 Adam Ferrie jr. first P.M. Population about 1500.

There are four churches in the village, Lutheran, built in 1835, size 40×60 , cost \$3,000, seats three hundred gallery and organ, Rev. J. Wuster, pastor; Methodist, Wesleyan, and New Connection, Revds. Dr. Freschman and J. Miller; and Roman Catholic built in 1845, cost \$800; size 40×28 feet, stone, seats one hundred and fifty, Rev. J. W. Glowalski pastor. Two schools, common, average 315 pupils, J. C. Buchanan, Robert Blackwood and Miss E. Chaloner, teachers, and Roman Catholic Separate, average 50 pupils, B. Hartleib, teacher.

THE PRESTON FOUNDRY.—Clare and Beck manufactures stoves, agricultural implements, and tinware. They employ about ten hands and do a business of about \$20,000 per annum.

CAMBRIDGE MILLS.—A. A. Erb & Bro., flouring, water power, equal to 40 horse, 5 run of stones, employ six hands, and turn out from eighteen to twenty thousand barrels yearly. The same firm have in operation a distillery, sawmill and stave factory.

WAHN'S FOUNDRY—Valentine Wahn, established in 1838, employs eight hands and manufactures about \$15,000 worth of articles annually.

In addition to the above there are also a flax mill, woollen mill, fanning mill factory, two breweries, five hotels, four general stores, sash factory, tannery, and a number of mechanic's shops. There is an Artesian well on the premises of Mr. Cornell, proprietor of the North American Hotel, which was bored in 1838 to a depth of three hundred and sixty feet, and which forces the water twenty four feet above the surface. The medicinal qualities of the water have been proved and as a remedial agent its efficiency has met with the approbation of the faculty.

There are six bath rooms heated and provided with every convenience The following is the result of an analysis of the water by Professor Croft of Toronto:

WAGGON MAKER AND BLACKSMITH.

WATERLOO.

An incorporated village in the township of Waterloo, the corporate limits joining those of Berlin. It is about a mile from the Berlin station of the Grand Trunk Railway. This village is rapidly improving. It was incorporated in 1867, Moses Springer, Esq., being appointed first Reeve. The following are the chief manufacturing establishments:

Union Mills.—Flouring—E. & S. S. Snider, built in 1816 by Abraham Erb. This extensive establishment contains seven run of stones; the machinery is propelled by steam and water power—engine 40 horse. The water is supplied by Snider's Creek. The mills, machinery, &c., cost upwards of \$45,000. The capacity is about 15,000 barrels, exclusive of custom work. The Messrs Snider manufacture farina and the celebrated Haxall flour.

Granite Mills.—Flour and distillery—William Hespeler, established 1858; steam—engine, 35 horse; employ sixteen hands. The flouring mill has a capacity of forty thousand barrels annually. The distillery has also a large capacity.

WATERLOO WOOLLEN MILLS.—Paton & Bricker, established 1863, steam power, 25 horse, complete machinery, employ 30 hands, and manufacture 60,000 yards per annum.

UNION FOUNDRY.—Jesse Morningstar, established about one year, steam power—engine, 10 horse, employs 15 hands. This establishment manufactures all kinds of agricultural implements, turning out, exclusive of other work, 100 threshing machines, 200 plows, and 200 separators annually.

WATERLOO FOUNDRY.—J. Bricker, steam, engine 15 horse, employs 16 hands, manufactures work to the value of about \$20,000 per annum.

WATERLOO PLANING AND CABINET FACTORY—M. Wegenast, steam engine, 16 horse, employs 16 hands, manufactures sash, door and blinds, and all kinds of furniture.

Waterloo Tannery.—One and a half miles east of the village, manufactures upper leather, capacity between three and four hundred hides, from six to seven hundred calfskins, and three hundred kips per annum.

In addition to the above, there are numerous other establishments, and the different mechanical pursuits are well represented. A reference to the subjoined list of the residents will give a good general idea of the prosperity of the village.

Churches.—Evangelical, Rev. C. F. Boeller; Lutheran, Rev. J. Hoelscher; United Brethren, Rev. Mr. Plowman.

The Waterloo school house is one of the best in the province. The late Abraham Erb, Esq., bequeathed a plot of five acres and the sum of five hundred dollars as a fund for school purposes here, and the further

sum of \$1500 for similar purposes in other parts of the county. It is a fine stone building. The average attendance is large. The school is under the efficient management of Mr. John L. Bowman.


