ing out these murderers is beyond all praise; he was accompanied by his brother, George Stockford.

On Monday a Coroner's Inquest was held on the body of Mr. Yenza, which

continued its examinations until yester-day, when a Verdict was returned of Wilful Murder against Mullin.
