Receipts on account of consolidated fund for 1874, \$24,205,092.54. Receipts for 1875-\$24,648,715.03. The total loans for 1874 were \$14. 03,599, against \$23,859,525 for 1875 Customs receipts for 1874 were \$14,-000,000, against \$15,000,000 in 1875.

In round numbers, aggregate receipts from open account amounted to \$3,498,377, as against \$1,237,772 The total receipts were \$52,036,617 as against \$39,930,791.

Expenditures for 1874 and 1875 were: 1874, \$23,316,306; for 1875, \$23,713,071. The net debt of the Dominion to end of fiscal year was \$116,000,000,
