Mulch the Rose Beds,

A mulching on rose beds is quite beneficial during hot weather, not only preventing the too rapid evaporation of moisture from the soil, but also keeping the roots cool. The most convenient material for this purpose is to be found in clippings from the lawn, this being a covering that has frequently proved most satisfactory. When it is possible to do so the rose beds should be freely watered during dry weather, for by this means guite a sprinkling of flowers may be had from the June roses (hybrid perpetuals) later in the season, besides greatly improving both quality and quantity of flowers on the so-called everblooming sorts.




